Vandalism: On October 1, 2018, at approximately 7:27 am, an Officer was dispatched to Hercules High School for vandalism which occurred over the weekend. Sometime between Friday and Monday an unknown suspect broke the window to room 508 and sprayed a fire extinguisher all over the class room.

Non-Injury Collision: On October 1, 2018, at approximately 10:48 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Lucky for an accident involving a delivery truck, where a fire hydrant was struck. Officers found the fire hydrant was broken off and water was spraying in the air. The 34 year old driver, was contacted and advised he tried to make the turn into the north entrance into the parking, lot near McDonalds, and the rear tires struck the fire hydrant. . There were no injuries.

Domestic Battery/Child Endangerment/Criminal Threats: On October 1, 2018, at approximately 12:44 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Hidden Cove for a Domestic Battery which just occurred. The victim's child's, 27 year old, father showed up at the victim's residence unannounced. The suspect threatened the victim, and then punched her in the face, twice, knocking her to the ground while she was holding her two year old daughter. The suspect hit her again while she, and the child were on the ground. As the suspect was driving away the victim's mother arrived home. The suspect pointed a small black handgun at the mother, and threatened her, as he was driving away.

Residential Burglary: On October 1, 2018, at approximately 1:26 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to Willow Glen Apartments, in the 1200 block of Willow Avenue for a residential burglary. Sometime between 12:45 pm, and the time of call, an unknown suspect entered the residence

by breaking the rear sliding glass door. The loss was cash and personal papers.

Stolen Vehicle: On October 2, 2018, at approximately 7:29 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 2000 block of Railroad Avenue for the report of a stolen vehicle. Sometime between October 1, at approximately 9:30 pm, and October 2, at approximately 7:29 am, an unknown suspect took a Gray, 2012, Toyota Corolla, from the rear alley. An area check was done, and the vehicle was not located.

Shoplifting: On October 2, 2018, at approximately 11:29 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Rite Aid for a theft in progress. The Reporting Party said two African American male, in their 30's, just stole several items. The suspects were seen leaving in a champagne colored Mercedes SUV going towards the freeway. Officers were unable to locate the suspects or the suspect vehicle. The items stolen from Rite Aid were skin care products, and other health and beauty supplies.

Warrant Arrest: On October 2, 2018, at approximately 11:49 am, an Officer observed a white, 2001, GMC Yukon, leave the Lucky shopping center quickly. The Officer stopped the GMC for expired registration. The 19 year old male driver, from Vallejo, had two felony warrants out of Solano County for multiple charges to include firearms, and domestic violence related charges. Detectives went to Lucky and located a vehicle with a broken window, glass under the window and a backpack on the ground. Attempts were made to locate the owner of the vehicle with the broken window; however, the owner of the vehicle was not located. A card was left for the owner to contact HPD. Officers located some foreign currency and Jewelry, inside the suspect vehicle, but unable to confirm if they were stolen. The items were taken for safekeeping.

Prowling/Court Order Violation/Probation Violation: On October 2, 2018, at approximately 1:00 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of 1000 block of Victoria Park for an African American male adult who appeared to be trying to scale a wall, and hide in the bushes. Officers located a 27 year old male on the bay trail. The witness positively identified the male as the person who was attempting to climb over the fence. This residence is within the 100 yards of the male's mother house. The mother has a restraining order which orders the male to stay at least 100 yards from her home. The subject was arrested for Prowling, court order violation, and probation violation. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.
