Express Bus Study Plans for Expanded Commute Options for West Contra Costa Residents

The West Contra Costa Transportation Advisory Committee (WCCTAC) has initiated a study to examine opportunities to expand express bus service that connects commuters from Hercules, Pinole, San Pablo, Richmond, and unincorporated west Contra Costa County to destinations in west Berkeley, Emeryville, Oakland, and San Francisco. The expanded express bus service would travel primarily along Interstate 80, helping to reduce private vehicle traffic along this congested corridor and improve direct connections to high employment areas.

State Tax Education & Outreach

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration reached out to advise the City of a program called the Statewide Compliance and Outreach Program. The State will have a team of seven employees who will be canvassing businesses in Hercules zip code of 94547 sometime in the next two months. This team will be conducting routine permit and license verifications for each business (nonresidential). A letter has been sent to each business owner letting them know that we will be in there area soon conducting the routine visits. The program is intended to make sure that each business has the state tax and fee permit and licenses that are required, make sure our records for the business are updated and correct, allow the business owner to meet a California Department of Tax and Fee Administration employee and answer any questions they may have, and to make sure the business owner understands their reporting requirements so that they are able to report properly. Energy Efficient Equipment

The Hercules Swim Center operates year-around and has taken steps in the past 12-months to reduce the cost of operating the pools. The new pool covers dramatically reduce the need to heat the water in the winter months and reduce the consumption of chlorine, two of the biggest costs to the pools. Secondly, the City has installed electrical components called Variable Frequency Drives (VFD's) that allow the pool pumps to idle when not being used and speed up when in use. These additions to the Swim Center will reduce costs significantly for many years to come.

Suspected Child Abuse: On October 31, 2018, at approximately 1:30 pm, SRO's responded to a Hercules elementary school. A Children and Family Services worker was at the school to investigate a child abuse incident involving a juvenile, and his mother. The child had an injury to his upper lip. The child was placed with Grandparents pending further investigation.

Auto Burglary: On October 31st 2018 at approximately 7:24PM a HPD Officer was dispatched to the area of Victoria Crescent West and North Shelter Bay for a report of an auto burglary. The reporting party stated an unknown suspect(s) broke the rear window of her blue 2009 Chevy Tahoe and took a backpack containing various items of clothing and school supplies.

Recovered Stolen License Plates: On November 3, 2018 10:14 am, dispatch advised of an Automated License Plate Reader hit on stolen white 2008 Honda Accord traveling on eastbound I-80 at Fitzgerald. An HPD officer saw a white Honda Accord, and confirmed the license plate number. The female driver yielded just west of the Carquinez Bridge toll plaza. The driver, and her daughter, were detained. During the investigation, it was determined the Accord recently had both license plates stolen. The suspect replaced the victim's plates with different stolen Accord license plates. The driver reported her Accord's license plates stolen to San Leandro PD but no one removed the stolen license plates from her vehicle. The caller stated two African American male adults were inside the store with carts filled with merchandise. An officer parked near the west entrance doors of Home Depot observed a male, matching the description of one of the males, exit the Home Depot west doors with a shopping cart filled with merchandise. A Loss Prevention Officer attempted to contact the 62 male and the officer walked over to where they were standing. The male started to walk away. The officer told the male to stop and the male kept going. A short foot pursuit ensued. The male got into the right rear passenger seat, of a white Nissan, occupied by a black 45 year old female driver out of Richmond. After a brief struggle the male was taken into custody, and the female was detained. The second male adult suspect was not located. During a search of the female, a pipe commonly used to smoke narcotics, was located in her pocket. During an inventory search of the Nissan, several more pipes were located. The recovered merchandise totaled approximately \$1,600.00. The male was arrested for burglary, grand theft, and obstructing a police officer. The male was also found to be on Felony Parole. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The female was arrested for possession of drug paraphernalia and released on a citation.

Auto Burglary: On November 3, 2018 at 11:28am an auto burglary was reported at the golf course located at 3500 Franklin Canyon Rd. The Ohio resident said he parked his Purple '08 Chevy Silverado in the southwest corner of the lower parking lot at 4:15 p.m. yesterday.
