Domestic Violence: On December 6, 2018 at 6:57am, HPD units were dispatched to the 1000 block of Sanderling for domestic violence. The 49 year old female victim stated she and 39 year old boyfriend were separating and he was trying to leave with her belongings. She threw things at him, and he allegedly pushed her to the floor. There were no visible injuries and the suspect was gone when the officers arrived. The victim wanted the incident documented.

Theft by Trick or Device: On December 6, 2018, at 9:3am, an Officer was dispatched to a telephone detail regarding fraud. The victim stated she purchased 4 Disneyland tickets on the internet website "Offer Up". The victim met with the female suspect and exchanged cash for the tickets. When she checked the ticket numbers with Disneyland she found out they were fraudulent.

Armed Robbery: On December 6th 2018 at approximately 6:34AM HPD Officers were dispatched to the 1200 block of Hercules Ave for an armed robbery that just occurred. The suspects were described as two African American male adults wearing dark colored hoodies and armed with a handgun. They were believed to be in the 35-40 years of age range. The suspects approached the victim as he was getting into his vehicle. They demanded money. The victim gave them what he had, but they demanded more. The victim was able to hit the "Panic" button on his key fob, setting off an audible alarm. One of the suspects hit the victim in the face, with the gun, and both suspects fled.

Warrant Arrest On December 8th 2018 at approximately 12:33AM a HPD Officer checked on a suspicious vehicle on San Pablo Ave. The 43 year old male occupant, of Vallejo, was placed under arrest for a warrant out of Solano County. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Stolen License Plate: On December 6, 2018 at 4:16pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 2200 block of Railroad for a report of license plates being stolen from a vehicle. The reporting party had no time frame of when his license plates were stolen.

Attempt Residential Burglary: December 6, 2018 at 6:26pm, HPD units were dispatched to the 100 block of Sequoia for a report of an in-progress residential burglary. Officer checked the exterior of the home and found no entry point. However at the top of each garage door was a pry mark.

Shoplifting: On December 9, 2018, at approximately 10:39am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Home Depot for the report of a suspicious subject inside the store. Dispatch updated the suspect had exited, with merchandise, without paying for it. Asset Protection officers got the merchandise back. The 55 year old male subject, from Richmond, was contacted near Big Lots. He was positively identified, by Asset Protection from Home Depot, as the person who walked out with two power tools without paying for them. The suspect was arrested and brought back to HPD for further investigation. The suspect was issued a citation and released from HPD.

Auto Burglary: On December 9, 2018, at approximately 5:01 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Franklin Canyon Golf Course for an auto burglary. The victim said sometime between 12:00 pm and the time of call and an unknown suspect broke the passenger side rear window of a 2016 Honda and took an orange backpack.

Criminal Threats: On December 9, 2018, at approximately 5:44 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 2000 block of Central Street for a vandalism and threats. An adult male got into a verbal argument with adult female who resides at the address. The male threw several things, in the house, and broke some items. The suspect was restrained by several people, while he threatened to severely injure the female; and lunged at her. The suspect managed to break free and flee before officers arrived.

Reckless Evading Police Officer: On December 10, 2018, at 9:39 PM, an Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a silver 2006 Infiniti for a moving violation. The vehicle was traveling approximately 85 MPH, on EB I-80 towards Willow Avenue, when it caught the Officer's attention. Once

the Officer activated his emergency lights and siren, the vehicle accelerated and gained a significant distance. The vehicle reached speeds passed 90 MPH. While evading the vehicle committed multiple moving violations. The driver "blacked out" the vehicles lights when approaching the Carquinez Bridge. The pursuit was terminated at this time.
