Richmond Ferry Service

Refugio Creek Railway Trestle Replacement

Southern Pacific Railroad has completed the replacement of the existing railroad trestle bridge across Refugio Creek on the waterfront. Thank you to those in the area who were possibly impacted by the construction activity. This was an important safety upgrade.

Refugio Park and Path Repaving

The Refugio Park and Refugio Valley trail to just past the Fire Station has been repaved to enhance the use ability and extend the life of this well used trail. The work is substantially complete with just some backfill along the edges to be done. Many of our residents are using this much smoother section of trail and we hope you take some time to enjoy this great amenity.

Planning Division

- Approved Administrative Use Permit AUP# 18-45 for a home-based business making and selling handmade arts and crafts at 121 Camden Lane
- Approved Administrative Use Permit AUP# 18-46 for a home-based business for concrete contractor services at 792 Turquoise Drive
- Approved Minor Modification Permit #18-03 for architectural revisions to a previously approved but not yet constructed Safeway fuel center at the northeast corner of the intersections of Sycamore Avenue and San Pablo Avenue (will be addressed 4000 San Pablo Avenue) in Hercules. Modifications include changing the fuel center canopy from a single to a double row of structural support columns and on the kiosk building adding a controlled-access rooftop ladder for utility maintenance; and rearranging exterior windows and entrances to correspond to a revised interior floorplan. The overall site plan and the structures' sizes, heights, materials, colors, and signage remain as previously approved.
- Approved Minor modifications #MM-18-02 at the NE corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenue (will become 4040 San Pablo Avenue) for the approved Safeway Center commercial building (Chase Bank and Peet's Coffee with drive-through service) to add 238 square feet near drive up window and to enclose some utilities.

Bayfront Waterfront Update Provided at 1/8/2019 City Council

The developer of the Bayfront gave an update presentation to the Council this week on the overall project including:

- Current construction activities of Block N – The Exchange at Bayfront
- Projected building permit issuance and anticipated spring 2019 start for Blocks Q&R – The Grand at Bayfront
- Upcoming submittal this week of a new design review drawings for Blocks M, P, and O. It is anticipated that these 3 blocks may be coming before the Planning Commission around April or May

The City Manager also provided a brief status update on the Waterfront parking study underway anticipated to come before City Council in a few months and upcoming bus service to Bayfront. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They responded to multiple winter storms, which included removing several small trees that had fallen. The Street Sign Replacement Project is approximately 1/3 completed, with the remaining signs on order. The long-awaited permit from Bay Area Air Quality Management District was received for the replacement generator at the Community Center. Putting the new generator on-line can now proceed. The top down cleaning of the City's entire sewer system, approximately 67 miles of pipeline, is nearing completion. The trees in the Business Park are under evaluation including removal and replacement. Approximately 30 new, energy-efficient LED streetlight replacements were completed on Refugio Valley Road, out the valley past Redwood Drive.

Engineering

The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is nearing completion, with an anticipated final completion date of June 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, power and gas services provided by PG&E were delayed. The cost impact of this delay is being assessed. The grading permit for Sycamore Crossing was issued and work is anticipated to begin in the next week or two. The design plans are under review for the public improvements for the future Safeway, located at the southeast corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenue. Work on the Refugio Valley Pedestrian Trail Resurfacing Project is nearing completion. The 2018 Street

Rehabilitation Project was completed and accepted by Council. Work on the new bathroom and sport court at Duck Pond Park is nearing completion. The design contract to upgrade the wastewater conveyance system between Duck Pond Park and the Waste Water Treatment Plant located in Pinole was approved by Council. Design is anticipated to occur over the next year, followed by the construction of the physical improvements. Consultant selection for the sewer rate study is nearing completion. Staff is negotiating a contract amendment with West Yost, who provides staff augmentation, to support this effort as well as perform sewer system modeling to identify future capital improvement projects. Contracts for both these items are tentatively scheduled to come before Council at their January 22 meeting.

As of January 1, 2019, the Contra Costa County Library has eliminated overdue fines on all library materials. The Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors voted on Tuesday, December 11 in favor of the proposal to eliminate daily fines on overdue books, magazines, DVDs and other materials.

By eliminating fines, the library is removing barriers and making access easy, equitable and enjoyable for everyone.

Patrons will still be expected to return library materials on time. Checkout periods on materials will remain the same and patrons will incur a replacement charge if materials are not returned 30 days after the due date.

Warrant Arrest: On December 13th 2018 at approximately 2:15AM a HPD Officer conducted a

Vehicle Collision: On December 14th 2018 at approximately 8:13PM HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of San Pablo Ave and Victoria Crescent East for a vehicle collision. A 2012 Dodge Ram collided into the driver's side of a 2000 Ford Explorer. The driver of the Ford suffered a laceration to his finger and was transported to a hospital for further evaluation. The driver of the Dodge was not injured.

CRIME PREVENTION NOTE - Section 246.3(a) of the California Penal Code states: Except as otherwise authorized by law, any person who willfully discharges a firearm in the a grossly negligent manner which could result in injury or death to a person is guilty of a public offense and shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year. (This includes, but is not limited to, “celebratory” shooting of firearms in the air. REMEMBER WHAT GOES UP WILL ALSO COME DOWN.)

246.3(a) PC is a Misdemeanor. However if a negligently fired bullet comes down, and strikes a person, more serious crimes may be charged. These crimes could include Homicide; Manslaughter; or Assault with a Deadly Weapon. All of these crimes are Felonies and punishable by various terms in State Prison.

Vandalism: On January 2, 2019 at 3:00pm an officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Willow for a report of damage to a vehicle. The reporting party said, sometime after 9:00pm last night, an unknown suspect shattered a window on his Toyota Camry.

Theft: On January 2, 2019 at 4:06pm an officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. A resident, from the 600 block of Devonwood, reported an unknown suspect entered her unlocked vehicle sometime after 1:00pm on December 30 and stole registration papers from inside.
