Warrant Arrest: On January 17, 2019 at 9:47am, an officer conducted a pedestrian stop on a 28 year old male, on Village Parkway near Mission Springs. The subject had a non-citable misdemeanor warrant issued September 12, 2018. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest: On January 17, 2019 at 10:21am, an Officer investigated the driver, of a black Honda parked, in the Home Depot parking lot. The 34 year old male, from Vallejo, was found to have a citable warrant. The subject was cited and released, at the scene, with a new court date.

Domestic Violence Restraining Order Violation: On January 17, 2019 at 3: an adult female came to HPD and reported that her 44 year old ex-husband was at her residence, on Amber Court, in violation of a domestic violence restraining order. The male subject has been served with the order and it is active. Apparently the subject was let into the residence, sometime last night, by her son. When officers arrived the subject was in the front driveway of the residence (within the stipulated 100 yards. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Resist/Obstruct/Delay a Peace Officer On January 17th 2019 at approximately 9:09PM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a silver 2003 Dodge Durango, in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. The 27 year old male driver, of El Sobrante, refused to follow Officer's orders to exit the vehicle in order to conduct an inventory search in preparation for towing the

vehicle). He was physically removed from the vehicle, placed under arrest, and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Shooting (Rolling Vehicle)/(Occupied Building): On January 18, 2019 at 1:45pm, officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Refugio Valley Road for a report of gunshots coming from the area of Refugio Valley Park. A witness reported seeing an African American male adult, with a short hair, leaning out the passenger's window of a possible Lexus firing a handgun at a Silver SUV. The witness said it appeared the silver SUV was chasing the Lexus. Both vehicles were last seen east on Sycamore. An Area check was conducted east of the crime scene with negative results. One bullet hit the north side of the McDonald's building, but there were no reported injuries. At 5:20pm an adult male came to HPD and reported he was the victim in the incident, which started as a robbery. He stated he was visiting a friend on Cinnabar Way, in Hercules. He said he left his friend's house about 1:45pm and was walking out to his car. He was confronted by two African American male adults, armed with pistols. The suspects demanded money and pushed him to the ground. The victim gave them his money and the suspects fled in a Silver Hyundai. The victim got into his car and chased after the suspects. He said he caught up to the suspects on E/B Sycamore Ave. at Refugio Valley Rd. He attempted to take a photo of the suspect's vehicle, but was unsuccessful. The victim continued to follow the suspect vehicle E/B on Sycamore. The right front passenger leaned out of the window and fired two gunshots at his vehicle. He said both rounds struck his vehicle. The suspects fled E/B Sycamore Ave. The victim left the area because he thought the suspects might come back. He later came to the Police Department to make a report. The investigation is continuing.

Petty Theft/Warrant Arrest/ Resist Delay Officer/Warrants: On January at 6:25pm officers were dispatched to Home Depot. The Loss Prevention Agent said known shoplifters were inside the store. The two adult male suspects exited the store with stolen merchandise, and were detained. One of the subjects resisted and an officer deployed his Taser. The prongs lodged into the subject's jacket and did not make contact with the skin. The subject had three outstanding warrants. He was arrested for Theft, and the warrants, and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The second subject was arrested for Theft, cited and released.

Possession of controlled substance and probation violation On January 18th 2019 at approximately 8:10PM a HPD Officer re-contacted the second suspect, in the above case. He was inside a red Jeep that was left in the Home Depot parking lot. After being cite/released he went back for the car he had apparently left at the scene. He was determined to be on

searchable felony probation. A search of his person and vehicle was conducted and a substance, suspected to be a narcotic, was located. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Runaway Juvenile On January 18th 2019 at approximately 9:55PM a HPD Officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Scotts Valley for a runaway 14 year old male. He was supposed to be picked up from an after school program in Richmond at 7:00pm but was not there. He was entered into the Missing and Unidentified Persons System and a TRAK flyer was sent.

Residential Burglary: On January 19, 2019, at about 9:44 am, an officer responded to the 2100 block of Lewis St for a reported residential burglary. The victim said she left the home on January 18, 2019, at about 4:45 pm, and all of the doors were locked. When she returned home the following day she discovered the side garage door was open. An unknown race male enter through the side garage door and took a navy blue Specialized Hybrid bike

Vehicle Theft: On January 19, 2019, at about 10:14 am, an officer responded to the 100 block of Oxford St for a reported green, 2011 Toyota Camry taken from in front of the residence. The incident occurred sometime between January 18, 2019, at 2:00 pm, and the time of call today. An area check for evidence was conducted with negative.

Fraud: On January 19, 2019, at about 11:35 am, officers responded to the 1600 block of Sycamore Ave, Bank of America, for a reported fraud that just occurred. An employee described the subject as an African American Female; in her 30's; wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt, dark charcoal pants and reading glasses. She left the bank and got into a newer model, white SUV. The SUV was last seen heading towards Taco Bell. An area check for the vehicle yielded negative results.

Injury Traffic Collision: On January 19, 2019, at about 2:29 pm, officers responded to Willow Ave and the I-80 E/B onramp intersection for a reported traffic collision. Both vehicles, a 2007 Honda, and a 2014 Toyota Camry sustained major damage and were towed. One of the parties, a 26 year female of Rodeo was transported, by ambulance, to a trauma center with unspecified injuries.

Theft by False Pretenses: On January 19, 2019 at about 4:07 pm, an officer responded to the HPD lobby for a reported theft. A resident from the 400 block of Lighthouse Ct believed he was contacting United Airlines regarding a refund on airline ticket. He was told to purchase a Google play

card and provided the passcode. The victim did as instructed and then purchased two more Google play cards. It was not until he was told to purchase a third card that he realized he was scammed

Auto Burglary: On January 20, 2019, at approximately 9:23 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 1700 block of Redwood Road for the report of an auto Burglary. Sometime between January 19, 2019 at approximately 8:45 pm, and the time of call an unknown Suspect (s) broke the passenger front window to a yellow, 2011, Ford Fiesta. The suspect(s) took several items from the Ford.

Vandalism: On January 20, 2019, at approximately 11:07 am, an Officer responded to a vandalism in the 1900 block of Redwood. A suspect(s) broke the front passenger and driver's side windows to a 2011 Honda CRV. There was no loss from the vehicle.

Vandalism: On January 20, 2019, at approximately 11:43 am, an Officer responded to the 100 block of Sequoia for a Vandalism. At approximately 7:17 am, four suspects approached a residence on Sequoia. One suspect broke the driver's side front window to a gray Honda Civic parked on the street, and one of the suspects walked to the driver's side of a Gray Mazda SUV parked in the driveway. The suspect walked around the passenger side and broke the passenger side front window. There was no loss from the vehicles.

Negligent Discharge of a Firearm: On January 20, 2019 at 9:59 pm, officers responded to the area of Frog Pad Park, in the 1000 block of Willets, for gunshots heard in the area. Officers located shell casings on the street in the 2000 block of N. Front. Officers received additional calls of shots fired near the areas of Miramar and the roundabout at Redwood Road. However, no shell casings or evidence of a crime were recovered at those locations. At this time, it appears no person, residences, or vehicles were struck.

Stolen Vehicle: On January 21, 2019, at approximately 8:11 am, an Officer was dispatched to Crystal Circle in Hercules for the report of a stolen green, 2001, Toyota Corolla. Sometime between January 19, 2019, at approximately 7:00 pm, and January 20, 2019, at approximately 7:00 am an unknown suspect stole the Toyota from the visitor parking area.

Grand Theft: On January 21, 2019, at approximately 4:42 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 1700 block of Redwood Road in Hercules for a theft. The victim left on January 20, 2019 at approximately 11:00 am, and returned home on January 21, 2019, at approximately 2:00 am. Today he

went to the garage and noticed he was missing almost all of his shoes he stored in the garage.

Driving Under the Influence: On January 21, 2019, at 10:10 pm, an officer stopped 40 year old female driver, of Oakland, for operating a green 2009 vehicle with no plates. The vehicle registration was expired for more than six months. The driver showed objective symptoms of intoxication. She was given the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device showed the subject was over the presumptive level for driving.

The subject was arrested for Driving Under the Influence. She was cited and released to a responsible party.

Petty Theft: On January 21, 2019, at 11:01 pm, a citizen from the 2200 block of Pheasant Drive called to report a package theft from her front porch had occurred at 5:35 pm. The suspect was described as a white adult male in his twenties; wearing a black sweater, blue jeans, black shoes; and was carrying a gray and tan backpack.

Collision: On January 22, 2019, at approximately 3:25 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to Sycamore Avenue and San Pablo Avenue for a vehicle collision. A 2011 Toyota Prius, driven by a 31 year old female, was attempting to turn south bound from the parking lot in the 3600 block of San Pablo Avenue. A 2016, Hyundai driven by 20 year old female was traveling north bound on San Pablo Avenue and struck the driver's door area of the Toyota Prius. The driver of the Toyota complained of pain to her back and left knee. Medical assistance was called and treated the subject at the scene. She declined to be transported to a hospital and was given a ride home.

Auto Burglary: On January 22, 2019, at approximately 3:45 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Franklin Canyon Golf Course for an auto burglary. Sometime between 10:30 am, and 11:00 am an unknown suspect broke the passenger side rear window to a 2014 Nissan. The suspect took a school backpack with personal items inside of it.

Bob Cop - Auto Burglary: On January 22, 2019, at 5:46 pm, a citizen from the 1000 block of Baywood Lane made an online report stating sometime today, the window of his vehicle had been shattered and numerous construction equipment taken ("harness, helmet, wrenches, etc.").

Hit and Run: On January 22, 2019, at 9:32 pm, a citizen called to state an African American male, in his 20's, driving a black Dodge Durango, rear

ended his 2016 Toyota Corolla, while stopped in the Jack in the Box drive thru. The driver of the Durango backed out and fled northbound towards San Pablo Avenue. The Toyota sustained minor damage.

Found Property: On January 23, 2019, at 6:18 am, while on foot patrol, at the Tennis Courts, 1516 Refugio Valley Road, an officer located two large red coolers situated under one of the wooden benches. The items were taken as found property.
