MSIN: On February 7, 2019 at 10:56 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 400 block of N. Wildwood for a welfare check. The reporting party said he found a 2 or 3 year old African American male, wandering around with only a shirt on and no adult nearby. Officers proceeded to the area and observed a 28 year old female walking around. She said she lived in the 200 block of S. Wildwood and was looking for her 2 1/2 year old son. The mother said she fell asleep, with the child in her upstairs bedroom, and when she woke up she found him gone. The child apparently recently learned how to unlock the front door. The mother believes her son woke up today and left through the front door. Officers contacted the child, with the reporting party, inside a residence in the 400 block of N. Wildwood. The child was not injured and appeared to be in good health and nourished. The reporting party told Officers he found the child wandering around to the rear of his backyard area (Village Parkway) with only a shirt on. The reporting party brought the child inside and put some pants/socks on him. Officers reunited the mother with her son. Officers did a welfare check at the home and found it to be a suitable living environment. Officers recommended the mother take measures to put a child safety lock on the front door. Officers determined the child walked approximately 0.1 of a mile and was endangered due to the proximity of the roadway, vehicles, and pedestrians. The case will be forwarded to the Child and Family Services Department for a routine follow-up check.

Lost Passport: On February 8, 2019 at 10:35am a resident from the 100 block of Beryl came to HPD to report he lost his India Passport.

Vandalism: On February 8, 2019 at 2:28pm, an officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Skelly for a vandalism report. The reporting party said, sometime after 5:00pm yesterday, an unknown suspect(s) cracked two windows on work trucks; and punctured a coolant tank on one truck.

Miscellaneous Report: On February 8, 2019 at 2:40pm, an officer was dispatched to HPD for a Lobby detail. The reporting party said the IRS was auditing him regarding his 2016 tax returns. The reporting party said the tax preparer was living in Hercules at the time she prepared and file his 2016 taxes. The reporting party said, sometime after 11:00pm last night, an unknown suspect stole his black 2004 Chevy Silverado from his driveway. All windows were up and doors locked. Driving Under the Influence: On February 10, 2019, at 3:04 am, an officer stopped 44 year old male, of Richmond. The subject was driving his white GMC Sierra, on Victoria Crescent East at San Pablo Avenue and had DUI indicators. The subject displayed objective symptoms of intoxication and refused to complete the Standardized Field \Sobriety Tests. He continued to refuse any tests and a DUI blood draw warrant was granted by a judge. After the blood draw, The subject stated he was not feeling well. He was cited and released to AMR who transported him to the hospital.

Attempted Auto Burglary: On February 10, 2019, at 7:54 pm, a citizen called to report his white 2014 Ford Fusion, had been burglarized, within the last 15 minutes, while parked in front of Lucky Supermarket, 1590 Sycamore Avenue. The investigation revealed the driver's side window was shattered and the interior hood latch had been released, but nothing was taken.
