### **Possession of a Stolen Vehicle/Possession of an Controlled Substance/Possession of Burglary Tools/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia/Warrant:**

On March 6, 2019, at approximately 11:57 am, Dispatch advised of a Automatic License Plate Reader hit on a stolen, green, 1993, Honda Accord traveling east bound Highway 80. An Officer was in route do a security check, at the Franklin Canyon Golf Course, and while driving east on Highway 4 located the stolen Honda traveling east bound prior to the Golf Course. A traffic stop was conducted at Cummings Skyway off ramp, and the vehicle yielded. The solo 40 year old male driver of Concord, was taken into custody. The subject was found to be in possession of suspected narcotic, drug paraphernalia, and a burglary tool. He also had a misdemeanor warrant for possession of stolen property. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Petty Theft:** On March 6, 2019, at approximately 4:26 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to Tutu School of dance located at 1581 Sycamore Avenue for the theft of two iPads which just occurred. Two African American females; approximately 15 to 17 years old; wearing all black clothing; went into the business and took two iPads, from the front counter, while the employee was in the back. The two suspects then ran down the path by Dragon Terrace to Sycamore Avenue, and possibly got into a navy blue Dodge Challenger with paper plates.

### **Warrant Arrest/ Suspended Driver/ Impounded Vehicle/ Ignition**

**Interlock Device (IID) Required:** On March 7, 2019 at approximately 10:17am, a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a maroon 2002 Dodge

Caravan, in the area of Sycamore and Claeys Ranch, for expired registration over six months and displaying a current registration sticker. The 25 year old female driver, had a \$5000 citable warrant out of Marin County. She is on probation for Driving Under the Influence, and part of her probation requirements is that she must have an IID on any vehicle she drives, which she did not have. Her license was also suspended. The subject was cited and released and the Caravan was impounded.

**Warrant Arrest:** On March 8, 2019 at approximately 9:31pm an Officer stopped a 2011 Toyota corolla, for a vehicle code violation, in the area of Willow Ave at Hawthorne Dr. The 35 year old male Passenger, out of San Pablo had two active warrants for his arrest. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Martine Detention Facility.

**Death Investigation:** On March 8, 2019 at approximately 9:54pm, Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Civic Dr. for a possible coroner's case. Officers met with paramedics who were already on scene. Officers were advised the 82 year old female resident was declared deceased. The family was on scene and stated the last time anyone had spoken to her was earlier in the day at approximately 3:00pm. There were no signs of foul play and the coroner released the body to the family.

**Warrant Arrest:** On March 9, 2019 at approximately 02:51am, an Officer stopped a 2000 Ford expedition for a vehicle code violation. The 40 year old male passenger, out of Antioch, had an active citable warrant out of Tuolumne County. The subject was cite released at the scene.

**Stolen License Plates:** On March 9, 2019 at 2:16 p.m. An Officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Williams St. to take a report for lost or stolen license plates. The victim said an unknown suspect stole both the front and rear license plates from her '08 Acura TL

**Warrant Arrest:** On March 9, 2019 at 3:23 p.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a Silver '01 Lincoln, with Paper Plates. The 38 year old female front passenger, of Vallejo, hadan outstanding Misdemeanor cite releasable Warrant out of Vallejo P.D. The Warrant was issued on 12/18/2018. The subject was cited and released.

**Assault with a Deadly Weapon:** On March 10, 2019, at approximately 7:42 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 1000 Crepe Myrtle for the report of a male stabbed in his upper chest. The 66 year old male victim was stabbed by a 37 year old male relative. Both subjects lived at the residence. Officers arrived and contacted the suspect, in the 1000 block of Crepe Myrtle, walking away from the scene. The subject was detained.

The victim had multiple stab wounds, to his left arm, and left chest area. Paramedics treated the victim and he was transported to Lefty Gomez Field (in Rodeo) to be transported by Helicopter to John Muir Hospital. The victim was in serious, but stable condition. The suspect was arrested, and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility

**Petty Theft:** On March 10, 2019, at 9:37 pm, an employee from Rite Aid, 1560 Sycamore Avenue, flagged down nearby officers. She stated the female she was chasing had just stole merchandise from the store. Officers contacted the 24 year old female, of Rodeo. The investigation revealed the female was responsible for stealing \$122.00 in merchandise. The store manager declined to press charges since the property was returned. The suspect was released from the scene.

**Warrant Arrest:** On March 11, 2019, at 2:16 am, an officer stopped 50 year old male, of Richmond, while driving a black 2003 Mercedes for an equipment violation. The subject had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant out of Alameda County. He was cited and released on the warrant and for driving with a suspended or revoked driver's license.
