Annual Weed Abatement for Fire Prevention

The Bay Area had a long and wet rainy season this year, with rains having extended into April. That means we have had tremendous amount of vegetation growth this year, and since rains extended into the April, it is still mostly green and growing. The Rodeo Hercules Fire Protection District regulates and follows-up on weed abatement for fire prevention purposes on private property. Weed abate must be completed by July 1, 2019. Weed abatement on City owned properties is not done for aesthetic purposes, but for fire prevention. The City will be starting its weed abatement in June as to do so during the time when growth is still occurring would require more than one abatement, and that work will be completed by the July 1st deadline as well.

**2019 WEED ABATEMENT AND HAZARD REDUCTION
COMPLETE BY JULY 1ST**

The Rodeo-Hercules Fire District is now in the process of pursuing fire hazard reduction for 2019 and would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your cooperation with the District's 2018 Hazard Reduction Program.

The danger of a major wildfire involving homes within the Town of Rodeo or City of Hercules is very real. Year after year the accumulation of dry dead weeds, brush or trees ("fuels") within the wildland/urban and neighborhood setting increases dramatically. The recent devastating Northern California fires are a testament to this problem. Those types of horrific fires can happen here in our community- drought conditions exist every dry season that can allow a fire to sweep through entire neighborhoods.

As neighborhoods age and vegetation- both ornamental and native- is allowed to grow unchecked, an uninterrupted source of "fuel" is developed between homes, combustible wood shake roofs, and surrounding vegetation. All this considered, given the right conditions, i.e., an extended period of drought and sustained winds with low humidity, the chances of a large devastating fire here are very real.

All abatement or hazard clearance "fuels reduction" shall be completed by July 1st of each year. Again, the Fire District thanks you for your past cooperation and for making this a safer community. If you receive a **"NOTICE FOR ABATEMENT"**, please do not ignore it. Your actions taken now will mean the difference in your and your family's survival, the survival of your residence, and that of your neighborhood in a major fire.

It is the responsibility of every homeowner or resident to do their part in the reduction or abatement of "fuels" on their property that would further propagate or spread a fire. Again, we ask that you plan to clear your property by JULY 1st.

Make a difference and represent Hercules on the Board of Trustees for the Contra Costa Mosquito & Vector Control District. The District is the public health agency that works to prevent vectors, which are the insects and animals that can cause harm or spread disease to humans. As a member of the District's Board of Trustees, you would represent Hercules and make decisions that help to shape the District's public health programs. Each trustee initially serves for two years and will receive \$100.00 per month in lieu of benefits for attending a meeting, regardless of the number of meetings attended. Board meetings are held on the second Monday of every other month at the District's offices in Concord. Trustees must be at least 18-years-old, a resident of Hercules, a Contra Costa County taxpayer, and have an interest in public health, public policy, wetlands, farming, community education, finance, personnel, or land development in accordance with California Health & Safety Code, Section 2242. Public Hearing Bayfront-Waterfront Blocks M-P & O



Several design modifications were incorporated at the last meeting as shown below. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. At this time the Street Sign Replacement Project is approximately 75% completed, with the remaining signs received at the Maintenance Yard. A contract to paint red curb throughout town has been awarded and the contractor is scheduling the work. The Corporation Yard sewer lateral installation was bid out and an installation date is being scheduled. Numerous street lights around town were repaired.

Engineering

The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is nearing completion, with an anticipated substantial completion date of July 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, power and gas services provided by PG&E were delayed. The cost impact of this delay is being assessed. The design plans are under final review for the public improvements for the future Safeway, located at the southeast corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenue. The grading/demolition plan will be issued shortly and it is anticipated the contractor could move on site as soon as next week. The design plans are also under review for the Bayfront Project for Blocks Q&R and M,O, & P, the Willow Center, Sycamore Crossing, and the Hillcrest project. Work on the Refugio Valley Pedestrian Trail Resurfacing Project is substantially complete, the contractor worked on punch list items. The new bathroom and sport court at Duck Pond Park is substantially complete. Design is underway for the mile long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant, computer flow modeling has begun for the City's backbone sewer system, as is the financial study for the sewer fund. Final design for the Hercules Avenue Traffic Calming Project was bid out and bids are anticipated in the next week. The 2019 Street Rehabilitation Project is under final design and will be built this summer.
