Landscape & Lighting Assessment Districts Updates



The City Council conducted the public hearings Tuesday this week regarding the annual CPI adjustment to Landscape & Lighting Assessment increases in the five Districts in the City. The Council approved the CPI adjustments except for Zones 1 (Hercules by the Bay) and Zone 7 (Refugio Heights) where the City was balloting on increases to replace failing hollow-core wood pole streetlights. All ballots were due by the close of public testimony on Tuesday evening. Ballots for Zones 1 and Zones 7 were tabulated Wednesday morning and the assessment increases with a 10 year sunset were approved in both Zone 1 and Zone 7. On July 23rd, the City Council will formally accept those results. Thank you to the property owners who recognized the need and value in replacing those aging and failing streetlight, and to everyone who took the time to become informed and cast their ballots.

After the Council action on July 23rd, City staff will move forward in securing the replacement light poles and will solicit bids for removal of the old light poles and installation of the new poles with energy efficient LED fixtures. The cost to operate these will also be lower and there will little to no repair cost for a considerable period of time.

In a related matter, as part of our efforts to ensure responsiveness and to be cost effective, we are happy to report that PG & E has finally made the changes to rate program for streetlights in those areas from the rate where the PG & E and the City shared maintenance responsibility to the rate structure where the City has sole responsibility for the repair and maintenance. While this is a lower rate, it will also allow us to better manage the requests for repair without having to rely on PG & E and the long-time frames associated with their meeting their responsibilities. The City had made this request of PG & E back in October, 2018.

Senior Center Improvements

Work has been substantially completed on two improvements designed to improve access to the Senior Center. A gap in the sidewalk has been closed from the handicapped and other parking spaces adjacent to the Senior Center by a new section of sidewalk, an updated handicap ramp has been installed closer to the larger parking area, and an automatic door opening device was installed on the main door.

This year's Fourth of July festivities went off without a hitch again and our small town feel race, parade and Festival in the Park were wonderful and well-attended. At the City booth, we gave away more than 1,300 reusable bags and we enjoyed interacting with some many of our Hercules residents.

unique Herculean event. Special thanks are due to all of those dedicated volunteers that work year round on the events, and those who join in leading up to the vents and one the day. We

couldn't do it without you all. Sycamore Crossing Going to Public Hearing Before Planning Commission This Monday

A public hearing is being held at 7:00 p.m. next Monday, July 15, 2019 at City Council Chambers to consider adopting Recommending Resolutions of approval. The project is located on the southwest corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenues adjacent to Tsushima Avenue (known as the Sycamore Crossing site). The project includes the following proposed land uses:

- 13,111 square foot CVS Pharmacy with drive thru
- 4-story Hampton Inn Suites with 101 hotel rooms
- 12,000 square feet of retail/restaurant uses
- 4,400 square foot pad with drive thru
- 120 multi-family condominium units

The staff report for this project will be posted on the City website under the 7/15/2019 Planning Commission Agenda by this Friday with the Design Drawings now accessible to the public on the City's website at <https://www.ci.hercules.ca.us/government/planning/hercules-projects/sycamore-crossing>. New sidewalk and ADA Ramp at Senior Center

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. Public Works Department assistance with Fourth of July festivities went smoothly. At this time the Street Sign Replacement Project is approximately 85% completed, with the remaining signs received at the Maintenance Yard. Red curb was painted throughout town. The Corporation Yard sewer lateral installation been completed. Numerous street lights around town were repaired. Weed abatement work for the firebreaks is now complete except for a few small punch list items. The installation of the connector sidewalk and an ADA ramp at the Senior Center has been completed.

Engineering

The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is nearing completion, with an anticipated substantial completion date of July 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, power and gas services provided by PG&E were delayed. The cost impact of this delay is being assessed. The design plans are under final review for the public improvements for the future Safeway, located at the southeast corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenue. The grading/demolition plan was issued and the contractor is working on site. The design for the public improvements for the Bayfront Project were approved for Blocks Q&R and are under review for Blocks M, O, & P. The design plans are also under review for the Willow Center, Sycamore Crossing, and the Hillcrest project. Work on the Refugio Valley Pedestrian Trail Resurfacing Project is substantially complete, the contractor is completing the punch list items. Design is underway for the mile long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant, computer flow modeling continues for the City's backbone sewer system, as does the financial study for the sewer fund.
