Theft by False Pretenses: On April 4, 2019 at 5:11 p.m. An Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Ash Ct. to take an identity theft report. The victim said an unknown suspect contacted him today via phone. The suspect said the victim was “under Federal investigation” due to his social security card being found inside a vehicle that was transporting Cocaine in Texas. The suspect told the victim to purchase Google Play gift cards to pay them to “clear his name.” The victim purchased two Google Play gift cards totaling \$900, and gave the suspect the gift card’s serial numbers.

Warrant Arrest: On April 4, 2019 at 5:31 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of Lupine Rd. at Tamarack Lane for a report of a suspicious subject. The reporting party stated a 50 years old Asian male was seen walking around the neighborhood talking to himself and going into yards. Officers located a former Hercules resident, who matched the description. He was found to have an outstanding Felony No Bail Warrant, issued on January 14, 2015. The subject was arrested and transported to Martinez Detention Facility

Auto Burglary: On April 4, 2019 at approximately 7:30pm, an Officer was dispatched to a report of a auto burglary in the parking lot of 1581 Sycamore Ave. The reporting party stated she parked her vehicle in the parking lot at approximately 3:00pm. When he returned, just prior to call, she found her rear passenger side window smashed. The only thing missing was a gym bag containing clothing.

Suspicious Circumstance (MSIN): On April 4, 2019 at approximately 10:26pm, Officers were dispatched to a suspicious circumstance in the 100 block of Poppy Ct. The reporting party stated her dog was barking and she heard sounds as if someone was inside her residence. Officers checked the residence for any suspects, but did not locate any. Officers noted the residence did not have any power. Officers determined the power box, on the side of the house, had been opened and the power appeared to have been deliberately shut off.

Auto Burglary: On April 4, 2019 at approximately 11:37pm, an Officer was dispatched to a report of a auto burglary in the 3000 block of N Front St. The reporting party parked her 2005 Mercedes at approximately 6:30pm. When the she returned to her vehicle at approximately

7:00pm she found her driver side rear window smashed. Items taken were a purse containing personal identifying information and jewelry.

Domestic Violence / Brandishing a Firearm: On April 5, 2019 at approximately 2:21am, Officers were dispatched to a domestic disturbance in the 100 block of Paradise. A 35 year old female stated she had been in an altercation with her 46 year old boyfriend, and he had just pointed a shotgun at her. Officers made contact with the female, who was outside in her vehicle. Officers then called the male out of his residence, and detained him. The male stated he had thrown the firearm it over the fence into the greenbelt. Officers located an unloaded sawed off shotgun, wrapped in a shirt, in the greenbelt. During the investigation it was found the male had pointed the gun at the female. The male also threw the female to the ground and choked her. The female had visible injuries to her neck and face and wished to press charges. The male was placed under arrest and later transported to Martine Detention Facility.

Coroner's Case: On April 5, 2019 at 9:33 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1800 block of Lupine Rd. for a report of a person in cardiac arrest with Fire requesting we respond. Officers arrived, prior to Fire, and located 68 year old female, deceased in her bedroom. A roommate was concerned after not seeing or hearing her that morning. When she opened the bedroom door, to check on the subject, she found the subject unresponsive in her bed and called 911. There were no signs of trauma and there was no indication a crime occurred. An Officer contacted the on-duty Coroner's Deputy who responded and took possession of the subject's body.

Outside Assist: On April 6, 2019 at approximately 12:54am, Officers responded to the area of Henry Ave at Pinole Valley Rd for a report of multiple gun shots heard in the area. It was determined that the shots had come from a residence, nearby. Hercules Officers assisted Pinole PD with a perimeter and search of the area for any outstanding suspects..

Auto Burglary X 4: On April 6, 2019, at 8:40am, an officer was dispatched to the area of Village Parkway, at Forest Run, for a report of multiple cars with their windows broken out. The Officer located two vehicles parked on the east side of Forest Run near Forest Park (White '10 Acura TL and Silver '03 Toyota Rav 4) that had their right front passenger windows shattered. The Officer contacted the owners of the victim vehicles. The Officer located two other vehicles parked on Village Parkway at Devonwood (White '14 Jeep Compass and Silver '06 Toyota Corolla) that also had their right front passenger windows shattered. Nothing of value was taken out of any of the four victim vehicles.

Warrant Arrest: On April 6, 2019 at 9:37 a.m. an Officer contacted a 55 year old male, as he was standing outside his residence, in the 200 block of Meadowlark Way. The subject was arrested on his outstanding Misdemeanor Warrant. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Possession of a Controlled Substance: On April 6, 2019 at 2:31pm, an Officer checked on an occupied suspicious White '96 Lexus ES 300, parked in the Park & Ride, across from, 828 Willow Ave. The driver was a 51 year old male, of Sacramento. The subject said his vehicle broke down on W/B I-80, last night, and he was towed to the Park & Ride by the Freeway Safety Patrol Service. The subject told the Officer he was on Probation out of Sacramento County. The Officer saw a Marijuana cigar in plain view and Dispatch confirmed the subject was on searchable Probation. A search was done of the subject and his vehicle. The Officer located a small plastic baggie, containing suspected narcotics, concealed inside a cigarette box in the vehicle's center console box. The subject was cited and released at the scene.

Outside Assist: On April 6, 2019, at 10:54 pm, Hercules Officers responded to the 2800 block of Hermosa Street in Pinole after Pinole P. D. requested our assistance for a shooting incident. Several shots were fired. No reported injuries.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On April 6, 2019, at 11:30 pm, a citizen from the 1000 block of Lantern Bay reported seeing a male, wearing a light colored hooded sweatshirt, attempting to open the driver's side door of his Honda Accord while parked in the driveway. After seeing the suspect on video surveillance, the homeowner ran outside and gave chase, but was unable to catch him. The vehicle was not damaged and no property was taken.

Auto Burglary: On April 7, 2019, at approximately 2:18 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to Lucky for the report of an auto burglary which just occurred. The witness observed an African American male; age unknown; in a yellow sweatshirt, with the hood pulled over his face; run from a gray newer model Mercedes sedan immediately after she heard the glass break. The suspect was carrying a purse taken from the Mercedes, and ran to the Refugio Valley Rd side of Lucky, and got into an older tan Honda Accord 2 Door. The point of entry was the front passenger side window smash

Reckless Evading: On April 7, 2019, at approximately 5:44 pm, an Officer conducted a traffic stop on a black (approximately 2006 model) Mercedes MLK 300, with paper license plates, on Highway 4 west bound just west of the Willow off ramp for not having license plates. The Officer started to approach the vehicle, and the driver drove off west bound on Highway 4 and a pursuit was initiated. The Mercedes continued west bound on Highway 4, and made a U-turn just prior to San Pablo Avenue. The Mercedes then entered Highway 80 west bound, and the pursuit was terminated. The driver of the Mercedes was a Hispanic male in his 20's.

Auto Burglary: On April 7, 2019, at 9:29 pm, a citizen called to report locating a 2009 Nissan Maxima parked in a guest stall, on Dutch Elm at Silver Maple, with the driver's side rear window smashed. The owner was contacted and stated a battery charger was taken from the rear passenger seat. The vehicle was last seen intact on April 6, 2019, at 12:00 pm.

Vandalism: On April 8, 2019, at 2:40 am, Hercules Officers responded to Willow Food & Liquor, 828 Willow Avenue, for a "Glass break" alarm. Officers arrived to find one of the large windows, at the front of the store, had been shattered by an unknown object. Officers checked the interior and discovered no theft had occurred.
