Shoplifting/Conspiracy/Towed Vehicle: On July 9, 2019 at 9:45 a.m. an officer was flagged down, by the Rite Aid Store Manager, from the parking lot of Rite Aid, 1560 Sycamore Ave. The Store Manager said a male and female, in their 50's-60's, just left the store setting off the store's anti-theft sensors while exiting. The two suspect's fled in a Gold '97 Honda. The Store Manager had a cell phone photo of the Accord's rear license plate. The Officer radioed the suspect's description and the last direction of travel. A second officer located the Accord driving N/B Willow Ave. over SR-4 and did a traffic enforcement stop. The driver was a 61 year old female Transient; and the passenger was 58 year old male Transient. The male was found to be on probation for Grand Theft. Officers saw, in plain-view, several new unopened personal hygiene items lying on the rear passenger seat. Officers did a probation search of male and the vehicle. On the passenger floorboard, Officers found a garbage bag filled with more new unopened personal hygiene items and 4-packs of Red Bull. The items had Rite Aid tags on them. Both subjects were detained. The Rite Aid Store Manager responded, to the scene, for an infield show-up. Both subjects were positively identified and the Store Manager requested prosecution by signing a complainant's arrest forms. The subjects were arrested and later cited/released.

Vandalism: On July 9, 2019 at 11:56 a.m. An Officer was dispatched to Burger King, 836 Willow Ave. for a vandalism to drive-thru speaker box/sign. An unknown suspect removed a panel from the rear of the speaker box/sign and cut the wires disabling the speaker box. The vandalism occurred sometime between 6:00 a.m. and the time of call.

Vandalism: On July 9, 2019 at 1:40 p.m. an Officer was advised, by a Hercules High School maintenance worker, of a vandalism to the school's Football field. The Officer located spray paint damage to the home portion of the school's 50 yard line. The vandalism occurred sometime between yesterday and the time of call today.

Auto Burglary: On July 9, 2019 at 1:17 p.m. An Officer was dispatched to 1300 block of Sycamore Ave. for a suspicious circumstance. The reporting party stated she was at home and heard her front doorbell ring, but didn't see anyone outside. She also stated there was a vehicle parked outside her home with a broken window and a jacket lying on the ground. Officers located a Black '07 Dodge Charger parked in the 1300 block of Sycamore Ave. with

a shattered right rear passenger window. There was a black jacket lying on the grass below the shattered window. Officers were not able to make contact with the Charger's registered owner. An Officer took photos of the Charger and left his business card with the case number.

Felony Vehicle Stop: On July 10, 2019, at 5:12 a.m., dispatch received an Automated License Plate Reader Hit on a silver 2005 Honda Civic, on westbound I-80 at Hwy-4. The Honda was used as a getaway vehicle in an armed robbery that occurred in Antioch on July 9, 2019. The Traffic A Traffic Officer located the vehicle on the interchange at John Muir Parkway and trailed it to westbound I-80 at the Appian Way off ramp where he initiated a felony stop. The driver, a 26 year old female, of Pittsburg, was detained. She had an unrelated warrant for theft out of Antioch. Antioch P. D. arrived and took custody of the Honda. HPD transported the female to Martinez Detention Facility for the warrant.
