Possession of a Prohibited Weapon: On July 25, 2019, an Officer conducted a traffic stop on a blue 1993 Mercury. The 19 year old male driver reached for, and opened, the glove box and the officer saw what appeared to be a firearm inside. The firearm was determined to be an airsoft/BB type pistol. The subject was detained, cited, and released for the municipal code violation.

Stolen Vehicle: On July 25, 2019, at 1427 hours, an Officer was dispatched to the HPD lobby for a stolen vehicle report. The victim stated, sometime between 10:00pm on July 20, 2019 and the morning of July 21, 2019, someone stole his 1995 gold Ford Aerostar minivan which was parked in his driveway in the 300 block of Sparrow Drive.

Warrant Arrest: On July 25th 2019 at approximately 9:32PM a HPD Officer checked on an occupied gray 2005 Pontiac in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The 49 year old male occupant, of Oakland, was taken into custody, on four non-citable, warrants held by Solano and Alameda County. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest: On July 25th 201 at approximately 10:13PM a HPD Officer conducted a pedestrian stop on two subjects in the area of Pheasant Dr and Refugio Valle Road. One of the subjects, a 22 year old male of Hercules, was taken into custody on a no bail warrant held by Oakland PD. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest and Poss. of Controlled Substance: On July 26th 2019 at approximately 1:07AM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a black 2004 Nissan in the area of Willow Ave and Hawthorne Dr. The 44 year old male passenger, of Fremont, was taken into custody on a non-citable warrant held by Emeryville PD. He was also found to be in possession of a substance suspected to be a narcotic. He was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Possession. of a Controlled Substance and Probation Violation: On July 26th 2019 at approximately 1:10AM a HPD Officer conducted a pedestrian stop. The 35 year old male, of Rodeo, was determined to be on probation with a search clause. During the search, a substance, suspected to be a narcotic, was located on his person. He was cite/released at the scene.

Strong Arm Robbery: On July 26, 2019, at 6:25PM Hercules PD received a report of a robbery that just occurred in the 1900 block of Redwood Road. The adult female Victim stated she had just arrived home. She pulled into her garage and a male suspect, wearing dark clothing and a mask over his face, reached into her vehicle and removed her purse from the floor board. The suspect ran to a waiting vehicle which she described as a newer model Infiniti.

Outside Assist: On July 27, 2019, at approximately 03:42 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Willow Avenue for a 911 call of a male stating he had driven his vehicle off the road and was bleeding. The reporting party was disoriented and unable to provide an exact location. Officers searched the area of Willow Avenue and were unable to locate the male. Officers located the vehicle, in a ditch, on Franklin Canyon Road east of Claeys Ranch. The 73 year old male driver, of Fairfield, sustained minor lacerations above his left eye and was transported, by ambulance, to a hospital. CHP responded to the scene and took over the collision investigation.

Coroners Case: On July 28, 2019, at approximately 3:49pm, Officers responded to the 1100 block of Canterbury for a possible coroner's case. Rodeo/Hercules Fire Paramedics were already at the scene. Officers were advised 25 year old female was located, unconscious, by family members. The subject was pronounced deceased, by RHFD, at approximately 4:pm. Officers determined there were no indication of foul play and CCCSO Corner released the body to the family.

Warrant Arrest: On July 28, 2019 at approximately 10:19pm, an Officer was checking on a suspicious motorhome parked in the Home Depot parking lot. The Officer made contact with a 30 year old male, out of Bakersfield. The subject had an outstanding \$125,000 felony warrant, out of Kern County. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest: While on the above mentioned call the subject stated the motorhome was occupied by his wife and two children. Officers made contact with a 28 year old female, out of Bakersfield, who had an outstanding \$53,000 felony warrant, out of Kern County. The female was taken into custody. Officers located two female children ages 1 and 2 years old, asleep inside the motorhome. California Family Services (CFS) was contacted and responded. CFS took custody of both children. The female was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Misdemeanor Evading of a Peace Officer: On July 29, 2019, at approximately 2:1am, an Officer attempted to make a traffic stop on a gray 2010 Dodge Charger, for a traffic violation, in the area of Sycamore Ave. at Refugio Valley Rd. As the Officer was approaching the vehicle the vehicle sped off at a high rate of speed, down Refugio Valley Rd. A pursuit was initiated and the vehicle continued down Refugio Valley Rd. and into the Country Run neighborhood. The vehicle came to a stop on its own. The 16 year old male driver, and sole occupant, was taken into custody. The juvenile was from American Canyon. The investigation determined the subject was driving his mother's vehicle, without permission. The subject was cite and released to his parents.
