FREE Movie: Refugio Valley Park



Planning Commission – Two (2) Vacancies with terms ending December 2021

The Planning Commission meets the first and third Mondays of every month at 7 p.m. The Commission is advisory to the Council and has statutory duties imposed by State law. The Commission:

- Performs all functions assigned to it by the zoning and design review ordinances of the City.
- Reviews and makes recommendations to the Council on the general plan, specific neighborhood plans, tentative subdivision maps, environmental impact reports, and planned unit developments.
- Reviews the capital improvements program and makes recommendations to the Council.
- Provides design review of proposed buildings and other construction projects and reviews landscape plans.
- Grants use permits and variances.

Finance Commission – Two (2) Vacancies with terms ending December 2021, One (1) Vacancy with an unexpired term ending December 31, 2020

The Finance Commission meets the bi-monthly on the third Wednesday at 7 p.m. The Commission is advisory to the Council and has the following duties:

- Quarterly review of City's financial status; review and comment on audit reports, the proposed operating budget and the capital improvement program budgets.
- Makes recommendations to the Council with respect to budget priorities.
- Advises the Council on matters of policy and public interest related to the management of the City's finances and budget.
- Serves as the Oversight Committee for Measure "A," including providing an annual report, to ensure that utility user tax funds are spent in accordance with the voter approved measure adopted in June 2013.
- Serves as the Oversight Committee for Measure "O," including providing an annual report, to ensure that the sales tax revenues approved by Hercules voters are spent in accordance with the voter approved measure adopted in June 2012.

Community & Library Services Commission – One (1) vacancy with a term ending December 2021, one (1) Student Commissioner with a term ending December 2021.

The Community and Library Services Commission meets on the second Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the Hercules City Council Chambers located at 111 Civic Drive, Hercules, CA 94547. The Commission is advisory to the Council and has the following duties:

- Develop plans and recommendations for parks, playgrounds, recreational facilities, and use of community buildings.
- Work with the Parks and Recreation Department on the development and evaluation of recreation programs and community activities/events.
- Provide assistance and support in the planning and operation of City sponsored community events.
- In cooperation and consultation with the Parks and Recreation Department, make recommendations to the City Council with respect to priorities for recreation, library, and community services expenditures in the City's capital improvement program.
- Review and comment on the annual operating and capital improvement budgets for the Parks and Recreation Department.
- Make recommendations with respect to community service needs such as child care, youth summer employment, senior activities/programs, and recreational programs.
- Review and make recommendations with respect to fees for the use of parks, playgrounds, recreational facilities, and community buildings.
- Advise on matters of policy and public interest related to the management, use and preservation of library facilities and property.
- Render such other specific services as are consistent with the role of an advisory board on the library system, to include recommendations and advice to the county librarian on matters related to the Hercules library.
- The Commission member serving as the City's Area Representative to the Contra Costa County Library Commission shall routinely report to the entire Community and Library Services Commission on actions taken at the Contra Costa Library Commission meetings.
- Review and make recommendations regarding the Arts in Public Places Program and exhibits at the Hercules Public Library.
- Oversee the Heritage Memorial Garden Plaque Program which is designed to recognize Hercules residents or civic leaders and enhance the historical aspect of the garden.
- Oversee the Library Art Exhibition Program which is designed to review art pieces submitted by participants of the program to be allowed to display their art pieces at the Hercules Public Library.
- Such other duties relating to recreation activities and community and library service needs as may be directed by the City Council.

Planning Division

Sycamore Crossing Public Hearing before City Council 9/10/2019

The Planning Commission recommended approval of the Sycamore Crossing project and will now be considered for their final approval by the City Council at a public hearing next week on 9/10/2019 at 7:00pm in City Council Chambers. The project is located on the southwest corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenues adjacent to Tsushima Avenue (known as the Sycamore Crossing site). The project includes the following proposed land uses:

- 13,111 square foot CVS Pharmacy with drive thru
- 4-story Hampton Inn Suites with 101 hotel rooms
- 12,000 square feet of retail/restaurant uses
- 4,400 square foot pad with drive thru
- 120 multi-family condominium units

The staff report for this project will be posted on the City website under the 9/10/2019 City Council Agenda by 9/5/2019 include the latest Design Drawings. Hard copies of the plans are also available for review at City offices Monday through Thursday from 8am-5pm.





Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. At this time the Street Sign Replacement Project is approximately 75% completed, with the remaining signs received at the Maintenance Yard. Over 30 lifted sidewalks have been identified and are being scheduled for repair. Staff is moving forward on replacing the streetlights in Lighting and Landscaping District 83-2, Zones 1 “Hercules By The Bay” and 2 “The Heights”. They will be replaced in 2 phases. The City has received 25 lights and secured a contractor for Phase 1. Phase 2 will replace 160 streetlights and is out to bid with Council award anticipated for September 24.

Engineering

The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is nearing completion, with an anticipated final completion date of November 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, power and gas services provided by PG&E were delayed. The cost impact of this delay is being assessed. The design plans are under final review for the public improvements for the future Safeway, located at the southeast corner of San Pablo and Sycamore Avenue. The grading/demolition plan was issued and the contractor is on site working. The design for the public improvements for the Bayfront Project were approved for Blocks Q&R and are under review for Blocks M,O, & P. The design plans are also under review for the Willow Center, Sycamore Crossing, and the Hilltown project. Design is underway for the mile long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant, computer flow modeling continues for the City’s backbone sewer system, as is the financial study for the sewer fund. The 2019 Street Rehabilitation Project on Pheasant Drive is underway. The contractor for the Hercules Traffic Calming Project is waiting for the fabrication of the bollards and can begin once he receives them. The Willow/Palm sidewalk project is under design with an anticipated construction date of next summer.

From there it appears the suspect moved to the front porch where they smashed a small window and reached in to unlock the door. The alarm likely scared off the suspect who managed to open an Amazon package in the kitchen before leaving. It does not appear anything was taken.

Possession of Controlled Substance: On September 3, 2019, at about 10:03 am, an Officer checked on a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot of Home Depot. The Occupant, a 43 year old female subject gave consent for the Officer to search the vehicle. While searching the vehicle, a second subject, a 57 year old male walked up to the Officers after leaving Home Depot. An Officer asked him if he had any controlled substances on him because he recognized him and remembered he was possession of a controlled substance. He admitted to having a small amount of Methamphetamine in his pocket. He was subsequently arrested for Possession of a controlled substance, issued a citation, and released from the scene.

MSIN: On September 3, 2019, at about 11:08 am, a detective pulled a case for a miscellaneous investigation.

Residential Burglary: On September 3, 2019, at approximately 12:59 pm, Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 700 block of Turquoise Drive for a cold residential burglary. Officers arrived and determined the homeowner left the residence at approximately 11:30 am, and returned home around 12:45 pm. Upon their arrival, they found the house ransacked. After looking at the homeowner's surveillance video, a gray, newer model, Infiniti four door, pulled up in front of the house at 12:18 pm, and two male suspects dressed in dark clothing got out of the car and went around to the back of the residence. One suspect remained in the car. The two suspects came back into view from the rear of the residence approximately 20 minutes later carrying unknown items. They got into the Infiniti and drove away. The video surveillance system was viewed however, the quality was poor and the license plate was not legible. The point of entry was a pried rear sliding door, and the loss was approximately \$60,000.00 in cash and two passports. The scene was processed for evidence and will be sent to the lab for further analysis.
