WATCH COMMANDER'S SHIFT REPORT

Warrant/Possession of Narcotics: On September 26, 2019, at 09:31 AM, Officers were dispatched to Rite Aid for two female petty theft suspects detained by the manager. The suspects then left and one of them was located inside Lucky. The 29 year old female subject had an outstanding, no/cite warrant, out of Contra Costa County. She was arrested. She also had some white powder, suspected to be a narcotic, and paraphernalia in her possession. Narcotic charges were added. The other 32 year old female was located and detained, minutes later, inside Big Lots. Rite Aid was contacted and did not want to press charges for theft. The 32 year old was released and the 29 year old was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Prisoner Transport: On September 26, 2019, at 12:05 PM, an officer took custody of an adult male, at the Santa Rita Detention Facility, and transported him to the Martinez Detention Facility. The subject had a warrant originating from Hercules Case

BobCop/Grand Theft: On September 26, 2019, at 12:02 PM, a Concord resident reported a catalytic converter theft from her 2007 Honda Element while it was parked at the 800 Willow Park n Ride. This occurred on September 25, 2019 from 06:45 AM – 14:30 PM.

Assault: On September 26, 2019, at 13:27 PM, an adult male, living in the 100 block of Watermark Terrace called and stated his brother 27 year old brother hit their mother on the back of the head with his hand. The caller did not see this occur. The mother reportedly called out for her son to help but he was locked out of the house. When the Police arrived the 27 year old was reportedly inside, but not answering the phone or verbal commands. The mother was not on scene and told the reporting party, on the phone, that she does not want to press charges. Entry was not made into the home.

Vandalism: On September 26, 2019 at 17:48 PM, a resident from the Hidden Cove reported damage to his 2017 Audi A6. He believes someone threw rocks at his vehicle for no reason.

Missing Person Located: On September 27, 2019 at 08:24 AM, an officer checked on a suspicious vehicle at the 76 Station. Officers contacted a 45 year old male, and a 33 year old female. The female had been reported as a missing person to Vacaville PD on August 20, 2019.. She was a voluntary missing adult in good health and in no danger. Her name was removed from the Missing and Unidentified Persons System.

Appropriation of Lost Property: On September 27, 2019 at 09:25 AM, officers were dispatched to Shell gas for a theft involving suspects in a blue Dodge Durango. A 39 year old male, and 42 year old female, were contacted parked in the lot. Shell asked the female be banned from the property, after she admitted to stealing. A probable cause search was conducted and a wallet was located with property belonging to subject of El Sobrante. The male was cite released for Appropriation of Lost Property.

Robbery/Assault: On September 27, 2019 at 18:12 PM, officers were dispatched to a theft from Lucky store with an assault. The suspect was described as a African American adult female; wearing a white shirt, and maroon sweat pants. She attempted to steal over \$800 of liquor. She threw two bottles at the manager during a struggle over the cart. The bottles broke and one of them cut an elderly female, nearby, who later declined medical. The suspect left the cart, grabbed two 12-packs of beer, and proceeded to run across the lot to Rite Aid. A getaway driver, in a red Mazda 3, picked her up. The vehicle was last seen driving east on Sycamore towards Refugio Valley Road.

Possession of a controlled substance: On September 28, 2019, at approximately 10:09AM, an HPD officer checked on an occupied suspicious silver 2003 BMW sedan parked in the 1500 block of Partridge Drive. The 36 year old female driver was found to be on active searchable probation out of Contra Costa County. During a probation search, an officer located a substance, believed to be a narcotic, inside of a black pouch attached to the female's car key lanyard. The female was cited and released at the scene.

Possession of burglary tools/Probation violation: During the above investigation the 39 year old female passenger was also found to be on active searchable probation out of Contra Costa County. During the probation search, an officer located a set of shaved keys in the front passenger seat area where the subject was seated. This subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Attempted Residential Burglary: On September 28, 2019 at approximately 12:11AM, an officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Beechnut Drive for a cold report of a residential burglary. The reporting party said on September 27, 2019, at approximately 10:30PM, her home alarm went off and the point of activation was the side garage door. She checked her side garage door and noticed the door was ajar and the inside door knob was loose. There was minor damage to the rubber door seal of the door.

Auto Burglary: On September 28, 2019 at approximately 8:30 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 1900 block of Railroad Avenue for a report of an auto burglary. The reporting party stated sometime between 7:30 pm and 8:30 pm an unknown suspect(s) shattered the front passenger window of his vehicle (2002 Silver Lexus 430). The suspect(s) stole a backpack.

Possession of controlled a substance & paraphernalia: On September 28, 2019 at approximately 9:28 pm, an Officer checked on an occupied suspicious vehicle (2002 Pontiac GT) parked to the rear of 844 Willow Avenue. During the contact, 45 year old male, of San Francisco, was found to be on probation for burglary. A probation search revealed the subject was in possession of a substance, believed to be a narcotic. The subject was cite/released at the scene.

Driving Under the Influence: On September 29, 2019 at approximately 2:54 am, an Officer conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle (2008 Ford F150) for DUI indicators. The 32 year old female driver, of Rodeo, displayed the objective signs of intoxication. The subject was given the Standard Field Sobriety Test and refused to submit to a test with the Preliminary Alcohol Screening device. The subject was arrested and transported to HPD for a blood draw. She was then transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Hit and Run Collision: On September 29, 2019, at approximately 4:55 pm, an Officer was dispatched to San Pablo Avenue and Hercules Avenue for a hit and run collision. The suspect vehicle was a blue Toyota Highlander, and the victim vehicle was a gray vehicle

unknown make and model. At the time all HPD Officers were tied up with a large tree blocking San Pablo Avenue in both directions. One Officer located the suspect vehicle, a 2006, Blue, Toyota Highlander, on Woodfield, which was pointed out by a witness. The suspect, A Hispanic male in his 50's was last seen walking up Hercules Avenue. The victim later flagged down an Officer, and related she was driving a 2016 Mazda and was stopped facing North bound San Pablo Avenue She was about to turn west onto Hercules Avenue when the suspect vehicle backed into her vehicle. The suspect vehicle then turned west down Hercules Avenue and never stopped. The suspect got out of his vehicle and walked out of view east on Hercules Avenue. The victim and witness are able to identify the suspect.

Downed Tree crossing San Pablo Avenue: On September 29, 2019, at approximately 4:43pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to a down tree blocking both directions of San Pablo Avenue near Hercules Avenue. A large Eucalyptus tree fell down, and was blocking all lanes of traffic on the northbound and southbound direction of San Pablo Avenue. Public Works was called out, and worked for several hours to clear the roadway.
