Located Missing Person On September 19th 2019 approximately 10:24PM a HPD Officer contacted a 19 year old female passenger during a traffic enforcement stop. She was listed as a as a voluntary missing adult from 2018. She was removed from MUPS after a welfare check.

Possession of a controlled substance for sales and Possession. of stolen property: On September 20th 2019 at approximately 2:20AM a HPD Officer checked on a suspicious blue VW in the 800 block of Willow. The vehicle displayed license plates that were reported lost/stolen and the VIN did the match the plates. The 39 year old male driver was contacted. He advised Officers there was a gun in the vehicle. The subject was detained. A black pistol was located in the front passenger seat area. The pistol was determined to a replica firearm. The vehicle belonged to the male, but the plates did not. A substance, suspected a narcotic; a digital scale; and multiple unused plastic baggies; were discovered in a container in the trunk. The male was placed under arrested. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Petty Theft/Identity Theft/Possession of Stolen Property: On September 19, 2019, at approximately 12:24 pm, officers were dispatched to Rite Aid located at 1560 Sycamore Avenue regarding a theft that just occurred. The suspect was described as a female wearing a black tank top; and she stole a bag filled with merchandise. The suspect fled in a grey Mercedes SUV last seen on Turquoise Drive. An officer located the vehicle and conducted a stop on the Mercedes. The 38 year old female driver matched the description of the suspect. An adult male passenger was also detained. The female spontaneously told an officer the items she stole were in her back pocket (Rite aid eyelashes were located in her back pocket). The female was positively identified during the infield show up. The female was arrested for shoplifting. The Rite Aid manager the merchandise stolen included soap, shampoo, baby oil, earrings, eyelashes, and shaving razor. The stolen items were located in the rear of the Mercedes during an inventory search. During the search, an officer discovered the female had possession of multiple ID cards and debit cards not belonging to her. There was also numerous laundry detergent, and soap which appeared to be brand new merchandise from another unknown store. The male was released at the scene. The female was cited and released.

Petty Theft of Mail/Check Fraud: On September 20, 2019 at approximately 2:22pm, an officer took a phone report regarding a theft of mail from the 100 block of Paradise Drive. Sometime between September 16, 2019 and September 17, 2019, an unknown suspect stole her mail and cashed her social security check.

Lost/Stolen Plate On September 20th 2019 at approximately 7:35Pm a HPD Officer was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block Starling Way for a lost or stolen plate. The

reporting party stated the front plate from his silver 2018 Dodge Ram pickup was either lost or stolen somewhere between Martinez and Hercules. The plate was entered into the Stolen Vehicle System.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On September 21st 2019 at approximately 2:14AM HPD Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Hawk Ct for a 911 disconnect with a disturbance heard in the background.

Officers contacted 19 year old female and a 21 year old male, of Marin. The male attempted to walk away from Officers and he was detained. It was determined that both subjects were at a party and had left. The male left his phone, at the party, and returned in an attempt to retrieve it. The resident of the house denied know where the phone was and a dispute started. During the dispute, a resident punched the female on her right shoulder. Neither subject knew the identities of anyone inside the house and did not desire prosecution. No injuries were sustained and medical was declined. Both subjects left the area.

Custody Violation: On September 21, 2019 at 10:49 AM, a father came to the lobby to report his ex-wife was in violation of their court custody order. Both subjects made conflicting statements. No arrest were made. The report will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office.

Stolen Plate: On 9-21-19 at 1031 AM, a resident from the 100 block of Coventry reported a stolen rear plate from her Acura TL. The incident occurred sometime after 0900 AM on September 20, 2019.

Auto Burglary: On September 21, 2019 at approximately 9:02 pm, an officer was dispatched to the Home Depot 1625 Sycamore Ave. for the report of an auto burglary. A Pinole resident stated that his 1999 Gray Chevy Truck was broken into and a table for a table saw was stolen.

Warrant Arrest: On September 22, 2019 at 3:58 am, and Officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop on a 98 Lincoln California Plate, for a vehicle code violation. The adult male driver, of Vallejo, was determined to have two outstanding warrants f out of Contra Costa County. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest: On September 22, 2019, at approximately 9:23 am, an Officer stopped a black, Honda Accord, on Willow Avenue, for an equipment violation. The 21 year old female front passenger, from Milpitas, had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant out of San Jose Police Department. The warrant was a cite only warrant. The subject was issued a citation, and released from the scene.

Collision: On September 23, 2019, at 5:33 a.m., 31 year was driving his 2006 Nissan Altima. He was a 1/8 of a mile west of the Hwy-4 overcrossing when he lost control, spun out, and high sided onto the BNSF train tracks. BNSF was notified and stopped the trains.
