Residential Burglary: On November 26, 2019, at approximately 11:25 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Rock Harbor for a possible residential burglary in progress. The resident said someone was attempting to enter her home. The resident had left the house, and was outside with a neighbor. Officers arrived, and cleared the residence. The downstairs window on the south side of the residence was open, and the blinds were pushed to the side. There was no apparent loss at the residence, most likely due to the resident screaming and running around the house.

Shoplifting: On November 26, 2019, at approximately 12:58 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Home Depot for a shoplifting suspect in custody. Officers arrived and contacted, a 60 year old male in the loss prevention office. The male attempted to steal over \$600 worth of merchandise, from Home Depot, and was detained by loss prevention. The subject was issued a citation, and released.

Domestic Battery: On November 26, 2019, at approximately 1:00 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 1300 block of Sycamore Avenue for the report of a physical altercation. Officers contacted a 33 year old female, and her 8 year old daughter. In front of the apartment complex. The female claimed she was struck by the 40 year old father of her child. The incident occurred during the exchange of their child. The father left the scene and reportedly went back into the apartment. The witness account indicated both parties were hitting each other. Officers attempted to contact the male, by phone, but there was no answer. A case was taken

Warrant Arrest: On November 26, 2019, at approximately 1:28 pm, an Officer stopped a 2000 Chrysler, on Willow Avenue under highway 80 for an equipment violation. A 34 year old female occupant, of the vehicle, had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant. She was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Domestic Battery: On November 27, 2019, at approximately 8:10 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Jack in the Box for a male and female fighting. Officers contacted a 26 year old male and a 29 year old male, in front of Jack in the Box. Both parties said nothing physical happened; however, an independent witness said the subjects were physically fighting. Both parties had injuries. The male was determined to be the dominant aggressor, and was arrested. The female did not want to press charges, and did not want an Emergency Protective Order. The male was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Court Order Violation: On November 27, 2019, at approximately 10:01 am, an Officer was dispatched to 100 Watermark Terrace for a court order violation. The Officer contacted a 66 year old female, who stated another female had contacted her in violation of a court order.

The reporting party provided the court order which stated the other person was not to contact the reporting party directly or indirectly.

Medical Assist: On November 28, 2019 at approximately 7:42 pm, Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Lilac Cir. To assist fire with a report of three unconscious subjects in the front yard. Officers, along with RHF, located three unresponsive male subjects (45, 27, and 26) laying in the driveway of the residence. All of the subjects appeared to be suffering from a drug overdose. Officers, and fire personal, began administering first aid and doses of Narcan to each of the subjects. After a short while all three subjects began showing signs of consciousness, and were transported to local hospitals.

Resisting or Delaying a Peace Officer: On November 29, 2019 at approximately 11:35pm, Officers were dispatched to Lucky Market, located at 1590 Sycamore Ave, for a report of a theft in progress. The reporting party stated six male suspects had stolen alcohol and were last seen towards Refugio Valley Rd. Officers located four suspects, running up Pheasant Dr, matching description provided. Three of subjects were 17; 15; and 14 year old juvenile males. During the contact the 14 year old began pulling away and resisting. He was eventually detained and placed under arrest for Resisting and Delaying. The theft was unable to be confirmed and the stolen property was not located. All subjects were released to parents and The 14 year old was cite released to a guardian.

Petty Theft: On November 30, 2019, at 12:10 p.m., a citizen from the 300 block of Shipwatch Lane called to report a theft of a package from her front porch. The incident occurred on November 29, 2019 at 4:10 p.m. The citizen checked the front porch on November 29, 2019 at 5:10 p.m., and the packages were gone.

Driving Under the Influence/Collision: On November 30, 2019 at approximately 9:18pm Officers were dispatched to the area of John Muir Parkway at Alfred Nobel Dr. for a report of a hit and run collision. The reporting party stated a grey Dodge Challenger hit a tree and continued driving down John Muir Parkway. Officers found a tree located at the intersection on John Muir Parkway; and what appeared to be a sheared off EBMUD water valve. Officers located the disabled vehicle in the 1100 block of Taraya Terrace. The 30 year old female driver, of the vehicle, was contacted. She displayed objective signs of alcohol intoxication. She was administered the Standard Field Coordination Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated she was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. The subject was placed under arrest and later cite released to a responsible party.

Solo Vehicle Collision: On December 1, 2019, at approximately 10:36 am, HPD officers were dispatched to the area of Willow Avenue at the Highway 80 off-ramp for a collision. Officers located a 2009, Nissan Sentra, facing east bound in the west bound traffic lane. The 75 year old female driver, was still seated in the car. She was exiting from the Highway 4/80 interchange Loop, onto Willow, and lost control of the vehicle. The vehicle rolled over, and landed on its wheels. The driver had minor injuries and was transported to a hospital.

Domestic Battery: On December 1, 2019, at approximately 4:26 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of Pheasant Drive and Starling Way for the report of a female being followed by a male. The reporting party said the two subjects were verbally arguing and they did not want anyone to get hurt. Officers contacted a 19 year old female, of Richmond, and a 26 year old male of Richmond, in the 1880 block of Pheasant Drive. It was determined they were driving and they got into an argument. The female hit the male, with an open hand, on the left side of his face. The male had bruising on his left cheek area. The female was placed under arrest. The male did not want to press charges, want an EPO. The female was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Towed Vehicle/Found Property: On December 2, 2019, at approximately 9:14 am, an Officer stopped a silver Mercedes s500 sedan with no plates on it in the parking lot of Shell Gas Station located at 3900 San Pablo Avenue. There was a paper plate on the rear of the vehicle. As the Officer contacted the 32 year old driver, of Concord, he noticed a license plate on the rear floor board inside the vehicle. The license plate on the rear floor board came back to a 2007 Acura and showed the plate registered to a female. The driver said he purchased the vehicle on Offer up and the license plate was in the vehicle when he bought it. There was also a license plate attached, to the rear of the vehicle, under the paper license plate. The "hard" plate came back to another vehicle, out of Emeryville, registered to another female. The vehicle was towed for having a license plate on the vehicle which did not belong to the vehicle. During an inventory search of the vehicle a third license plate, belonging to a third vehicle, was also located in the trunk of the vehicle. The driver had no proof of ownership and said he did not know anything about the license plates. The Officer was not able to make contact with the owner of the car or any of the plates. The subject was released and the vehicle was towed. All the plates were booked into evidence, to be returned to DMV.

Possession of Controlled Substance: On December 2, 2019, at approximately 11:38 am, an Officer stopped a 2014, Nissan Altima, in the parking lot of 3600 San Pablo Avenue, for an equipment violation. The officer contacted the 55 year old driver. As the Officer was talking to the driver the Officer observed what appeared to be a narcotic substance, in a glass vial, in his open shirt pocket. During a probable cause search the Officer located a glass pipe used for smoking Narcotics. The subject was arrested, issued a citation, and released.
