**Recovered Stolen Vehicle:** On December 12, 2019 at 4:26 p.m. An Officer checked on a suspicious unoccupied Blue '95 Nissan pick-up truck parked on the shoulder of the E/B I-80 off-ramp (Loop) near Willow Ave. A license plate inquiry revealed the vehicle to be an outstanding stolen vehicle reported to CHP-Contra Costa December 12, 2019. The pick-up truck was stolen from the 300 block of Napa Ave. in Rodeo.

**Theft of License Plate:** On December 12, 2019, at approximately 9:18 pm, an officer was dispatched to the HPD lobby for a license plate theft report. A Hercules resident stated an unknown suspect stole the rear license plate of her 2013 Dodge Avenger. The theft occurred between December 11, 2019, at 11: am, and the time of call.

**Possession of Controlled Substance & Paraphernalia:** On December 12, 2019, at approximately 9:44 pm, an officer conducted a traffic stop, of a Bicycle, in the 2000 block of Refugio Valley Road. The Officer contacted 51 year old male, of Hercules. The subject admitted being in possession of suspected narcotics. During a subsequent probable cause search, the officer located suspected narcotics and a glass pipe on the subject. He was cited & released at the scene.

**Stolen License Plates:** On December 13, 2019 at 10:40 a.m. An Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take a report for a theft of license plates. The resident of the 100 block of Paradise Dr. stated an unknown suspect stole both her license plates off of her Black '17 Hyundai Sonata while it was parked in her assigned carport.

**Stolen Vehicle:** On December 13, 2019 at 1:58 p.m. An Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take a stolen vehicle report. The Fresno resident said she recently met a 20 year old male, of Richmond, via Facebook/Instagram. She drove from Fresno, to Hercules, on December 11, 2019, and met the male at an apartment in the 100 block of Paradise. The victim and suspect smoked some Marijuana and she allowed him to take her Camry to go to the store. The male never returned with her Camry and she is unable to contact him.

**Possession of Burglary Tools/Possession of a Switchblade Knife/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia – Warrant Arrest:** On December 14, 2019 at 7:26 a.m. an Officer did a traffic stop on a Gold '97 Toyota Camry (Rear dealer paper plate) in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. for no plates. The 41 year old male driver was from Vallejo. A 30 year old passenger was from Benicia. The driver did not have a driver's license. The passenger was on Misdemeanor Probation, with a search clause, out of Solano County. The Officer saw a switchblade knife, underneath where the driver had been seated, as the driver was being taken out of the vehicle. A glass pipe, commonly used to smoke narcotics, was found underneath the driver's seat as well. An inventory search of the Camry was done and the following was found: A Milwaukee sawzall saw with battery pack (found on the front passenger floorboard), gloves, large floodlight flashlight, small hand tools, and two freshly cut catalytic converters (found in trunk). Both males were arrested and transported to HPD. Both

subjects were later cited and released. A second 37 year old female passenger was determined to have a warrant out of Contra Costa County. She was cited and released.

**Battery:** On December 14, 2019 at approximately 8:00pm, Officers were dispatched to the 400 block of Turquoise Dr. for a family disturbance. Officers contacted a 56 year old female, out of Richmond. The subject had been in some type of altercation with her family members and they were requesting she leave the residence. The subject does not live at the residence and was only visiting. The subject gathered her property and left the area without incident. She later called and requested to press charges against her family members for a battery she alleged took place prior to Officers arriving.
