## WATCH COMMANDER'S SHIFT REPORT

**Voluntarily Missing Person:** On January 9, 2020 at approximately 4:54 PM an Officer met with a Hercules a resident, in regards to his adult daughter being missing. She was supposed to return home after being released from a hospital, but did not return and did not contact her parents.

**Possession of a Controlled Substance:** On January 9<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 9:59PM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a black 2003 Toyota Camry. The license plate attached to the vehicle belonged to a 2005 Toyota; and the plate had been reported stolen to Richmond PD earlier in the day. The 38 year old male driver of Antioch advised he bought the car from, a tow yard, a few weeks ago with the plate already attached. He was found to be in possession of a substance, believed to be a narcotic. He was cite/released at the scene.

**Possession of a stolen vehicle/Possession of Burglary Tools/Possession of a controlled substance/Towed Vehicle:** On January 10, 2020 at 8:42 a.m. An Officer was doing a security check of Home Depot parking lot. He saw an unoccupied Gray Audi A5 parked near the contractor's entrance. The Officer ran the front license plate and saw it returned to a '05 Audi registered out of Oakland. The Officer observed the A5 appeared to be a newer model and checked the VIN on the vehicle. The VIN, on the vehicle, didn't match the VIN assigned to the '05 Audi's license plate number. The Officer was approached by three subjects who said they were associated with the A5. The three subjects were a 28 year old male, of Vallejo; a 24 year old male, of Richmond; and a 23 year old female, of Richmond. The 28 year old male said teh A5 was his girlfriend's car. He admitted to being on Probation out of Solano County. The 24 year old male was on searchable probation out of Sonoma County. The female was on searchable probation out of Contra Costa County. The VIN, on the vehicle, came back to a stolen vehicle reported to San Bruno P.D on September 24, 2019. All three subjects were detained. The A5's key fob was found in 28 year old male's possession. The Officer searched the interior of the A5 and located substance, suspected to be a narcotic, in a cigarette box in the driver's door pocket; and two improvised shaved keys near the driver's seat. The female placed the 28 year old as the driver of the A5. The 23 year old male, and the female, were released pending further investigation. The 28 year old was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Hit and Run vehicle collision:** On January 10, 2020 at 10:27 a.m. An Officer was dispatched to 500 Alfred Nobel Dr. to take a report for a late reported hit and run vehicle collision. The reporting party said an unknown suspect, driving a White 4DR sedan, rear ended her Blue Lexus RX300 on San Pablo Ave. at Sycamore Ave.

**Possession of a controlled substance:** On January 10, 2020 at 12:29 p.m. An Officer did a pedestrian stop in the area of Home Depot, 1625 Sycamore Ave. The Officer contacted a

46 year old male, of San Leandro; and a 34 year old female, of Hercules. The male admitted to being on searchable probation out of Solano County. The male admitted to possessing a controlled substance. The Officer detained the subject and conducted a probable cause search. A substance, suspected a narcotic, was located in the subject's possession. The subject was arrested and later cited and released.

**Non-Injury vehicle collision/Unlicensed Driver:** On January 10, 2020 at 1:44 p.m. An Officer was dispatched to the area of San Pablo Ave. at Victoria Crescent West for a report of a solo vehicle collision. The reporting party stated a Gold 4DR sedan had driven off the roadway. The Officer located the Toyota, off the roadway, on Victoria Crescent West east of Regatta Point. The Prius had collided with the north curb of Victoria Crescent West before colliding head on with a small tree. The Prius ended up high centered on the tree across the adjacent sidewalk. The 18 year old male driver, of Richmond told the Officer he was "distracted", and "zoned out", while listening to music before the collision occurred. The subject was found to be unlicensed - none issued. He was cited and released.

**Warrant Arrest:** On January 11, 2020 at 8:21 a.m. Hercules Officers went to the 100 block of Dunham Ct. to serve an outstanding Felony Warrant. Officers arrested a 65 year old male, of Hercules. The Warrant was Pinole P.D. case and was issued on December 30, 2019. with a bail amount of \$50,000. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Grand Theft - Catalytic Converter:** On January 11, 2020 at 10:22 a.m. An Officer was dispatched to a phone detail to take a report for a catalytic converter theft that occurred between 4:00 p.m. on December 28, 2019, and 11:00 a.m. on December 29, 2019. The resident, from the 200 block of Apollo, attempted to report the theft online at the end of the month, but was unsuccessful. An unknown suspect cut the catalytic converter from his '06 Beige Toyota Prius while it was parked on the corner of Titan Way at Hercules Ave.

**Occupied stolen vehicle / felony evading / possession of a controlled substance / probation violation:** On January 11, 2020 at approximately 10:27pm, Officers were advised of an Automated License Plate Reader hit for a stolen vehicle EB I80 at Appian Way. The vehicle was a white 2013 Toyota Rav 4, reported to Benicia PD on January 9, 2020. An Officer located the suspect vehicle on Willow Ave and followed it on WB I80. The suspect vehicle exited onto Pinole Valley Rd. and began traveling towards downtown Pinole. Once there were sufficient units the lead car activated its emergency lights to affect a traffic stop. The suspect vehicle fled at a high rate of speed. Officers pursued the suspect vehicle down San Pablo Ave. while Pinole PD assisted by blocking traffic at large intersections. The suspect vehicle attempted to pass a civilian vehicle by driving up onto the center island, but ended up side swiping the vehicle. This caused the air bags in the suspect vehicle to deploy and the vehicle came to a stop near Sunnyview Dr. The solo 39 year old male occupant was taken into custody. The subject was found to have two active warrants, for his arrest, and is on felony county probation for Auto Theft. The subject was medically cleared and then booked into the Martinez Detention Facility. No injuries were sustained as a result of the collision.

**Identity Theft:** On January 12, 2020, at approximately 10:23 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to US Bank inside of Lucky at 1590 Sycamore Avenue for a fraud in progress. A female adult was inside the bank using a fake ID and attempting to withdraw \$1,100.00 from a bank account. The staff were familiar with the female, and said she has done this in other branches in the area. Officers arrived and contacted the 36 year old female. The subject was detained, and determined to have multiple CA identification cards in her possession using different names. While speaking to the subject she stated she was having a hard time breathing, and paramedics were called to check her health. The subject was placed under

arrest, and transported by AMR to the County Regional Medical Center, for medical reasons. The subject was on probation, in Stanislaus County, for Identity theft, and in Santa Clara County for giving a false name of a real person. The Officer followed AMR, and stayed with until it was determined the subject was going to be there for several hours. The subject was released pending further investigation.

**Prisoner Pick-Up:** On January 12, 2020, an Officer drove to San Mateo County Jail to pick up a 39 year old male, who was being held on a Hercules Case. The subject was transported to MDF and booked.

**Identity Theft:** On January 12, 2020, at approximately 11:39 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Bobolink for an identity theft. The reporting put an outgoing check addressed to PG&E in his unlocked mailbox at the curb on December 26, 2019. On January 12, 2020 the subject was checking his bank statement and found the check he wrote to PG&E was cashed on January 6, and the payee name was changed to an unreadable name.

**Collision:** On January 12, 2020, at approximately 1:17 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of Pheasant and Starling for a vehicle collision with airbag deployment. Officers arrived and determined a 40 year old male was driving a 2016 Ford Mustang, westbound on Starling and lost control of the vehicle, and struck two parked cars. There were no injuries.

**Theft of Catalytic Converter:** On January 12, 2020, at approximately 3:59 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Glenwood for the report of a theft of a catalytic converter. Sometime between January 1, at 4:00 pm, and January 12 at 3:45 pm, an unknown suspect stole the catalytic converter out of a 2008 Toyota Prius, which was parked in a parking stall near the apartment.
