Prisoner Pick-Up: On January 28, 2020, a Parking Enforcement Officer drove to San Mateo County Jail to pick up a 51 year old male who was being held on a Hercules warrant. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Forgery: On January 28, 2020, at approximately 11:22 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 1400 block of Partridge for a forgery. The reporting party said she ordered personal checks in early January, and they were reportedly delivered to her residence on January 13, but she never received them. Today she checked her bank account, online, and learned one of her missing checks had been cashed.

Residential Burglary: On January 28, 2020, at approximately 11:46 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of White Cap Cove for an audible alarm. Officers arrived and found the front door open. The rear sliding glass door was shattered and the house was ransacked. At this time the loss is unknown, and pending.

Sometime between December 3, 2019, and today's date an expensive Stainless Steel Watch went missing from a house in the 100 block of Sunflower Court. The son was able to provide the serial number, and the watch was entered into Automated Property System.
