Found Property: On March 11, 2020, at approximately 4:48 PM, an Officer took a case for a found backpack in the 100 block of Iris Road.

Domestic Violence: On March 11, 2020, at approximately 6:12 PM, Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Valley Run for a domestic disturbance. It was determined that the victim was punched several times by her boyfriend who fled the scene prior to Officer's arrival. The suspect was not located. A case was taken and will be forwarded to the DA's office for review.

MSIN (fire): On March 11, 2020, at approximately 7:05 PM, Officers were dispatched to the ranch at the dead end of Skelly for a possible fire. Upon arrival a small barn and an excavator were fully engulfed. RHFD arrived on scene and extinguished the fire. Property damage only and RHFD will be conducting further investigation.

Theft: On March 11, 2020, at approximately 7:52 PM, Officers were dispatched to the AT&T store located in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave for a theft of a cell phone. The suspect was described as a Middle Eastern male adult, wearing a black Adidas sweat suit, with a tattoo on his neck. He was last seen on foot toward Home Depot. An area check was conducted but the suspect was not located.

MSIN: On March 11, 2020, at approximately 10:00 PM, Officers were dispatched to the front parking lot of the PD for a disturbance. A female caller stated she was in a white Cadillac and her boyfriend was hitting her. Officers located the vehicle in the area of Willow Ave and Sycamore Ave. Officers were unable to determine if a crime occurred and neither party had injuries or wished to pursue any criminal charges. A case was taken to be forwarded to the DA's Office for review.

Possession of a Controlled Substance: On March 12, 2020, at 9:23 am, an Officer conducted a pedestrian stop on a 43 year old male subject out of Rodeo for a vehicle code violation. During a consent search, the subject was found to be in possession of a useable amount of suspected methamphetamine. He was cited and released at the scene on his promise to appear.

Warrant Arrest: On March 12, 2020, at 5:04 pm, an officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop on a vehicle with no plates. The driver of the vehicle, a 35 year old female out of Sacramento was found to have an outstanding misdemeanor warrant out of Contra Costa County for theft. She was transported to MDF and her two children and vehicle were released to family members.

Felony Evading/Attempt ADW on Officer: On March 13, 2020, at approximately 1:03 AM, an Officer attempted to conduct a traffic enforcement stop on a 2015 Nissan Altima in the area of Sycamore Ave and Claeys Lane. The vehicle failed to yield and a pursuit was initiated. As other Officers were attempting to get into position to deploy Stop Sticks, the

vehicle accelerated at a high rate of speed at the Officer's patrol vehicle forcing the Officer to take evasive action to avoid being struck. The pursuit was terminated when the vehicle drove the wrong way on Hwy 4. CCC Sheriff's Office Deputies located the vehicle at E/B 4 and I-680, and pursued it into the City of Concord where the driver foot bailed. An extensive search including two K-9s was conducted but the suspect was not located. Officers were able to determine the possible suspect as a 36 year old male subject out of Concord. The vehicle was towed for processing.

Auto Burglary: On March 13, 2020, at 11:20 am, a citizen called to report his 2017 Toyota Corolla was broken into in the 800 block of Willow Ave. A Microsoft Pro4 tablet was stolen out of the vehicle. The tablet was entered into APS.

Warrant Arrest: On March 13, 2020, at 5:01 pm, an officer checked on a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot of Home Depot, and contacted a 63 year old male subject determined to have an outstanding citable warrant for possession of a controlled substance. He was cited and released at the scene on his promise to appear.

Stolen Plate: On March 13, 2020, at approximately 10:42 PM, an Officer took a report for two stolen license plates from a 2018 Honda CRV parked in the 1200 block of Willow Ave. Both plates were entered into SVS.

Warrant Arrest: On March 14, 2020, at approximately 12:12 AM, an Officer contacted a 27 year old male subject in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. He was determined to be have an outstanding parole hold warrant for his arrest. He taken into custody and transported to MDF.

Warrant Arrest: On March 14, 2020, a citizen called to report her husband was at her house located in the 100 block of Bedford. She said he has a warrant, and she had a restraining order that needed to be served on him. Officer's arrested the subject and served him with the restraining order. He was later transported to MDF.

Warrant Arrest: On March 14, 2020, at 9:56 pm, an Officer checked on an unoccupied suspicious vehicle parked in a handicap parking stall at Home Depot. The vehicle did not have a handicap placard and was found to have expired registration as of August 2019. The Officer contacted the owner and her associate, a 42 year old male subject from Richmond who was determined to have an outstanding Felony No Bail Warrant out of Alameda County. He was placed under arrest and transported to MDF.

Outside Assist: On March 15, 2020, at approximately 3:16 pm, Officers were dispatched to a welfare check near the Highway 80 and east bound 4 loop for an Asian female walking on the freeway. Dispatch updated the female now jumped from the freeway onto Willow. Officers arrived on Willow Ave and located a 42 year old female in the number two lane of south bound Willow Avenue with major injuries. She was later pronounced deceased on scene by medical personnel. CHP arrived and took over the investigation.

Violation of a Domestic Violence Restraining Order: On March 15, 2020, at 8:45 pm, a female reported a court order violation. She told the Officer that her husband, called her twice from Contra Costa County Jail in violation of her served Domestic Violence Restraining Order. She provided two voicemail messages left on her cell phone from her husband. A case was taken and will be forwarded to the DA's office for review.

Hit and Run Vehicle Collision/DUI/Suspended Driver's License/Probation Violation:

On March 15, 2020, at 10:44 pm, Officers were dispatched to the area of Jacaranda Ct. for a report of a Black sedan that hit a fire hydrant. Dispatch advised the Black sedan left the scene and was last seen driving towards San Pablo Ave. Officers arrived and located a fire hydrant that had been hit on Craftsman Drive at Jacaranda Ct. with water gushing approximately 50 ft. up in the air. Rodeo-Hercules Fire Station responded to turn the fire hydrant off. An Officer located the suspect vehicle, parked in the 100 block of Jacaranda Ct. The vehicle had moderate right rear end damage with the rear bumper hanging off. The Officer contacted the driver, a 22 year old female subject from Vallejo. She displayed objective signs and symptoms of being under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. After she was administered SFST's, she was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI. She was transported to HPD for further investigation and was later cited and released to her boyfriend.
