Firearm turned in per Court Order: On May 14, 2020, at 11:00 am, a resident from the 1000 block of Promenade turned in two firearms for safekeeping per a court order.

Natural Death: On May 14, 2020, at about 12:42 pm, Officers responded to a residence in the 300 block of Grenadine Way for a reported death. An 82 year old female was determined to be deceased as a result of natural causes, and the Coroner released the body to the family.

Injury Collision: On May 14, 2020, at about 9:00 pm, Officers were dispatched to the 1800 block of Pheasant Drive for a motorcycle that collided into a parked vehicle. Officers arrived on scene and located a male subject in the middle of the roadway. He was semi-conscious and breathing but not responsive. He was identified as a 31 year old male of Hercules, and he was transported to John Muir Walnut Creek via helicopter. It appears he was riding an orange KTM motorcycle northbound on Pheasant Drive when he crossed over into the southbound lanes and collided head on with a vehicle parked along the west curb. The subject was not wearing a helmet.

Residential Burglary: On May 15, 2020, at approximately 2:39 am, Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 1100 block of Rock Harbor Point for a residential burglary that just occurred. The resident stated a subject entered his house via a bedroom window and fled toward the trail when confronted. The resident stated they know the suspect who is a 16 year old male juvenile. A review of the security camera footage shows the subject disconnecting a security camera prior to entering through the window. An area check of the trail was conducted but the subject was not located. Unknown take at this time. There was a similar type of incident reported involving the same subject in April.

Vehicle Burglary: On May 15, 2020, at about 12:32 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a residence in the 1200 block of Willow Ave for a reported auto burglary which occurred sometime the prior evening.

Grand Theft: On May 15, 2020, at about 1:20 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Ben Lomond for a reported theft from a vehicle. The victim let a friend drive his vehicle and when he got the vehicle back, the friend had stolen over \$7,000.00 of equipment from the vehicle.

Shooting at an Inhabited Dwelling: On May 17, 2020, at about 2:51 am, Officers were dispatched to the area of the 100 block of Tidewater for a reported gunshot heard. A resident in the area said he heard a loud bang and saw a Red Cadillac driving out of the area. Officers searched the area did not find any victims or damaged vehicles. However, an Officer located a bullet hole in an upstairs bedroom window of a residence in the 100 block of Tidewater. Officers determined the bullet went through the front window and blinds before striking/embedding in the wall near a closet. Officers did not locate any evidence that anyone was injured. This incident is still being investigated.

Stolen Vehicle: On May 17, 2020, at about 4:05 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Glenwood for a stolen vehicle report. Dispatch advised that the 2012 Volkswagen Passat was towed by CHP-San Jose for blocking the roadway on May 16, 2020. The victim said he last saw his vehicle on May 15, 2020, around 6:00 pm.

Miscellaneous: On May 18, 2020, at about 9:13 am, an Officer took a case for a suspected child abuse that occurred several months ago. The Officer spoke with all involved parties and will be forwarding this report to CFS.

MSIN: On May 19, 2020, at about 2:28 pm, an Officer contacted a Kaiser employee who told him she wanted to report a sexual assault of a minor (patient) that occurred three years ago. The Officer will be conducting follow up with the juvenile.

Mail Theft: On May 19, 2020, at about 5:00 pm, Officers were dispatched to the area of Turquoise Drive at Emerald Way for an in progress mail theft. An Officer located the suspect vehicle on Turquoise Drive at Sycamore Avenue. An investigative stop was conducted on a white 1998 Ford Taurus. Three subjects were contacted, a 29 year old male, a 31 year old male, and a 34 year old female. Mail was located inside the vehicle that did not belong to them. An in-field show up was conducted and one of the subjects was positively identified as the suspect who stole the mail. He was cited and all of the subjects were released.

Grand Theft – Catalytic Converter: On May 19, 2020, at about 8:03 pm, an Officer was flagged down in the parking lot of Home Depot, for a report of a theft of a catalytic converter. The victim told the Officer he returned to his silver '08 Toyota Prius and discovered the catalytic converter had been stolen. A witness who was on scene told the Officer he saw an unknown suspect underneath the Prius committing the theft. The unknown suspect got into a White '18 Nissan Versa that had a broken out window. The witness last saw the Versa leaving the shopping center. The Versa was found to be a Hertz rental vehicle.

Felony Reckless Evading/Evading a Peace Officer by Driving in the Opposite Direction of Traffic: On May 19, 2020, at about 8:17 pm, an Officer was driving behind a White '12 Ford E45 UHAUL box truck in the #2 lane in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The Officer saw the driver was an HMA, 25-35, short black hair, wearing a red/black polo shirt, and a black face mask. A records check on the box truck revealed it was an outstanding stolen vehicle reported to CHP-Contra Costa on May 17th. The Officer followed it onto E/B I-80 from Willow Ave and attempted to conduct a high risk traffic stop on E/B I-80 near Pomona St. However, the driver of the box truck failed to yield and a brief vehicle pursuit was initiated. The vehicle exited Magazine St. in Vallejo before driving to the other side of the freeway near the gas station. The truck drove E/B I-80 in the #4 lane of W/B I-80. Due to safety concerns, Officers discontinued the vehicle pursuit. The total time of the vehicle pursuit was about ten minutes and the total distance of the vehicle pursuit was 2.2 miles.

Outside Assist – Wanted Armed Robbery Suspect & Vehicle: On May 19, 2020, at about 9:12 pm, Officers were monitoring Richmond P.D.'s vehicle pursuit of a wanted armed and dangerous armed robbery suspect. RPD was pursuing a black '11 BMW 528i from Richmond onto E/B I-80. RPD lost visual of the suspect vehicle on E/B I-80 near Hilltop Rd. Another RPD Officer located the suspect vehicle on N/B San Pablo Ave at John Muir Parkway in Hercules. RPD began a second vehicle pursuit of the suspect vehicle and the suspect vehicle ultimately lost control crashing into a vehicle on W/B SR-4 prior to Franklin Canyon Rd. Hercules Officers along with numerous other police agencies responded to assist with taking the suspect into custody.
