Theft from Unlocked Vehicle: On June 11, 2020, at about 8:44 am, an officer was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Dartford for a theft from an unlocked vehicle. The victim stated that sometime between 7 pm, and 7 am, approximately \$1600.00 worth of property was stolen from the vehicle.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On June 11, 2020, at about 11:13 am, an officer was dispatched to a business in the 1000 block of Alfred Nobel Drive, Bio-Rad for a case regarding a possible scam. The officer determined that a subject was offered a job by someone impersonating a Bio-Rad employee. The victim lives in Texas. The case was taken for documentation only.

Stolen Motorcycle: On June 11, 2020, at about 11:26 am, an officer was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Thrush Ct for a stolen motorcycle. The victim stated she is currently separated from her children's father, and he took her and her oldest daughter's 2016 Harley Road King LP: 22N6757. The victim had attempted to contact the suspect numerous times, and he will not answer her calls.

Identity Theft: On June 11, 2020, at about 11:28 am, an officer was dispatched to a residence in the 1200 block of Turquoise Drive for a reported identity theft. The victim said that an unknown suspect applied for unemployment in the victim's name. The victim went to apply for unemployment due to being laid off and was unable to obtain benefits because a state employee said someone was already receiving benefits using their personal information.

Stolen Vehicle: On June 11, 2020, at approximately 7:24 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Willow Ave for a stolen vehicle. The victim said she left her gray 2015 Ford Fusion running in the parking lot and went to her apartment to grab an item. When she returned her vehicle was gone. No suspect information.

Stolen Vehicle: On June 13, 2020, at about 12:52 pm, an officer was dispatched to a residence in the 1100 block of Canterbury for a reported stolen vehicle. A security camera in the area captured two unknown race males, wearing backpacks and facemasks, stealing a white 2008 Ford work truck with US Electric logos on both doors around 5:00 am this morning.

Shoplifting/Petty Theft: On June 14, 2020, at about 7:40 am, Officers were dispatched to Lucky for a theft that just occurred. The Reporting Party stated the female suspect took folders and binders. The suspect, a 34 year old female was located on Refugio Valley Rd near the bus stop with the stolen items. She was positively identified and prosecution was desired. She was cited and released from the scene and the property was returned.

Vehicle vs. Pedestrian vehicle collision: On June 14, 2020, at about 7:22 pm, Officers were dispatched to the area of Santa Fe St. at Camden Ln for a report of a vehicle collision involving a four year old child. Officers located the four year old boy in the roadway, W/B Santa Fe St. near Pinole St, being held by his mother. The child had minor cuts/abrasions to his right ankle, left elbow, right knee, and septum. The child was medically evaluated by paramedics and transported by ambulance to Richmond Kaiser. The involved driver, a 19 year old male of Richmond told Officers he was driving W/B Santa Fe St. at approximately 15-20 mph when he suddenly saw the child run out into the roadway in front of him. He braked, but still collided with the child. The driver admitted to smoking a small amount of Marijuana earlier, but didn't appear to be under the influence. Officers searched the vehicle and located a small amount of suspected Marijuana. The driver, who was determined to be unlicensed, consented to a preliminary alcohol screening test, which was negative. The driver's mother responded to take possession of the vehicle and the driver was cited and released for driving without a driver's license.

Robbery: On June 15, 2020, at approximately 11:43 am, Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 1000 block of Regatta Point for a Robbery that just occurred. Dispatch stated there were three suspects and one had a gun. The suspects left the area in a black sedan and the husband of the victim had attempted to follow the suspects. Officers arrived and determined the victim had just come from a jewelry consignment store in San Francisco to get some jewelry appraised. When she returned home she was approached in her driveway by two Black male adults, in their 20's, both tall and skinny. One suspect produced a handgun, described as a black large caliber firearm and pointed it at the victim. The victim and her husband were forced to give their Rolex watches, and several other items of jewelry valued at approximately \$50,000.00. The suspect got into a black newer model Dodge Charger, and it drove towards Victoria Crescent West with the third suspect driving. The husband attempted to follow the Dodge, and lost sight of it on Victoria Crescent West. There were several cameras in the neighborhood, and Officers were able to capture the vehicle arriving in the area just seconds behind the victims pulling into their driveway. The suspect vehicle appears to be a stock Dodge Charger with no front license plate. Further investigation is being conducted. The victims were not injured. It appears the victims were possibly followed home from San Francisco and specifically targeted.

Domestic Battery: On June 15, 2020, at approximately 4:57 pm, an Officer responded to a lobby detail for a late reported Domestic Battery. A 37 year old female from the 100 block of Daisy reported she had an argument with her live in boyfriend, a 36 year old male subject, at approximately 10:00 am this morning regarding a cell phone. The male subject pulled the phone away from her and pushed the female. The male subject then tossed the phone on the ground and the female picked up the phone and left the residence. The Officer attempted to contact the male subject but the attempts were unsuccessful. The female desired to press charges, and an Emergency Protective Order was granted. The EPO has not been served, and the female has moved out of the residence.
