Auto Burglary/ Vandalism: On June 22, 2020, at approximately 7:13 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Bristol Street for vandalism to a vehicle. The Officer located three vehicles which had the windows smashed. One vehicle was missing the back-up camera monitor. The incidents occurred sometime between June 20 and 10:00 pm, and June 22 at 7:13 am. After contacting three victims in front of the 100 building, the officer located another vehicle in front of the 200 building. A 2017 Honda Accord had the passenger side front window broken out. There was nothing missing from the Honda. The vandalism occurred between June 20 at approximately 10:00 pm, and June 22 at approximately 7:13 am. While in the area the Officer located a 2000 Ford Explorer with a broken driver's side rear window in front of 500 Bristol. There were four fishing poles and an air compressor taken from the Ford. The time frame for the Ford was from June 21 at approximately 7:30 pm, and June 22 at approximately 7:13 am.

Annoying and Harassing Phone Calls: On June 22, 2020, at approximately 11:41 pm, an Officer handled a telephone detail regarding annoying and harassing phone calls. Between 2018 and today's date the 40 year old female Hercules resident has been receiving hundreds of emails, text messages, and phone calls from her boyfriend's ex-girlfriend, who resides in Las Vegas. The victim has tried to get the contacts to stop with no success. The victim just wanted the incident documented, and was advised to get a restraining order. A case was taken to document the incident.

Warrant Arrest x 4/Possession of a controlled substance: On June 22, 2020 at 10:34 p.m. An Officer was doing a security check of 76 gas station, 828 Willow Ave. and saw a suspicious White '87 Ford Econoline E350 RV parked at a gas pump. The Officer determined the license plate had expired registration as of April 2017. The Officer waited for the driver of the RV to exit the gas station. However, once the Officer got behind the he driver suddenly stopped the RV putting on the hazard lights. The Officer contacted the driver who said he didn't have any identification on his person. The driver verbally identified himself, but the officer found an EBT card, in his wallet, with a different name. The 40 year old male's identity was confirmed via Cal Photo. The subject had four outstanding Misdemeanor Warrants. Three out of Contra Costa County and one out of San Francisco County S.O. He was arrested and a small plastic baggie containing a suspected narcotic was found in his right front pants pocket. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility, where he was booked for the Warrants, and cited for the narcotic violation.
