**Found Property:** On June 23, 2020, at approximately 1:01 pm, an Officer was flagged down at Hercules Middle School regarding a found license plate. The reporting party said he found a license plate on his vehicle, on May 29, 2020, while he was attempting to attach his new registration sticker. The reporting party worked at the school and he just kept driving the vehicle until he had time to take care of it. The plate was reported stolen to Vallejo PD on January 21, 2020. The plate was recovered and removed from Stolen Vehicle System

**Warrant Arrest x 2/Possession of a controlled substance x 2/Possession of drug paraphernalia/Possession of a stolen Motorcycle:**

On June 24, 2020 at 1:17 a.m. an officer did a pedestrian stop on a 53 year old Caucasian male, at the Jack in the Box, 3800 San Pablo Ave. The male gave the officer a name but later admitted to his true name. The subject said he was from Bay Point, but was currently homeless. He also told the Officers he had an outstanding Warrant and It was determined the subject had an outstanding Misdemeanor No Cite Warrant issued on January 10, 2020. He had a second Misdemeanor Warrant, out of Solano County, issued on January 16, 2020. The subject was detained and admitted he was possessing narcotics. Two substances, believed to be narcotics, were located inside the subject's right front jeans coin pocket. A loaded hypodermic needle was also found inside his inside vest pocket. The subject was wearing a leather jacket, leather motorcycle chaps, had a motorcycle helmet, and gloves. He said he was waiting for a taxi cab after his Motorcycle broke down on the W/B I-80 on-ramp from John Muir Parkway. Officers asked the subject more about his Motorcycle and he told them he got it recently from a tow yard in Pittsburg but denied it was stolen. Another Officer located a White/Blue '02 Honda Shadow Motorcycle (appeared to have been painted over) parked on the W/B I-80 on-ramp from John Muir Parkway. The Shadow had an attached rear license plate that returned to a '75 Honda Motorcycle with expired registration in July 2012. The Officer checked the Shadow's VIN and it didn't match the VIN for that license plate. The VIN on the Shadow returned to a confirmed outstanding stolen '02 Orange Honda Shadow Motorcycle. The Shadow was reported stolen to Concord P.D. on November 11, 2019. The rear license plate was seized to be returned to DMV. The recovered stolen Shadow was towed. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.
