Found Property: On July 7, 2020, at approximately 8:31 am, an Officer was checking on a 2003 Mercedes in the 200 block of Violet Road. It was determined the registered owner of the Mercedes had just purchased the vehicle, and the plate, that was on the vehicle, did not belong on the Mercedes. The license plate was taken to be returned to DMV.

Non-Injury Solo Vehicle Collision: On July 7, 2020, at approximately 8:58 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Refugio Valley Road near Country Run for a vehicle in the center median. Officers located a 1999 Lexus, facing south, on the center median, of Refugio Valley Road,. The vehicle had major front end and passenger side damage. It was determined the 35 year old male driver was driving south on Refugio Valley Road when he fell asleep and drove off the west side of Refugio Valley Road, and struck a tree. He tried to correct the vehicle's action and ended up on the center median. The driver had a minor injury to his left hand, and was treated, by AMR, on scene.

Resisting with Force: On July 7, 2020, at approximately 9:40 am, an Officer was standing by with the disabled vehicle, from the previous collision, waiting for the tow truck. A 38 year old male, walking in the center median, approached the Officer. The male was holding a large rock and a bottle, and yelling randomly. The Officer tried to contact the subject but he continued walking the traffic lane. The Officer continued to try to get the subject to stop and get out of the lane of traffic. The subject approached a van, driving south on Refugio Valley Road, and hit the van with the large rock he was holding. The subject advanced, towards the Officer, while still holding the rock. The Officer was able to get the subject to sit down, briefly, and put the rock down. The subject again picked the rock, and refused to comply with the officer's requests. The Officer stunned the subject with his taser. The subject began to fight with the Officer and grabbed the taser away from him. The Officer was able to handcuff the subject and the taser fell free. The subject was transported to the County Regional Medical Center for minor injuries. He was medically cleared and transported to Martinez Detention Facility. The Officer sustained a minor cut to a finger.

Misceellaneous: On July 7, 2020 at 8:41 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to 200 Meadowlark Way for a report of threats made to Repossession Agents attempting to repossess a a vehicle. Officers were advised an adult male had threatened to shoot one of the Repossession Agents. The subject was described as being in in a wheelchair. Officers were advised the subject, in the wheelchair, was attempting to drive the vehicle away. Officers saw the male subject, in the wheelchair, on the driver's side of the vehicle and detained him. The 74 year old male told Officers he did tell the REPO employees he was going to go inside his house and get a gun, but he did not. No firearms were found inside the vehicle. The male consented to a search of his room and Officers located a Chrome BB revolver in a bedroom dresser drawer. The REPO employees told Officers they weren't really afraid of the subject. They left the driveway, and called the police, as a precaution. The REPO employees also didn't desire prosecution for criminal threats.
