**Identity Theft:** On July 16<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 7:57 am, an officer was dispatched to the 400 block of Valley Run for an Identity Theft report. The victim stated that someone opened an account in her name without her permission.

**Vehicle Burglary:** On July 16<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 1:09 pm, an officer was dispatched to Santa Fe and Railroad Ave. for the report of a vehicle burglary. The officer found a window broken, out of the victims Ford F150, and her purse had been taken.

**Felon in Possession of Firearm / Possession of High Capacity Magazine/ Resisting Arrest / Probation Violation:** On July 16<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 3:19 pm, two HPD Officers were working a County wide Vehicle Suppression Enforcement Team, in Antioch. They conducted a traffic stop, on a 2000 Buick. The 35 year old male driver, of Antioch, pulled over and attempted to flee on foot. After a short foot pursuit the subject was arrested. Officers located a handgun next to the driver's seat where the subject was seated. The subject was cleared medically then transported to Martinez Detention Facility. The 23 year old male passenger, of Antioch, was released.

**Miscellaneous:** On July 16<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 11:51PM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop. Officers located three 30 round AR-15 magazines and approximately 300 rounds of .223 ammunition, in the vehicle. The 40 year old male driver, of Oregon, stated he was a convicted felon in Texas. He said he was driving from Oregon to SFO to catch a flight to Washington DC. The subject stated he was unaware the items were in the car and believed they may belong to his father or brother. He requested that HPD take the items, for destruction, because he is not supposed to be in possession of them. The Officer booked the items, for destruction, in to the Police Property Room. The subject was released.

**Domestic Violence:** On July 17, 2020, at 2:58 pm, officers were dispatched to the 1900 block of Tioga Loop for a domestic dispute. The incident occurred in the Bank of America Parking Lot (1611 Sycamore Ave.) Officers were advised the male half lived in the 1200 block of Willow Ave. An officer responded to Tioga Loop and contacted an adult female (later determined to be the suspect). Another officer responded to Willow to contact the adult male victim. It was determined the female hit the male on the side of his head, causing a bump. The female was arrested and was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Domestic Violence:** On July 17, 2020 at 4:45 pm, an officer was dispatched to Basin Ct. for a domestic violence case that happen the night before. The adult female victim stated her adult husband punched her in the face. The husband was not on scene. The judge granted an Emergency Protective Order. On July 18, 2020 at 7:14 am, officers responded to Basin Court for a follow-up investigation on a domestic violence case. Officers located, and arrested, the husband and he was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Grand Theft from a Vehicle:** On July 17<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 5:23 pm, an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Woodfield for the report of a theft from a vehicle that occurred sometime overnight. The victim had a jackhammer taken out of the bed of his work truck.

**Outside Assist:** On July 17<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 8:30PM a HPD Officer observed a vehicle, with major front end damage, traveling eastbound on I-80. CHP was contacted and confirmed a vehicle, matching that description, was just involved in a hit and run collision. A stop was conducted and the investigation was turned over to CHP.

**Embezzlement:** On July 18<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 12:25AM HPD Offices were dispatched to Home Depot for an embezzlement. An 18 year old male employee had been detained by loss prevention after security camera footage revealed he had stolen over \$1,000 worth of power tools. Home Depot wished to press charges. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Occupied Recovered Stolen Vehicle:** On July 19, 2020, at approximately 11:40 am, an Officer Checked on a white, Subaru Impreza, with no license plates on it, parked at Shell Gas Station at the gas pumps. A 19 year old female was getting into the driver's seat of the vehicle, and had her belongings in the vehicle. The Officer determined the 1983 Subaru was an unreported stolen vehicle out of Berkeley. The female was detained. The subject said she purchased the vehicle for \$200.00, this morning, from a male in Berkeley. The registered owner was contacted and Berkeley PD took the stolen vehicle report. The registered owner just wanted the vehicle back and would not say one way or another whether she wanted to press charges. The suspect was released pending further investigation.
