## WATCH COMMANDER'S SHIFT REPORT

**Grand Theft:** On July 23, 2020 at 8:35 am, an officer was dispatched to the 500 block of Linus Pauling Dr. for the theft of a bicycle. The reporting party stated that an unknown suspect stole his bike 10-15 minutes prior to the time of call. The bike is an Orange Cannondale.

**Missing Person:** On July 23, 2020 at 3:11 pm Officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave for the report of an at risk missing person. The 89 year old male was seen, walking out the front door of his apartment building, at 12:50 pm and had not returned home. Officers searched the area along with a Helicopter and the subject was finally located on Swallow at 5:39 pm. The subject was transported to a local hospital to be checked out.

**Residential Burglary and Vandalism:** On July 23, 2020 at 4:20 pm, an officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Skelly for a burglary that had occurred to the residence sometime within the previous four days. A trailer also had its wheels slashed.

**Warrant Arrest:** On July 24<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 1:58AM a HPD Officer checked on a suspicious vehicle. The 30 year old occupant, of Vacaville, was arrested and cite/released on a warrant for theft held by Contra Costa County.

**Driving Under the Influence:** On July 24<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 3:30AM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop. The 35 year old female driver displayed the objective symptoms of alcohol intoxication. She performed the Standard Field Sobriety Test; and the Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated she was over the presumptive level for the purposes of driving. The subject was placed under arrest and later cite/released to the custody of a responsible party,

**Non-Injury Vehicle Collision:** On July 24<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 2:56 pm, an officer was dispatched to a non-injury collision which occurred on Willow Ave. in front of Burger King. The involved parties requested a case.

**Non-Injury Vehicle Collision:** On July 24<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 5:06 pm, an officer was dispatched to a non-injury collision which occurred in front of Jack in the Box. One party exchanged minimal information and left the scene. The Reporting Party requested a case be taken.

**Robbery/ Kidnapping x3** On July 25<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 9:26PM HPD Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Dartford for a female, with two juveniles, who stated she had been attacked. Officers located a 35 year old female, and her 6 and 8 year old children. No one appeared to be injured and medical was declined. The female stated an adult male acquaintance was supposed to take her and her children to her uncle's house, in Richmond, but the male changed his mind. The male refused to let her or the children get out of the car, despite repeated requests. While they were driving on the freeway the suspect stated he

would take them to Reno. The female stated they eventually stopped at the 76 Gas Station on Willow Ave. She attempted to exit the vehicle but the suspect sped out of the parking lot. The suspect drove to the area of Dartford and demanded the victim give him her cell phone. Fearing for the safety of her and her children, the victim complied. She was then able to exit the car with her children. The suspect was last seen driving a white Cadillac Escalade with chrome oversized rims. Officers were able to get the victim, and her children, to a family member's house.

**Theft from Unlocked Vehicle:** On July 25, 2020 at 9:12 am, an officer was dispatched for a report of a theft from a vehicle at Shasta Ln and Tioga Loop. The victim placed her California Driver's License in the center console of her vehicle and went for a run. When she arrived home she noticed her license was missing from her vehicle.

**Fraud:** On July 25, 2020 at 2:42 pm, an officer was dispatched to the 1100 block of Earnest for a report that someone fraudulently accessed the victim's banks account and was able to transfer money from her account to another bank.

**Driving a stolen vehicle/Possession of a stolen vehicle/Vandalism to patrol SUV:** On July 25, 2020 at 8:01 p.m. An Officer observed a White '12 Honda Accord stopped on S/B San Pablo Ave. near Victoria Crescent West. The Accord was stopped along the west curb parked near the pedestrian gate into the apartment complex. The Officer saw two occupants inside the Accord and saw the vehicle had a shattered/broken out rear window. The Officer checked the vehicle and learned it was an outstanding stolen vehicle. The vehicle was reported stolen to Richmond P.D. on July 23, 2020. The two occupants were detained. The driver was an 18 year male, transient; and the passenger was an 19 year old male, of Rodeo. The driver kicked the right rear passenger door/window of patrol SUV, numerous times, causing damage (window frame bent). The passenger was released, after being interviewed. The driver was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Driving Under the Influence/Hit & Run Vehicle Collision/:** On July 26, 2020 at 1:13 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of the 100 block of Dover for a report of a vehicle collision. The reporting party said a vehicle slammed into a barrier and the vehicle was still occupied. While en-route officers were updated that the vehicle may have driven into a building; and the driver fled on foot last seen towards Cambridge. Officers located a Black '15 Nissan Sentra, which had collided into the FOXBORO DOWNS sign, on the corner of S/B Willow Ave. at Cambridge. The Sentra collided into the sign, and drove up over it, coming to rest on the grassy hill prior to the condo building. All the airbags were deployed and no occupants were found inside the Sentra. Officers spoke to a witness who described seeing an adult male suspect, who fled the vehicle on foot, towards Cambridge. The witness stated the suspect had a bloody nose. Officers went to the home of the registered owner. They located a 25 year old male, with fresh injuries to his face, who displayed objective signs of being under the influence of alcohol and or drugs. He subject an expired driver's license. The subject complained of pain to his back and he was transported to a local hospital. An Officer followed the subject, to the hospital, to await a DUI blood draw search warrant. Inside the Sentra, Officers located a Ziploc plastic bag containing a green leafy substance suspected to be Marijuana. The Ziploc bag was seized as evidence. The subject was arrested for Driving under the Influence and a blood draw search warrant was granted by the on-call Judge. The subject was cited and released to a responsible party.

**Vehicle Theft** On July 26<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 9:16AM a HPD Officer took a phone report for a theft of a motorcycle from the 100 block of Mulberry Ct. The red Honda CR70 was entered onto the Stolen Vehicle System.

**Armed Robbery** On July 26<sup>th</sup> 2020 at approximately 3:28PM a HPD Officer took a lobby report for an armed robbery that occurred in the 1300 block of Sycamore Ave around 1:00AM. The victim stated the suspect was an African American male adult, wearing a mask, and had a handgun. The suspect took the victim's personal jewelry and fled the area in a blue Honda Accord.
