Shoplifting: On August 20, 2020, at 12:33 pm, officers were dispatched for a theft that had just occurred at Lucky 1590 Sycamore Ave. The suspect was described as an African American male adult; and the driver of the silver Chevy Impala was also an African American male. The take was a basket full of groceries.

Runaway Juvenile: On August 20, 2020, at 4:57 pm a resident from the 200 block Valley called to report her 13 year old foster son as a runaway. The subject is believed to be in Oakland. OPD was going to do a welfare check but at the time this log they have not responded back to HPD.

Warrant Arrest x2 On August 21st 2020 at approximately 1:20AM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop. The 39 year old male driver was determined to have a warrant. He was taken into custody. The subject was determined to be a Parole at Large, wanted by the California Department of Corrections. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Stolen Vehicle: On August 21, 2020 at 3:18 pm, an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Bristol St. for a stolen 2009 Black Nissan Rogue.

Driving Under the Influence/Collision (non-injury)/Resisting Officer with Force: On August 21st 2020 at approximately 10:40PM HPD Officers were dispatched to vehicle collision in the 200 block of Glenwood. Officers contacted the 18 year old female driver, who stated she was texting while driving and caused a collision. She also displayed the objective symptoms of alcohol intoxication. She refused to perform Standard Field Sobriety Test and was placed under arrest. At the station the subject did the Preliminary Alcohol Screening test, which indicated she was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. The subject chose to have a blood test, but was unable to complete the test. As the officer was re-placing the handcuffs the subject bit the Officer on the right forearm (redness). She was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Vehicle Burglary: On August 22, 2020 at 6:35 am, an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Abalone Cove for a vehicle burglary. The reporting party stated the window on his 2000 Ford Expedition was broken out, and his spare tire was taken. Occurred sometime overnight.

Gun for Destruction: On August 22, 2020, at 2:05 pm, a Hercules resident came to the police department to turn in a Daisy 22 rifle for destruction. The resident stated he was moving and no longer wanted the rifle.

INFORMATONAL TIP: The Hercules Police Department will take any weapon, including firearms and ammunition, for destruction.

If you have a weapon(s), or ammunition, you want to turn in please follow the following instructions:

- 1) Call the Police Department (510-724-1111) and ask for an officer to come to your home to pick up your weapon(s) or ammunition.
- 2) If you are turning in a firearm(s) unload the firearm(s), if you can do so safely.
 - a) For a semi-automatic weapon; remove the magazine from the weapon, remove any bullets from the chamber; remove all bullets from the magazines; and leave the slide back.
 - b) For a revolver(s) remove all bullets from the cylinder and leave cylinder open.
 - c) For Rifle(s), shot guns, and antique(s) (or replicas), remove all bullets and leave the actions open.
 - d) If you cannot safely unload the firearm(s) **TELL THE DISPATCHER YOU WANT TO TURN IN A LOADED WEAPON(S).**
- 3) Leave the weapon(s) (firearm(s); knife(s); sword(s); cross bow(s), etc.) on a table (or similar). Put all bullets, magazines, and other ammunition, in an area away from the weapon(s).
- 4) When the officer arrives **DO NOT BRING THE WEAPON(S) TO THE DOOR.** Tell the officer where the weapon(s) is located and let them retrieve it.
- 5) If you want to bring the weapon(s) to the Police Department **DO NOT BRING IT INTO THE BUILDING.**
 - a) Make sure the weapon(s) is unloaded (following 2 a through c)
 - b) Place the weapon(s) in the trunk. If you do not have a trunk put the weapon(s) in the rear portion of your vehicle and make sure it is not visible.
 - c) Keep all empty magazines, and ammunition, separate from the weapon(s).
 - d) Make sure your vehicle is locked and come to the Police Department
 - e) Tell the counter personal you want to turn in a weapon(s), and or ammunition, and whether or not the weapon(s) is loaded.
 - f) An officer will accompany you to your vehicle and retrieve the weapon(s).

Stolen Vehicle: On August 23, 2020 at 12:10 a.m. An Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Glenwood to take a report for a stolen vehicle. The reporting party said an unknown suspect stole his Black '99 Honda CRV, from the visitor's parking lot near, his condo, sometime between 5:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. The vehicle was locked and none of his car keys were missing. An area check was done for the CRV or other evidence, but nothing was located.

Possession of a Controlled Substance/Misdemeanor Probation Violation: On August 23, 2020 at 1:57 a.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a Gray '05 Honda Civic (for expired registration). The driver was a 24 year old male from Antioch. The 32 year old male passenger of Brentwood was found to be on searchable Probation in Contra Costa County. A Probation search was done and the Officer located a small plastic coin size baggie containing a substance, suspected to be a narcotic, in the subject's pants pocket. The subject was arrested and cited out. The driver was cited for the vehicle code violation and released.

Driving Under the Influence/Suspended Driver's License/Towed Vehicle: On August 23, 2020 at 1:47 a.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a Silver '00 Mercedes ML 320 for vehicle code violations. The 39 year old male driver of Oakland was found to have a suspended/revoked driver's license. The subject displayed objective signs and symptoms of

driving under the influence of alcohol. The subject was given the Standard Field Sobriety Test; and the Preliminary Alcohol Screen device indicated he was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. The subject was arrested for DUI and driving on a suspended driver's license. The subject was later cited out to a friend.
