Driving Under the Influence/Suspended Driver's License/Towed Vehicle: On September 4, 2020 at 1:32 a.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a Blue '99 Acura for DUI indicators (Weaving). The 22 year old male driver was found to have a suspended/revoked driver's license. The subject exhibited objective signs and symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol. The subject was given the Standard Field Sobriety Test; and the Preliminary Alcohol Screening Device indicated the subject was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. The subject was arrested and later cited and released to a responsible party. The vehicle was towed.

Suspended Driver's License/Body Armor Taken for Destruction/False Tab - Towed Vehicle: On September 4, 2020 at 3:34 a.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a Silver '09 Jaguar, for a stop sign violation, and for expired registration (June 2020). The rear license plate displayed a Red 2021 year tab. The tab did not come back to the vehicle. The 32 year old male driver, of Fairfield, was found to have a suspended/revoked driver's license. After being informed the vehicle would be towed, the subject advised there was body armor in the trunk. The Officer located old military body armor in the trunk. The body armor was turned in for destruction. The subject was cited and released.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On September 4, 2020, at 6:42 am, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Farragut St to assist a 84 year old male who was accidentally locked out of his house.

Lost Property: On September 4, 2020, at 4:30, a Hercules resident contacted an officer regarding a debit card he located at Refugio Valley Park. The officer contacted the card owner, who stated she also lost her Driver's License at the park. The debit card was returned, and a report was taken on the lost Driver's License.

Warrant Arrest: On September 4, 2020 at 9:51 p.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a White '98 Mazda MPV for a vehicle code violation. The 41 year old male driver, of Rodeo, was found to have an outstanding Felony No Bail Warrant out of Berkeley P.D. The Warrant was issued on March 16, 2019. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. Berkeley P.D. requested to respond to MDF to take custody of the subject before he was booked. An HPD Officer stood by with the subject until he was picked up by Berkeley P.D.

Large car club gathering: On September 5, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. Officers noticed the beginnings of a large gathering of vehicles in the southeast parking lot of Home Depot, 1625 Sycamore Ave. There were easy up tents and taco trucks in this area of the parking lot. Officers spoke to one of the organizers of the event and were communicating with him to attempt to keep the event peaceful. Ultimately, approximately 200-300 cars, muscle cars,

trucks, and motorcycles showed up. Officers took up positions nearby to observe the gathering. The gathering remained peaceful and lasted until 11:00 p.m.

Shoplifting: On September 6, 2020 at 8:37 am, officers were dispatched to Home Depot (1625 Sycamore Ave.) for a shoplifter in custody. Officers contacted a 60 year old male, out of Richmond, and arrested him for the theft. The subject was cite released at the scene.

Warrant Arrest: On September 6, 2020 at 4:00 pm, an officer conducted a traffic stop, on a 2002 Pontiac. The 27 year old male front passenger, out of Richmond, had a Misdemeanor traffic warrant out of Marin County. The officer cited the subject for the warrant and released him.

Warrant Arrest: On September 6, 2020 at 7:41 p.m. An Officer did a traffic stop, on a Silver '01 Toyota Camry, for a vehicle code violation. The 20 year old male driver, of El Sobrante, was found to have an outstanding Misdemeanor cite releasable Warrant. The Warrant was issued on August 13, 2020. The subject was cited and released.
