Grand Theft: On September 9, 2020 at 8:24 am, a citizen called from 4000 San Pablo Ave (Safeway Construction site) to report the theft of a Multiquip plate compactor which occurred overnight. The reporting party stated the compactor was valued over \$1,000.

Cultivation of Marijuana: On September 9, 2020 at 9:31 am, Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Crestridge Ct. for water flowing from the garage and front door. Officers were able to determine that house was being used for the cultivation of Marijuana. Detectives authored a search warrant and the cultivation was eradicated.

Domestic Violence Restraining Order Violation: On September 9, 2020 at 7:17 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to 100 Paradise Dr. for a report of a court order violation. The reporting party stated the 38 year old father of her children, who lives in Oakland, was seated in his Red unknown make/model sedan outside her apartment. This was in violation of her protection order. Dispatch advised the male subject had an outstanding No Cite Misdemeanor Warrant. Officers checked the area and didn't locate the suspect or vehicle. As an Officer was speaking to the reporting party, the subject called her cell phone. The Officer spoke to the subject and he stated he was aware he had an outstanding Warrant. However, he refused to turn himself in.

Unattended Death: On September 11, 2020 at 5:44 a.m. Hercules Officers were advised Rodeo-Hercules Fire was responding to the 100 block of Ash Ct. for a 64 year old male who was having difficulty breathing. Rodeo-Hercules Fire arrived and found a unconscious male not breathing. CPR was started and they requested Hercules Officers respond. Rodeo-Hercules Fire and AMR Paramedics pronounced the subject deceased at 6:25 a.m. There were no signs of trauma and no evidence a crime occurred. The subject had reportedly had previously diagnosed medical issues. A Chaplain was requested and responded to assist the family. An Officer contacted the on-call CCCSO Coroner's Deputy and he released the subject's body to the family.

Theft from Vehicle: On September 11, 2020 at 7:55 am an officer was dispatched to 100 Civic Dr. for a theft from a vehicle which occurred between September 10, 2020 between 2:00pm and the time of call. The victim left their 2004 Chevy unlocked and items were stolen.

Vehicle Burglary, Theft via Access Card, Attempt Vehicle Theft: On September 11, 2020 at 8:01 am, an officer was dispatched to 100 Civic Dr. for the report of a vehicle burglary. The officer contacted the victim who stated, between September 10, 2020 at 6:00pm and the time of call, someone broke into their vehicle and stolen a Laptop computer, and a credit card. The credit card had already been used and there was a shaved key in the ignition and the ignition was in the on position.

Check Fraud: On September 11, 2020, at 8:22 am, an officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Alfred Nobel Dr. for a fraud case. The reporting party stated that someone was using a check with their company's name but the company was still in possession of the check.

Warrant Arrest/Grand Theft: On September 11, 2020, at 12:20 pm, an officer conducted a traffic stop on a 1977 Mercedes for expired registration. The 58 year old male driver, out of Vallejo, was contacted and found to have an outstanding warrant. He was arrested and cite released on the warrant. The subject was determined to be on probation and a search was conducted. In the vehicle the officer located large spools of electrical wire that had just been stolen from Home Depot. The subject (driver) and his 50 year old male passenger, of Vallejo, were both arrested for the theft of the wire valued at over \$1000.00. Both Subjects were transported to the county jail.

Missing Person Locate: On September 11, 2020, 8:06 PM, an officer stopped a 2001 Honda and the 17-year-old female driver was found to be a missing juvenile reported by Vallejo PD. Her responded to the scene and took her home.

Domestic Violence w/ Children Present: On September 11, 2020, at 1:26 AM, officers responded to the 1200 block of Willow Ave for a disturbance. The reporting party, and her 13 year old daughter, were on scene and initially stated it was just an argument between the reporting party and her adult boyfriend. The male had left the area. The reporting later stated the subject choked her and pushed her. An Emergency Protective Order was granted for reporting party and her two children. The male agreed to meet at HPD for a statement, but he never showed up.

Warrants: On September 11, 2020, at 3:55 AM, an officer contacted an adult male, out of Oakland, during a suspicious vehicle check. The subject was found to have two citable misdemeanor warrants for his arrest, one from Newark PD; & one for from Marin Co. S.O. The subject was cited and released with two new court dates.

Warrants: On September 11, 2020, 8:43 PM, an Officer stopped a 2012 Chrysler and cited the adult male driver for two warrants.

Outside Assist/Arson/Vandalism/Resisting: September 13th 2020, at 12:02 AM, CHP requested cover for a man walking on WB HWY 4 with a knife. CHP indicated the adult male, was still walking away and was only wanted for a Vehicle Code infraction at this time. HPD officers observed the subject walking towards Shell on San Pablo Ave and assessed him from a distance. He appeared to be carrying a large overnight backpack and had a metal object in his hand. He became more agitated when officers moved closer to him to attempt contact. The subject kept walking away and was shouting obscenities. CHP did not show an interest in contacting the subject anymore. The subject eventually left Shell, but was upset they wouldn't sell him beer. Shell called and reported the subject vandalized their door with a rock. A CCSO deputy was in the area and saw the subject at John Muir Parkway near San Pablo Ave where he was lighting a tree on fire. CCSO units had an opportunity to move in quickly and detain the subject. The subject was resisting when Hercules units arrived and officers assisted in handcuffing the subject. The small fire was extinguished quickly and RHFD responded as a precaution. CCSO arrested the subject transported to the Martinez Detention Facility for Arson and Resisting Arrest. The subject did not appear to sustain any injuries and no officers were injured. The metal object he had been holding was a narrow piece of sheet metal. A Hercules Officer investigated the felony vandalism at Shell.

Warrant Arrest X2: On September 13th 2020 at approximately 9:43 AM, an Officer checked on a suspicious vehicle parked at 828 Willow Avenue (76 Gas Station). The Officer contacted

a 32 year old male and determined he had an outstanding no bail warrant. A second adult male, associated with the vehicle, was contacted and was determined to have an outstanding warrant. Both subjects were arrested and booked at the Martinez Detention Facility.

Located Missing Person: On September 13th 2020 at approximately 10:24am, an Officer contacted an adult male at 800 Willow Avenue. The subject was determined to be a voluntary missing adult from Vacaville. The subject seemed to be capable to care for himself and was removed from the Missing and Unidentified Persons System.

Arson x 2 counts & Probation Violation: On September 14, 2020 at 1:00 a.m. an officer saw a male shadow walking in the north parking lot towards the rear of Home Depot, 1625 Sycamore Ave. The officer drove into Creekside Shopping Center and drove to the north parking lot of Home Depot. The Officer found a fire in the north parking lot. A 1000 lb. bag of Sand was on fire. The bag was located in the middle of a bunch of bags of Sand that are normally on the ground in the parking lot. The Officer requested Fire as well as other patrol Officers respond to the area to attempt to locate an Arson suspect. Another Officer located a 42 year old male, of San Pablo, hiding behind a stack of wooden pallets to the rear of Home Depot. The subject was detained and had two large torch lighters inside his pockets. The subject was found to be on Misdemeanor Probation in Contra Costa County. The Officer was able to extinguish the fire before Rodeo-Hercules Fire arrived. The Officer did a secondary search of the front of Home Depot and saw two Home Depot bucket signs knocked over. The Officer searched the outdoor sheds at the front of the store and found one shed that also had a fire recently started inside. Fire responded and hosed down the shed as well as the remnants of the first fire. The subject seemed ill and appeared to be about to pass out. AMR was requested and responded to medically evaluate the subject. The subject was not transported and signed a release. The subject was transported to HPD. While in the booking room the subject fell off his chair causing a cut to his head. AMR was again requested and responded to the back lot of the PD. It was determined the subject needed to be transported to the hospital for further evaluation. The subject was cited and released before being transported to County Hospital by Ambulance.

Warrant Arrest – Towed Vehicle: On September 14, 2020 at 5:06 a.m. An Officer did a traffic stop on a Silver '01 Audi TT for a vehicle code violation. The 42 year old male driver, of Antioch, was found to have an expired driver's license. The subject also had two outstanding non-citable Misdemeanor. The first warrant, was out of Solano County (Benicia P.D.) issued on August 4, 2019. The second warrant, was out of Fremont P.D. issued on September 25, 2019. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Grand Theft: On September 14, 2020, at 7:06 AM, an Officer was dispatched to the 300 block of Turquoise Drive for a theft report. The reporting party stated, sometime between 8:00PM last night and 6:55AM this morning, an unknown suspect stole the catalytic converter from his 2008 Toyota Prius LP which was parked on the street in front of the residence.

Warrant Arrest/Possession Of a Controlled Substance For Sale: On September 14, 2020, at 10:03 AM, an Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a 1998 Ford Econo-line van, for no license plates. The adult male driver was found to have a warrant for his arrest. Upon conducting an impound inventory search, the Officer located a substance, suspected narcotics in the driver side door. The subject was arrested and transported back to HPD. The amount of the substance was sufficient to charge the subject with Possession for Sales. While at the station the subject became ill. An ambulance was called and transported the subject to the hospital. The subject was released pending additional charges. The warrant was put back into the system.

Outside Assist: On September 14, 2020, at 11:11 AM, HPD Officers responded to 100 block of John Street, in Rodeo, to assist CCSO on a call. A subject called dispatch and stated he had just killed his parents and he was still armed with a firearm. HPD units assisted with covering the rear perimeter (Parker between 1st and 2nd). Officers were on scene until being cleared by CCSO about an hour later. The incident appeared to be a swatting call.

Fraudulent Use of A Credit Card: On September 14, 2020, at 2:26 PM, an Officer was dispatched to the 1500 block of Chelsea for a fraud report. The reporting party told the Officer that someone used her debit card information to make two unauthorized purchases.

Stolen Vehicle: On September 15, 2020 at 4:42 a.m. An Officer was dispatched to the 500 block of Falcon Way to take a stolen vehicle report for a White '13 Dodge Ram 1500. The Officer contacted the reporting party who said he woke up and found his truck stolen. The victim last saw his truck parked in front of his house at 9:00 p.m. last night.
