Shoplifting: On September 23, 2020 at 10:06 am, officers were dispatched to 1551 Sycamore (Big Lots) for the report of a theft. It was reported an adult male walked into the store wearing a green camo jacket and black jeans. Subject left with a comforter set and pots and pans. The suspect left in a light blue check

Identity Theft: On September 23, 2020 at 11:23 am, an officer was dispatched to the 1100 block of Promenade St. for an identity theft report. The victim stated that she was contacted by a previous employer regarding an unemployment claim. The victim stated she did not file for unemployment and wanted to make a police report for someone filing a claim using her information.

Domestic Violence: On September 24, 2020 at 12:04 AM, officers responded to an OnStar activation from a vehicle, registered in the 1000 block of Rock Harbor, with a female heard crying. Officers contacted the female who stated she was choked by her husband and she had scratch marks on her neck. The male was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. No Emergency Protective Order was desired.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On September 24, 2020 at 2:24 pm, officers were dispatched to the area of Willow Ave and San Pablo Ave for an elderly female walking down Willow Ave. Officers located the 87 year old female walking on Willow at the I80 WB on Ramp. She was given a ride home.

Out of State Warrant Arrest: On September 24, 2020 at 3:39 pm, officers were dispatched to the area of Tsushima and Central for a suspicious subject. Officers contacted a 31 year old male, out of Washington State, sitting on a bench in the 2000 block of Tsushima St. The subject had two extraditable warrants out of Washington. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Natural Death: On September 25, 2020 at 9:23 am, officers were dispatched to the 500 block of Falcon Way for CPR instructions being give over the phone. Officers arrived on scene. Rodeo Hercules Fire and AMR arrived at the same time and took over CPR. The officers determined the 65 year old female had a history of medical issues. Despite the efforts of paramedics, the subject was pronounced deceased at 9:55 am. The Contra Costa County Coroner released the body to the family.

Warrant Arrest / Possession of Controlled Substance: On September 25, 2020 at 1:32pm, an officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop on a 2008 Nissan Sentra due to the driver not wearing a seatbelt, and no front plate on the vehicle. The 31 year old male driver, of Richmond, was determined to have a Felony no bail warrant. The subject was searched, incident to arrest, and was found to have 4 small baggies of a substance suspected to be a

narcotic. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility for the warrant and possession of a controlled substance.

Theft from Unlocked Vehicle: On September 25, 2020 at 3:59 pm, an officer was dispatch for the report of a theft from a vehicle at the intersection of Sycamore Ave and San Pablo Ave. The victim parked his truck to put out political signs. While he was gone someone opened his truck and stole an iPad and cell phone. The victim was later contacted by a postal worker who found his cell phone.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On September 25, 2020 at 5:41 pm, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Topaz Ct. Officers contacted the reporting party who stated that her 21 year old son had recently been stabbed and arrested in San Jose. The son bailed out of jail early this morning and was picked up by an unknown subject, in a Silver Ford Fusion. The reporting party noticed a gun was missing from the house. She thinks her son maybe en route to find the person who stabbed him. The reporting party does not know who that person is. San Jose PD was notified. Case taken for documentation

Natural Death: On September 25, 2020. 8:52 PM, Rodeo Hercules Fire requested police respond, to the 100 block of Kensington Circle, for a 61-year-old diseased male. The male reportedly had diagnosed medical issues. No signs of foul play were noted, and the coroner released the body to the family.

Petty Theft: On September 25, 2020, at 11:26 PM, a Jack in the Box employee reported her purse was stolen from behind the counter on September 23, 2020. Video showed a suspect taking the purse. The suspect appears to be a male transient who frequents the area/store.

Domestic Battery no Prosecution: On September 26, 2020 at 3:56 pm, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Glenwood for a possible domestic dispute. Officers contacted a 34 year old female and a 70 year old male. Both parties had conflicting stories as to what happened. Neither party wanted anything done and neither party had any injuries. Case taken for documentation and will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for review.

Shoplifting/Trespassing: On September 27, 2020, at approximately 7:53 am, Officers were dispatched to My Goods Market located at 828 Willow Avenue for an unwanted subject who also stole merchandise from the store. Officers contacted the 27 year old female suspect. The suspect was served with a no trespass notice last week, and she also stole an item from the store at that time. The subject has stolen a number of items from the store for the last several weeks. The subject was positively identified by the manager and placed under arrest for shoplifting and trespassing. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Shoplifting: On September 27, 2020, at approximately 1:01 pm, HPD officers were dispatched to Lucky for a theft which just occurred. Three male adults and one female adult, entered the store, filled up three shopping carts full of groceries totaling approximately \$750.00, and left the store without paying. There was a waiting vehicle outside with an adult male driver. The suspects all loaded up the merchandise and left the area.

Petty Theft: On September 27, 2020, at approximately 4:51 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Big Lots for the theft of a wallet. Sometime between 3:00 pm, and 4:30 pm today an employee's wallet was stolen from the break room. The credit cards were used at Shell after the theft.

Cultivating Marijuana: On September 27, 2020, at approximately 4:54 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to a fire in a front yard, in the 600 block of Turquoise. Officers determined there was an active underground electrical fire in the front yard area. Occupants, from nearby residences, were evacuated for safety reasons. There was no response at the house, where the fire was located. Fire said they needed to clear the house to make sure there was no active fire, occupants, or other safety concern inside the residence. Entry was forced into the residence and two upstairs rooms were determined to be used for cultivating marijuana. A detective was called out to handle the investigation. PG&E was called out to restore power to residents and the fire was put out.

Lost Property: On September 27, 2020, at approximately 6:20 an Officer was detailed to a lost wallet report. The reporting party lost his wallet containing his driver's license and some credit cards sometime between 5:00 and 5:45 pm today in Refugio Valley Park.

Failure to yield – Evading a Peace Officer: On September 27, 2020 at 10:03 p.m. an Officer attempted to do a traffic stop on a Black '95 Honda Civic, in the 4000 block of San Pablo Ave, for a third brake light out. The driver failed to yield and drove 55-60 mph from the W/B I-80 on-ramp to El Portal Dr. where he finally yielded. The 26 year old male driver, of San Pablo, told the Officer his flashing red/blue lights were too bright, and he did not know he was being stopped. The subject was cited and released.
