Tennis Practice Wall Reconstruction

The reconstruction of the tennis court practice wall in Refugio Valley Park will be starting shortly which is being done on a design/build basis and is our first uniform cost accounting based project, an expedited basis to undertake capital projects. Refugio Tennis Court 1 will be closed from 8/22 to 9/16 for construction of the new tennis wall.

Hercules Bayfront Properties Change Hands

The Hercules Bayfront property changed hands on Wednesday, August 10th, with a new partnership taking ownership of this important future development site which will also include the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center. MUIR POINT MODEL PERMIT BEING ISSUED TODAY!!!

The first 5 homes of the new Muir Pointe subdivision are being issued today as part of the 144 single family detached home subdivision located on John Muir Parkway between Alfred Noble and Linus Pauling Drive by Taylor Morrison. It is anticipated that the models will be completed in about 3 months and sales should begin in about 45 days from a temporary trailer being setup on site. AVENTINE PROGRESS CONTINUES

One hundred and eight (109) leases have been signed and 90 apartment units are occupied at the mixed use building on Sycamore Avenue (which represents 61-73% occupancy of the 147 apartment units, but excludes the 10,000 square feet of commercial space). If all goes as planned the building may be fully rented up well before Christmas and the last touches of the project, included the parking district will be operational. If you haven't toured the building yet, it contains multiple community amenities including a full fitness center, billiards/tv/entertainment room, dog washing room, 2 large outdoor terraces with fire and water features, yoga studio, library, community bicycles, and of course is anticipated to have some retail or restaurant uses in the near future. UPDATE OF CHELSEA WETLANDS COMMUNITY FIELD MEETING of AUGUST 8, 2016

About 12 members of the public, 2 representatives from Ducks Unlimited, and 2 representatives from the City came out to the Chelsea wetlands site at Sante Fe and Railroad Avenue last week to better understand the City's proposed project and consider some proposed modifications based on community comments. As part of the environmental review of the project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) the City did additional community outreach to try to understand the community's needs, wants, and concerns. The City's consultant team is examining all comments brought up in the field as well as comments received in writing by August 22, 2016 so that all comments can be collectively reviewed with the City Council at their September 13, 2016 public hearing. 
SYCAMORE CROSSING ANNOUNCEMENT **COMMUNITY OPEN HOUSE – TUESDAY AUGUST 23, 2016 6-7:30PM**

The Lewis Group of Companies has entered into an agreement to acquire the stalled Sycamore Crossing project site from the Successor Agency of the City of Hercules Redevelopment Agency. Lewis is one of the nation's leading developers of mixed-use master planned communities and has developed extensively throughout Central Hercules for over 10 years. There have been numerous plans for development of the Sycamore Crossing site for well over a decade that have not come to fruition. Most recently, Terramar Retail Centers abandoned plans to develop a Safeway anchored shopping center and terminated its agreement to acquire the site from the Successor Agency.

Lewis is taking a fresh look at planning the site and envisions a mixture of uses including smaller scale community serving retail, housing, trails, environmental preservation and opportunities for outdoor gathering which draw from elements more reminiscent of the goals of the Central Hercules Plan. Lewis has prepared various alternatives for the development of the site and hopes to gain approvals from the City and begin construction in 2017. Lewis' goal is to create a strong sense of place along the Sycamore Avenue corridor by having all buildings face the street and take advantage of the activity surrounding the recently completed Aventine project on the opposite side of Sycamore Avenue from the site.

An open house will be held on August 23rd in the Large Meeting Room at the Hercules Library at 109 Civic Drive, Hercules where members of the public will have an opportunity to review these concepts for development of the site and engage in discussions with members of the

project team. Feel free to drop by at any time **between 6:00 PM and 7:30 PM** and help support the activation of development of this long dormant site.



PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, repaired street lights hit by vehicles, and trimmed trees in open space. Staff is also awarding contracts for the Refugio Valley tree trimming, Citywide sidewalk replacements at various locations, and lighting repairs in Victoria By the Bay. The Refugio Valley Tennis Backboard Repair contract has been awarded and construction is anticipated to begin next week.

Engineering – Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is well underway. The contractor is constructing Bayfront Bridge which will span over Refugio Creek and the new sewer line along Bayfront Boulevard as well as rechanneling Refugio Creek. The Bay Trail West segment is under design and slated for construction Summer 2017. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development completed the public waterline installation on Muir Point Boulevard and is installing the underground utilities on-site. The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. Construction on the \$1.1M Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation will be substantially completed by the end of this week, before the start of school. Construction is underway on the public improvements for Aventine.

Special Community and Library Services Commission Meeting/Park Tour:

The City Council has asked the Community and Library Services Commission (CLSC) to determine if there is community interest in adding a modular restroom building in Duck Pond Park and a small sports amenity (such as a half basketball court) in a park on the west side of town. In this regard, the CLSC has scheduled a special meeting/park tour on Monday, August 22 at 6:30 p.m. The Commission will convene the meeting in the City Council Chamber and then proceed to tour the parks on the west side of town. The public is invited to join the Commission on the tour and provide input. City vans will be used for the tour and the public is invited to ride along. In addition to the tour, the public will have several opportunities to provide their input on these potential projects. The Commission will hold one or more public workshops on this topic beginning in September. There will also be a city-wide survey conducted to gauge the community's interest in these projects. Public Intoxication On August 4th 2016 at approximately 8:53pm, a HPD Officer conducted a pedestrian stop on a subject who was having difficulty walking in the area of San Pablo Avenue and Linus Pauling Drive. During the course of contact the officer determined Sandeep Singh of Hercules, was unable to care for himself due to his level of intoxication. Singh was arrested and transported to the hospital for observation and cite/released.

Shop Lifting and Battery On August 4th 2016 at approximately 11:34pm, an Officer was dispatched to Home Depot for a subject who was taken into custody by loss prevention for shop lifting. Richard Hovorka of Vallejo, ran out of the business with merchandise and was apprehended by loss prevention. A struggle ensued and Hovorka punched one of the loss prevention officers in the face. Hovorka was transported to the Hercules Police Department and cite released.

Assault with a Deadly Weapon/Felony Vandalism On August 5th 2016 at approximately 6:21am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 300 block of North Wildwood for annoying/harassing phone calls. While enroute, dispatch advised that a possible vandalism was occurring. When officers arrived they contacted the victim who stated that his ex-girlfriend's current boyfriend had broken out the windows of his 2002 Nissan Altima with a baseball bat. During the investigation it was determined the suspect arrived at victim's house and attempted to hit him with a baseball bat. Suspect then used the baseball bat to break out the windows of victim's car. The suspect left the area, prior to police arrival, in a gold 1992 Honda Accord.

Domestic Violence On August 6th 2016 at approximately 9:34pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Coronado Way for a fight between a husband and wife. Upon arrival, it was determined that the husband had left the scene. The victim stated she did not desire prosecution.

Stolen Vehicle: On August 7, 2016 at 7:12pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Cinnabar to take a stolen vehicle report. The reporting party said an unknown subject stole his silver 2003 Honda Accord. The resident's surveillance camera showed the vehicle being stolen at about 4:00am on August 6, 2016, shortly after being parked.

Mental Health Evaluation: On August 7, 2016 at 5:27pm, Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Lilac Circle for a report of a suicide attempt. Reporting party stated a family member ingested several pills. Officers arrived along with Rodeo-Hercules Fire and contacted all parties on scene. The victim was transported to the hospital to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance.

Burglary/Vandalism: On August 8, 2016 at 10:15am, an Officer was dispatched to Hercules Middle School, 1900 Refugio Valley Road for a report of a vandalism to the middle school's

cafeteria floor that occurred over the weekend. An unknown suspect entered the locked cafeteria (no signs of forced entry) between 4:00pm Friday, 8/5/16 and 7:15am today. The unknown suspect took a golf cart from inside the cafeteria and drove it around inside causing damage. A locking wheel boot was cut off the golf cart which was found abandoned outside of the school.

Identity Theft: On August 9, 2016 at 7:31am, a Supervisor processed an online police report regarding an identity theft. The reporting party stated an unknown suspect gained access to her PayPal account and fraudulently ordered a pair of shoes. The shoes were shipped to an address in Miami, Florida.

Identity Theft: On August 9, 2016 at 12:25pm, an Officer handled a lobby detail regarding an identity theft. The reporting party said she received a statement from One.com indicating she had ordered an online subscription to their website. The reporting party did not subscribe to the web site.

Miscellaneous Information/Firearm taken for Safekeeping: On August 9, 2016 at 11:51am, an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail. A 42 year old female stated, her 38 year old ex-boyfriend has been harassing her by calling her and driving by her apartment. The reporting party recently found out the ex-boyfriend left a handgun inside her apartment. The reporting party stated she did not want the gun in her residence. She requested the Police take the gun for safe keeping.

Vehicle vs pedestrian, non-injury collision: Officers were dispatched to the 2100 block of Lewis Street for a report of intentional vehicle versus pedestrian collision. The reporting party is a 38 year old female. She stated the 42 year old male driver, of a Chrysler minivan, intentionally hit her three separate times with his vehicle. It was determined the driver was attempting to back into an available parking spot in front of his residence. The reporting party was apparently attempting to hold the parking space for another party. The reporting party placed herself behind the minivan, in an attempt to block the driver from parking. The reporting party said the van struck her left knee three times. Rodeo/Hercules, and an ambulance, examined the reporting party, who later declined medical treatment or transportation. After being examined the reporting party went home. Officers attempted to re-contact the reporting party and she declined any further statement.

Hit and Run (in connection to above incident) Sometime during the above incident an unknown vehicle intentionally sideswiped the Chrysler minivan. The collision resulted in minor to moderate damage to the minivan and unknown damage to the suspect vehicle. The vehicle fled the scene prior to Officers' discovering the collision occurred. Witnesses stated the suspect vehicle is associated reporting party from the above incident.

Trespassing: On August 10, 2016 at 7:50am, Hercules Officers were dispatched to the Dental Office, in the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue for a report of a suspicious person. The reporting party stated an adult male was again sleeping, on private property, near their business. The reporting party said it was the same subject Officers dealt with yesterday for the same thing. Officers had contacted the Property's Owner who stated he would sign a Citizens' Arrest form if the male returned. Yesterday, the subject was contacted and told he would be arrested if he returned to the property. Today Officers contacted 22 year old Aaron Bustos (Transient). Bustos was uncooperative and refused to leave. Officers arrested him for Trespassing and transported him to the Martinez Detention Facility. His personal items were placed into Evidence for

Safekeeping.

Possession of Burglary Tools/Possession of a Controlled Substance/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia/PRCS hold: On August 10, 2016 at 9:47am, Hercules Officers were dispatched to the parking lot of Bank of America, 1611 Sycamore Avenue, for a report of an adult male driver spinning donuts in an older Silver 2DR Mazda. The reporting party said the male had just been a customer inside the bank and was seen walking around looking into parked vehicles near Bank of America. The reporting party pointed to the car, and driver, parked nearby. The driver was contacted and was determined to be on searchable probation out of Alameda County. During a compliance search officers found a glass pipe, commonly used to smoke narcotics; a small twist tied baggie containing a substance believed to be narcotics; and a pair of bolt cutters. 41 year old Mario Washington was arrested for the above charges. Washington was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Found Property – Loaded Pistol Magazine: On August 10, 2016 at 10:46am, an Officer responded to the area of Sycamore Avenue near Claeys Ranch to meet with a Hercules Public Works employee. The reporting party said he found a loaded magazine, for a firearm, while picking up dumped items in the area. The officer examined the magazine and determined it contained live rounds. Officers checked the area but didn't locate a firearm. The loaded 1 magazine was placed into Evidence and a Trak flyer is being sent out to surrounding agencies.

Battery: On August 10, 2016 at 6:10pm, Officers were dispatched, for an assault, to the 100 block Paradise Drive. The reporting party stated her 14 year old son was just punched by another 14 year old. The officer contacted both parties and the Mother of the victim desired a report.

Domestic Violence Restraining Order/Probation Violation: On August 11th 2016 at approximately 12:34am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Chelsea for a verbal disturbance between an adult male and female. Officers contacted the reporting party, a 59 year old female. It was determined there was a criminal protective order instructing the male to keep away from the female. The order had been properly served. The male was also determined to be on probation, for domestic violence, with a stay away condition to keep him away from the reporting party. 64 year old Michael Harpe was placed under arrest for the two mentioned violations and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Auto burglary/ possession of stolen property/ possession of ammunition by a convicted felon/ possessing illegal drug paraphernalia. On August 11, 2016 at 3:30pm, an Officer stopped a vehicle in the 1500 block of Sycamore for a vehicle code violation. The passenger, Darrell Allen of Antioch, was found to be on felony probation. During a compliance search of the vehicle an officer located a single 12 gauge unspent shotgun round in a backpack that Allen claimed as belonging to him. In the trunk, officers also located a cardboard box that contained mail not belonging to Allen or the adult female driver. An Apple IPAD was also located in the same box. The Officer also located a metal container which contained drug paraphernalia. Allen was arrested for possessing ammunition and illegal drug paraphernalia. The mail and the IPAD was collected for further investigation. At HPD, the Officer was able to make contact with the owners of the mail. One of the owners of the mail had been a victim of an auto burglary sometime between 12:30pm and 4:00pm today. The mail and the IPAD located had been in her vehicle prior to the burglary. The burglary occurred on WB Hwy 4 prior to the Willow Ave exit. The victim did not

know Allen and did not give Allen permission to possess her property. Allen was charged with the auto burglary, the possession of stolen property, the possession of ammunition by a convicted felon, and for possessing illegal drug paraphernalia. He was transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.
