New Additions to Hercules' Team Dynamic

Lori Martin has joined the City as our new Director of Administrative Services/City Clerk. Lori comes to us from the City of Waterford in Central California and is a Master Municipal Clerk. The Parks & Recreation Department has hired a new Recreation Coordinator, Austin George, who also started this week. Austin will have oversight of Aquatics, Seniors and Rec Classes.

John Muir Boulevard Extensions and Bayfront Bridge Open

The recently completed extension of John Muir Parkway and the new bridge across Refugio Creek connecting to Bayfront Boulevard opened this morning, Monday, March 20th, for public use. This Path to Transit Phase of the Hercules Regional Intermodal Transportation Center was completed with a variety of Federal, State, and Regional grant funds and paves the way for the balance of the project and the complimentary transit oriented development to be built in the area. Please note that there will be additional street work undertaken by developer Taylor Morrison over the next few months on that portion of John Muir Parkway adjacent to the Muir Pointe community under construction may have some impacts on the days that street work is being done.

2017 Sister City Trip to Tsushima

Hercules residents are encouraged to become part of the 2017 delegation which will travel to our sister city of Tsushima, Japan, from July 19th to July 30th this year. Four Youth Ambassadors have already been chosen and are hard at work preparing for the trip. This year's delegation will spend four days in Tsushima including being there for the 2 day Tenno Festival that began more than five centuries ago and is one of Japan's biggest river festivals. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They filled potholes, replaced signs, repaired streetlights, and oversaw the quarterly cleaning of the Victoria Lift Station. The streetlight LED upgrade project in the Business Park is nearing completion.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is substantially completed. The contractor is working on the punch list items. The Bay Trail West segment has been designed and is slated for construction Summer 2017. Staff has secured the environmental permits for the project. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development completed installing the utilities on John Muir Parkway. The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward on schedule, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. The project will span 3 years and is 33% complete. The City’s pavement management program update is nearing completion and staff is focusing on transportation-related grant funding opportunities, designing this spring’s street resurfacing projects, and preparing to bid out cleaning the sanitary sewer collection system and the corps yard modular building replacement. The pool re-plastering project at the Community Center has been substantially completed.

AQUATICS:

Swim Teams:

Hercules High School Swim Teams returned to the City of Hercules Swim Center on Monday, March 6. Then held their first home swim meet of the season on Friday, March 10. Everyone is very excited to be back in the pool.

Year round registration for the Hercules East Bay Silver Dolphins is picking up with the return to the Hercules pool, and nicer weather. To join the team, swimmers must be able to swim 25 yards unassisted; swim practices are based on the swimmer's swimming ability which is determined by the coaching staff. Beginners are classified as Spinners (\$80 per month), intermediate swimmers are classified as Age Group (\$86 per month), and the advanced swimmers are the Advance Group (\$96 per month). At the time of registration, the swimmer's first and last month's dues are paid in full, as well as a USA swimmer fee of \$80 made payable to EBSD.

The Piranhas swim held their first board meeting at the Swim Center on Wednesday, March 22. They are in the process of gearing up for the start of their program. Meet dates are being finalized.

Lap Swim Hours:

Lap swim is now available. As of March 6, Lap Swimming and Water Walking has returned to the City of Hercules Swim Center. Lap Swimming is available from 6-7pm, Monday through Friday through the spring (through April). Saturday lap swim will begin in June.

Lifeguard Training:

The next training is April 3-6 Monday-Thursday. The Lifeguard Training course includes American Red Cross lifeguard training, CPR/Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for lifeguards, and First Aid certifications; all the requirements needed to apply for a lifeguarding position.

CHILD CARE:

Tiny Tots Programs (Preschool):

Registration for next school year started Wednesday, March 23, 2017 at the Community Swim Center at 9:00am. We had 30+ families in line to register everyone got into the Preschool class they wanted. We brought in over \$12,000 dollars in the one hour of registration.

Our current Jr. Kindergarten class can sign up for our summer camp program, since this

program begins at age 5 and goes up through fifth grade. We did have four families who signed up for the Summer Camp for several weeks of the camp.

2016-2017 K-5th Grade Before & After School program:

Spring Camp 2017 is now taking enrollment for the week of April 3 – 7 at the Lupine site. At this time we only have 3 enrollments, our current families are telling us there going on vacation this week. I need 14 children enrolled in order to have camp run.

We hired a new Leader I 19 hours per week to work at the Lupine Child Care site. She should start March 13, 2017 and we can't wait to have her start.

Officers walked down to the address located on the identification card to attempt to do a welfare check on the female. Officers found the exterior of the house to be in poor condition and the home appeared to be vacant. Officers knocked on the front door and were met by a male and a female told officers they had been staying at the house for the past two days and were asked by a guy named, "Russ", to clean up the house in exchange for a room to rent. They told Officers he changed the front door's lock and had the new house key. Officers identified the female Christina Lamb 25 year old Transient. Lamb was found to have an outstanding Felony No Bail Warrant for 245 (a) (4) PC and 422 PC out of Concord P.D. Lamb was arrested and later transported to MDF

Unlawful Cultivation of Marijuana/72 Hour Psychiatric Commitment: On March 22, 2017 at 5:32 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to an address in the 100 block of Hemlock Ct. to do a welfare check at the request of CFS. CFS stated that a 14 year old juvenile who resides at the home told them there were four rooms he couldn't go into because they are full of "things." The juvenile also told CFS there were Rats inside the home. CFS also told Officers that the juvenile's Mother, does not live there but was staying with her son while his Father was out of town. Officers arrived at the home to do a welfare check of the juvenile and of the home's living conditions. Officers were given consent to do a welfare check of the home. While inside, Officers saw the downstairs of the home (living room) had been converted into the only bedroom. The downstairs was extremely dirty with rat droppings and other animal droppings on the carpet/floor. A downstairs bedroom had been converted to illegally cultivate Marijuana. Officers found the entire upstairs of the home had also been illegally converted to cultivate Marijuana. Officers found approximately 150-200 immature Marijuana plants being cultivated in one of the upstairs bedrooms. Officers obtained a search warrant and the plants were removed from the house. The Juvenile was also taken by Children and Family Services.
