Community Clean-up Day

Please help keep Hercules clean and take advantage of our Community Clean Up Day on Saturday from 8 AM to 11 PM at the City's Corporation Yard on Sycamore Avenue. Residents are able to dispose of unwanted items and we will also be accepting e-waste, but sorry, no household hazardous waste at this event.

Keep Your Dog On Leash

Did you know that a local ordinance requires your dog to be on leash at all time outside your home or yard? That includes parks, trails and sidewalks anywhere in Hercules. The only exception is at the Dog Park in Ohlone Park where we encourage our four legged friends to run off-leash to their hearts content when in the enclosed dog park spaces.

First Phase of Bayfront Development

On Monday this week the Planning Commission completed their design review and approved the first phase of the Waterfront District Master Plan in the form a mixed-use building to be located where John Muir Parkway meets Bayfront Boulevard. This mixed use building with 172 residential units and ground floor retail and commercial uses is expected to start construction later this year. There will also be pocket parks at each end of the building along with pedestrian oriented improvements along the Creekside trail. We expect the developer to be submitting their next phase for consideration in the next 90 days or so. As expected, the completion of the extension of John Muir Parkway and related improvements set the stage for the project to proceed.

Landscape & Lighting District Balloting

Property owners in six of the City's Landscape & Lighting Assessment District zones have received ballots regarding increased assessments to replace the failing hollow core streetlight poles with new energy efficient poles and fixtures, pay a fair share of the maintenance costs of the City's arterials, and to, in some instances, eliminate operating shortfalls. The ballot indicates the address of the property subject to the assessment and would have been mailed to the address of the owner, which is sometimes different. If you own more than one property in Hercules, be sure to check which property is covered by the ballot. We encourage you to vote and to be sure to return your ballot before the public hearing on the assessment on Tuesday, June 13th at 7 PM. Waterfront – Bayfront Project on Block “N” - APPROVED

The Planning Commission held a final Design Review public hearing May 1st meeting at 7pm for a proposed 162 apartments and 10 townhome style residential units and approximately 6,800 square feet of retail space and 205 underground parking spaces and 20 at grade garage spaces at the corner of Bayfront Boulevard and John Muir Parkway and Refugio Creek. Planning Commission unanimously approved the project. Designs for the project are attached to the May 1st Planning Commission agenda at:

The Developer has been working concurrently to get their approvals and permits from the Design Review Board of the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) due to the proximity of the project to Refugio Creek and the Creek Trail.

SPECIAL NEWS BULLETIN: ANNUAL LANDSCAPE & LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT RENEWAL PROCESS

The City has launched the annual renewal process for Landscape & Lighting Assessment Districts (LLADs) which provide funding for the maintenance of parks, landscaping, and street lighting throughout the City and in neighborhood-specific zones, helping to keep our neighborhoods safe, clean and our property values maintained. LLADs are intended to provide a fair, equitable way to allocate street lighting and landscaping expenses to the properties that benefit from them. The renewal process will culminate in a public hearing on June 13, 2017, before the City Council. For six (6) of the ten (10) zones in the City-wide District, there will be a Proposition 218 balloting process undertaken for affected property owners to consider increased assessments to eliminate operating deficits, replace deteriorating hollow core wood street light poles with low maintenance metal poles with cost-saving LED lighting, and fund the maintenance of the City's arterial streets on a more equitable basis. Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They also removed trees in Refugio Valley Park, repaired streetlights and irrigation lines, and completed the quarterly cleaning and testing all the Willow Lift Station.

Engineering – Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is substantially completed. The contractor is working on the final punch list items. The Bay Trail West segment has been designed and is slated for construction Summer 2017. Caltrans recently provided their authorization to proceed with the construction phase of this grant-funded project. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development completed installing the utilities on John Muir Parkway and staff is coordinating on the frontage improvements. The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward on schedule, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. The project will span 3 years and is 38% complete. Design on this summer's street slurry sealing project is nearing completion. It will be coordinated with work being performed by EBMUD and PG&E. You may notice streets in the Flowers, Trees, and Heights neighborhoods are marked with paint to identify existing utilities and future repair areas associated with this work. Staff is also preparing to bid out cleaning the sanitary sewer collection system and annual striping contract. The Corp Yard modular building replacement, Swim Center small pool heater replacement, and Annual Landscaping Contract are all out to bid. The final design contract for the West Side Sports Amenity is in the process of being executed.



Petty Theft: On April 20, 2017, a Supervisor processed an online report regarding a theft. During a wants and warrant check Burton was found to have a no-bail warrant out of Chico. Burton was arrested and transported the Martinez Detention Facility.

Traffic Collision: On April 20, 2017 at 5:25pm, officers were dispatched to a two-car collision on Canterbury at Worthing. Officers located the collision. During the investigation it was learned there were two young children in one of the vehicles. One of the children was complaining of head pain. Paramedics evaluated the children for injuries. They were cleared by Paramedics and released to a relative. Both drivers denied fault and declined medical attention. Both vehicles sustained minor damage and were driven away

Vandalism: On April 21, 2017 at 2:14pm, an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Riverview for a report of a mailbox that had been pried open. The officer located three boxes which had been pried open. It is unknown at this time if any mail was stolen.

The reporting party said one of the involved parties' was in a vehicle and was revving the engine. Officers located a Tan '04 Nissan Altima stopped, in the middle of the roadway, on Meadowlark Way at Bluebird Ct. The driver, a 20 year Fairfield resident, was contacted. He had a fresh cut/welt to his forehead and his t-shirt was torn. He told Officers he just got into a fight with his ex-boyfriend. Officers contacted the 23 year old boyfriend, who had lacerations to his mouth. Both subjects declined medical treatment. Officers determined the first male (the 20 year old) was the primary aggressor during the fight. The male was arrested for Misdemeanor Spousal Abuse. While at HPD, he complained of a shortness of breath. AMR responded. The male was released, from custody, and transported to Kaiser Hospital – Vallejo. The case will be referred to the District Attorney.

The male was seated, at the elevated portion of the park spiral walkway & staircase, when a tree came down and hit him. The male was treated by Fire and transported by ambulance. Officers used police caution tape and "A" frame barriers to close off the area leading to the elevated portion of the park. Public Works was contacted.
