FY 2017/18 Proposed Budget

Budget season is upon us and the City Council will receive an introduction to the proposed FY 2017/18 budget at their meeting next week. There will be two public hearings on the proposed budget, June 13th and 27th. Look for the proposed budget to be available on the City's website in the next few days.

West Side Transit Discussion

As part of our efforts to update the Circulation Element of the General Plan, the City is going to be hosting a Westside Transit Discussion on Tuesday, May 30th at 7 PM in the City Council Chambers. With the completion earlier this year of the Path to Transit Phase of the Hercules Regional Intermodal Transportation Center and the first phases of private development along the waterfront recently approved, the vision of this area being a truly transit-oriented community is coming to fruition. Residents are invited to participate in this discussion to learn and share ideas about transit options and what will make a transit oriented community a success.

Know Someone Who is Homelessness or Risk?

Contra Costa County Health Services and the Contra Costa Council on Homeless have resources available to assist those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Those in need can call 211 for a referral to resources or can walk into a care center for assistance with the one nearest to Hercules being Anka Behavioral Health at 1515 Market Avenue, San Pablo, open M – F from 8 AM to 5 PM. Donation Boxes

There have been clothing donation boxes popping up around town. The company which places these boxes is doing so without any permits for placing them on public property and we are requesting that they be removed and are removing them ourselves if they are not removed in a timely manner. For those boxes being placed on private property, they are often being done so without the permission of the property owner. There has also been considerable publicity about the for-profit nature of many of these companies which attempt to mimic legitimate non-profits, so if your intent is to make a donation to a charitable entity, please be sure to do your homework or go to a donation center of an organization with which you are already familiar.

Movie Night

Tentatively mark your calendar for a family movie night in Refugio Valley Park on Friday, June 30th. The City hosted two movie nights last summer and we are planning for three this summer.

Fernandez Ranch Open Space Expansion

On Saturday June 3, 2017, the John Muir Land Trust is holding a property dedication and public opening of its newly expanded, 1,185-acre Fernandez Ranch property off Highway 4 near Hercules, CA. The 483-acre property formerly known as Franklin Canyon is merging into adjacent Fernandez Ranch and receiving visitors for the first time. This pristine natural landscape is an extraordinary public resource within minutes of some of the most densely populated areas of the East Bay. There is a dedication ceremony at 10:30am. Afterwards, there will be a guided hike of the property– it is also National Trails Day!

- Serves as the Oversight Committee for Measure “A,” including providing an annual report, to ensure that utility user tax funds are spent in accordance with the voter approved measure adopted in June 2013.
- Serves as the Oversight Committee for Measure “O,” including providing an annual report, to ensure that the sales tax revenues approved by Hercules voters are spent in accordance with the voter approved measure adopted in June 2012.

SPECIAL NEWS BULLETIN: ANNUAL LANDSCAPE & LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT RENEWAL PROCESS

The City has launched the annual renewal process for Landscape & Lighting Assessment Districts (LLADs) which provide funding for the maintenance of parks, landscaping, and street lighting throughout the City and in neighborhood-specific zones, helping to keep our neighborhoods safe, clean and our property values maintained. LLADs are intended to provide a fair, equitable way to allocate street lighting and landscaping expenses to the properties that benefit from them. The renewal process will culminate in a public hearing on June 13, 2017, before the City Council. For six (6) of the ten (10) zones in the City-wide District, there will be a Proposition 218 balloting process undertaken for affected property owners to consider increased assessments to eliminate operating deficits, replace deteriorating hollow core wood street light poles with low maintenance metal poles with cost-saving LED lighting, and fund the maintenance of the City's arterial streets on a more equitable basis. Community meetings for Zones 3&4 Gems/Birds and Zone 7 Heights previously occurred the evening of Wednesday, May 17, at the Hercules Community Center.

Public Works Department

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They also had trees pruned and the lake aerators repaired in Refugio Park, completed the LED streetlight replacements in the Business Park, repaired streetlights throughout town, and started the Summer weed abatement program. Bids for the Corp Yard modular building replacement were opened and are under review.

Engineering – Construction on the \$12.6M Path to Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is substantially completed and will come before Council for approved next Tuesday. The Bay Trail West segment has been designed and is slated for construction Summer 2017. Caltrans recently provided their authorization to proceed with the construction phase of this grant-funded project. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development completed installing the utilities on John Muir Parkway and staff is coordinating on the frontage improvements. The \$46M

Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward on schedule, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. The project will span 3 years and is 38% complete. Design on this summer's street slurry sealing project is nearing completion. It will be coordinated with work being performed by EBMUD and PG&E. You may notice streets in the Flowers, Trees, and Heights neighborhoods are marked with paint to identify existing utilities and future repair areas associated with this work. Staff is also preparing to bid out cleaning the sanitary sewer collection system and annual striping contract.


