Safeway Planning Commission Approval

On Tuesday, September 5th, the Planning Commission undertook its final review and approved the Safeway project proposed for the site bounded by San Pablo, Highway 4, Interstate 80 and Sycamore. The final approvals needed will be before the City Council on Tuesday, September 26th. This development will feature a new Safeway store, fueling center and approximately 6,000 square feet of additional retail space.

Bayfront 1st Phase

The first phase of the Bayfront development, which will consist of 172 residential units and ground floor retail and commercial space, received its final needed permit approval from the Bay Conservation & Development Commission on September 7th. The project is in plan check with the County and it is anticipated that construction will start before the end of the year.

Muir Pointe Initial Occupancies

The first new homes in the Muir Pointe residential community on John Muir Parkway have been sold and occupied. Construction continues on the balance of the community. We would like to extend a warm welcome to our newest Hercules residents!

Bay Trail West

On Tuesday next week the City Council will consider award of the construction contract for the next phase of the Hercules Regional Intermodal Transportation Center. The Bay Trail West will see the Bay Trail from Railroad Avenue improved in the direction of Pinole to the existing trail near Santa Fe Avenue. This \$1.7 million grant funded project will also provide for an interim connection to Bayfront Boulevard at Railroad Avenue until the remaining Hercules segment between Railroad Avenue and John Muir parkway is completed as part of the Hercules Bayfront project.

The Commission is advisory to the Council and has the following duties:

- Develop plans and recommendations for parks, playgrounds, recreational facilities, and use of community buildings.
- Work with the Parks and Recreation Department on the development and evaluation of recreation programs and community activities/events.
- Provide assistance and support in the planning and operation of City sponsored community events.
- In cooperation and consultation with the Parks and Recreation Department, make recommendations to the City Council with respect to priorities for recreation, library, and community services expenditures in the City's capital improvement program.
- Review and comment on the annual operating and capital improvement budgets for the Parks and Recreation Department.
- Make recommendations with respect to community service needs such as child care, youth summer employment, senior activities/programs, and recreational programs.
- Review and make recommendations with respect to fees for the use of parks, playgrounds, recreational facilities, and community buildings.
- Advise on matters of policy and public interest related to the management, use and preservation of library facilities and property.
- Render such other specific services as are consistent with the role of an advisory board on the library system, to include recommendations and advice to the county librarian on matters related to the Hercules library.
- The Commission member serving as the City's Area Representative to the Contra Costa County Library Commission shall routinely report to the entire Community and Library Services Commission on actions taken at the Contra Costa Library Commission meetings.
- Review and make recommendations regarding the Arts in Public Places Program and exhibits at the Hercules Public Library.
- Oversee the Heritage Memorial Garden Plaque Program which is designed to recognize Hercules residents or civic leaders and enhance the historical aspect of the garden.

- Oversee the Library Art Exhibition Program which is designed to review art pieces submitted by participants of the program to be allowed to display their art pieces at the Hercules Public Library.
- Such other duties relating to recreation activities and community and library service needs as may be directed by the City Council.

- Serves as the Oversight Committee for Measure "O," including providing an annual report, to ensure that the sales tax revenues approved by Hercules voters are spent in accordance with the voter approved measure adopted in June 2012.

Planning Division

- City Departments approved Temporary Use Permit No. TUP 17-44 for the 2nd Annual “Social Bite” from 11am – 5pm on Saturday, September 16 along Bayfront Boulevard within the Hercules Waterfront. The event will include an Outdoor Family-Oriented Festival consisting of 2 live bands, 40+ food trucks and vendors, a car show, and stage performances by 2 dance groups, Hercules High and self-defense members.

City Council Consideration of Safeway Center

On Tuesday, September 26, 2017 at the 7pm City Council meeting the Safeway Center final project entitlements and environmental assessment will be considered for approval at a public hearing. The project is located at the north eastern corner of Sycamore and San Pablo Avenues on the 6.75 acre former park-and-ride lot. The project would contain:

- 57,100-square-foot Safeway with an attached interior Starbucks coffee shop and an exterior seating area
- 6,000-square-foot commercial building pad with two (2) drive-thrus (anticipated for Chase Bank and Peets Coffee)
- 2,500-square-foot convenience store/minimart attached to a 20-pump fueling center

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. Additionally, striping, tree trimming, re-lamping the

Hercules Transit Center, and potholing patching are being bid out. Street lights throughout town were repaired and the medians in the business park are being evaluated with respect to tree trimming and replacements as well as ground cover. New street name signs are in the process of being field tested.

Engineering –The summer slurry seal project was awarded and will be starting in August. Staff is preparing to bid out the sanitary sewer collection system cleaning & inspection and a solicitation is out for a part time contract sanitary sewer project manager.

The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward on schedule, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. The project will span 3 years, is over 50% complete at this time, and on schedule for completion in November 2018. The speed survey which confirms the speed limits on streets is nearing completion. Taylor Morrison, the developer for Muir Pointe, is completing public improvements on John Muir Parkway to allow for the first phase of occupancy. Bids were opened for the Bay Trail West Project and a recommendation to award a construction contract will go to Council for consideration on September 12. Construction on the 2017 slurry seal project has begun and will occur over the next several months.

AQUATICS:

Swim Lesson

Fall swim lessons are not only new, but we have an improved format as well. Our Fall lessons began Tuesday, September 5, with a new concept. All registered participants were grouped based on their ability each session. Rather than parents guessing what level their swimmer is. Staff performed tests on participants and were better able to group the registrants with other swimmers performing at the same level. This process was well received by parents and instructors.

Our next session still has several time slots available. Session 2 will begin on Tuesday, September 19th. Be sure to register early for group lessons and/or private swim lessons as space is limited. Fall swim lessons will run through October 14. We hope to see you pool side this Fall.

High School Water Polo

The Hercules High School Water Polo season is in full swing with their first game coming up next Wednesday, September 13, against the Concord High Minutemen. The Titans Water Polo team practices daily at the Hercules Swim Center and play their home games at Contra Costa Community College. If you have never seen a water polo game you are encouraged to come support the Hercules High Boys & Girls Teams and witness this exciting sport for yourself.

Lap Swim/Water Walking

Get your swim on at Hercules Swim Center. We have lap swimming and water walking M-F from 7-8pm, from now through December 15. If you are not familiar with swimming or water walking, experts say swimming is one of the best overall body workouts you can get. Not only are swim passes affordable, but they are great for individuals and/or families. Swimmers ages 14 and up can

Swim Team

Fall membership for the East Bay Silver Dolphins (EBS D) Swim Team began on Tuesday, September 5. EBS D is a year round USA Swim Team. Practice times are based on swimmers ability, not age. All swimmers must be between the ages of 5-18 to participate, and they must be able to swim 25 yards unassisted prior to joining the swim team.

The Dolphins participate in Pacific Swimming, a division of USA Swimming. The Dolphins participate in several USA Swim Meets throughout the year. KIDZ PROGRAMS:

Tiny Tots Programs (Preschool)

Preschool started August 28 and 29, and we are happy to say we made through our first week. The first week is always an adjustment, especially for the little ones. For most of the 3 year olds, this is their first experience away from their parents and/or families. As a consequence there are a lot of tears the first few days.

We are excited to have our Pre-Kindergarten program at the Lupine Kidz Center this year. So far we are off to a great start. At this time we'd like to recognize Jeff Brown and the Public Works Department for all their help in updating the Lupine Kidz Center with a new coat of paint, among other things. The facility looks great.

The biggest issue to date has been the parking, but this will subside as families figure out their new routine for the school year. We are happy to report that there has been lots of positive feedback about the program, the play area and the classroom. We have 90 Preschooler this year and waitlist for the Multi-Age 3's & 4's or Little learner 3's class.

Breakfast Club (Before School)

Breakfast Club is off to a great start. Breakfast Club took the place of morning care program. We rebranded the program, moving it from the 3 elementary school sites to the Teen Center, and opened up earlier to accommodate the requests from the community. Breakfast Club began on August 21 with the start of the new school year. It features a 6:30am start, breakfast options for the children, accommodations for K through 8th grades, and more. Parents have been extremely complimentary about the new format. We're pleased to hear all of the positive feedback and look forward to the rest of the school year.

We have had to make a few adjustments, most notably the school drop off times. However our new adjusted times seem to be working out nicely. While at the SPOT, participants can play air hockey, watch cartoons or just relax with friends. Breakfast Club currently has 47 participants enrolled. This

is up from 39 (combined) from the 3 elementary sites in 2016-17. There are 13 from Hanna, 9 from Lupine, 22 from Ohlone and 3 from the Middle School.

Kaleidoscope Kidz, a Recreation Afterschool Program (After School)

The Kaleidoscope Kidz program took the place of Child Care. Kaleidoscope Kidz is also a rebranded program. Kaleidoscope Kidz is a Recreational Afterschool Program (or RAP program for short). The RAP program is being held at all 3 sites: Hanna Ranch, Lupine and Ohlone. Our enrollment this year is up from last year. We have 115 children enrolled this year, compared to 99 last year. There are currently 43 at Ohlone, 50 at Hanna and 22 at Lupine. We do have limited space available at Hanna and Lupine, but we anticipate these spots filling up based on the volume of calls we are still receiving. Our new changes with homework time and “stations” format are working out well. We have received several great comments from parents of children who are getting their homework done before coming home. The word out about RAP and we look forward to a great school year.

The person was bleeding from the right hand and had injuries consistent with being in a physical altercation. The person declined medical and any assistance from police. A protective
