Possession of an Expandable Baton: On January 18, 2018 11:14am, an Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a gold Honda Accord. The driver was a 32 year old male. During the contact the officer noticed an object, in plain site, resembling an expandable baton. The subject admitted to having an expandable baton, in the glove box of the vehicle, and advised he was not in law enforcement or working as a security guard (allowing him to possess it). A black expandable baton, with a rubber grip, was retrieved from the vehicle. The subject was arrested for Possession of an Expandable Baton. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity Theft: On January 18, 2018, at 2:25pm, an officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. The reporting party said an unknown suspect made fraudulent charges on his Best Buy account.

Vehicle Theft: On January 18, 2018 at 6:08pm, an officer was dispatched, to the 100 block of Worthing, regarding a stolen vehicle investigation. The reporting party said, sometime between 4:00am this morning and time of call, an unknown suspect stole her gold 1995 Honda Accord.

Theft of Bicycle: On January 19, 2018, at approximately 8:11 pm, an Officer responded to Kinders, in the 3600 block of San Pablo Avenue, for the report of a theft of a bicycle. Sometime between 1:00 pm and 8:00 pm and unknown person took a black Specialized road bike from the rear of Kinders. The bicycle was not locked up.

CRIME PREVENTION TIP: Do not leave valuables unattended and unlocked. Theft is usually a crime of opportunity. An unlocked bicycle is a tempting target.

Taser on School Grounds: On January 19, 2018, at approximately 9:15 pm, a School Resource Officer was monitoring a basketball game at Hercules High School. He attempted to contact some kids in the parking lot. One of the kids dropped something on the ground, as he was walking away. The subject then ran away, and was not located. The item dropped was a stun gun. The stun gun was collected and booked into evidence.

Possession of Stolen Property/Parole Hold: On January 20, 2018, at approximately 2:25am, an Officer stopped an gold Infiniti, on San Pablo Avenue near the entrance to Highway 80, for not having license plates. The 21 year old male driver, of Richmond, was on searchable Parole. A parole search was conducted. The subject had two California driver's licenses, and social security cards, in his wallet. The items were for two different people, not the subject. One of the driver's license was listed, in the Automated Property System, as stolen. The subject was arrested for Possession of Stolen Property. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Commercial Burglary: On January 20, 2018, at approximately 5:14 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to City of Embers located, at 1511 Sycamore Avenue, for an alarm. Officers observed the front door had been pried open. The business was cleared and no one was located inside. The loss was approximately was Cigarettes

Auto BurglaryX2: On January 20, 2018, at 4:36pm, an officer was dispatched to the Franklin Canyon Golf Course, 3500 Franklin Canyon Rd, regarding an auto burglary. While on scene, the officer discovered a second auto burglary near the first one. Both reporting parties stated they parked their vehicles in the parking lot after 9:00am. When they returned to their vehicles they discovered that an unknown suspect had shattered a window of their vehicle and stole property from inside.

Fraud: On January 20, 2018 at 5:13pm, an officer was dispatched to the 3100 block of South Front to investigate a fraud. The reporting party said someone in Texas somehow transferred money, from the victim's NetSpend account to another person's account, without the victim's permission.

Commercial Burglary: On January 21, 2018, at approximately 12:16 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Curry Me Up Restaurant, at 1551

Sycamore Avenue, for a dining room motion activated alarm. Officers observed the glass to the front door was shattered. The interior of the restaurant was checked and no suspects were located. The loss is unknown at this time because.

Prisoner Transport: On January 21, 2018 a Parking Enforcement Officer responded to the Alameda County Jail. He picked up a 26 year old male on an outstanding warrant held by this agency. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. x

Mental Health Evaluation On January 21st 2018 at approximately 7:59PM HPD Officers were dispatched, to the 400 block of Falcon Way, for a suicidal 17 year old female who had left her residence. She left the residence without her cell phone and was last seen on foot leaving in an unknown direction. Officers located the female near the library. She was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.
