Identity Theft: On February 1, 2018 at 9:40pm, an officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. The reporting party said an unknown suspect tried to transfer money via her Western Union account, to her ex-boyfriend, using a credit card she did not recognized.

Located Missing Person: On February 1, 2018 at 10:05am, officers were dispatched to the 800 block of Willow Avenue in regards to a homeless encampment. Officers contacted a 29 year old female, of Richmond. The subject was reported missing, by her mother, in 2017. The officer notified the mother and removed the subject from the Missing and Unidentified Persons System

Harassing Phone Calls: On February 1, 2018 at 1:37pm an officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. An employees from the Franklin Canyon Golf Course reported an unknown subject has called the Pro Shop 16 times on January 21, 2018 and harassed whoever answers the phone.

Located Missing Person/Warrant Arrest: On February 1, 2018 at 1:46pm an Officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. A 36 year old female said she was reported missing in 2017, by her mother. She wanted to remove herself from the Missing and Unidentified Persons System, as she had returned home. During the process, of removing the subject from MUPS, it was determined she had two outstanding warrants. She was arrested for the warrants, and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Lost Property: On February 1, 2018 at 1:57pm an officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. The Hercules resident said he lost his wallet on January 4th while driving for Lyft.

Violating a Court Order (Domestic): On February 1, 2018 at 5:44pm, officers were dispatched to the 800 block of Willow for altercation between a male and female. A 31 year old female called from inside Burger King. She stated a 31 year old male, who had threatened her in the past, was outside the Burger King. Officers determined there was an active criminal protection on file, requiring the male to stay away from the female. The male was on felony probation. The male was arrested for court order violation. During a search of his person a pipe, commonly used to smoke narcotics, was located. The male was arrested for the court order violation, possession of narcotics paraphernalia and probation violation. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility

BobCop: On February 1, 2018, at 8:36 pm, an online report was accepted for an auto Burglary. On January 24, 2018 at approximately 9:30 am a 1993, white, Ford F-150 Pickup truck had the passenger window broken, and a gym bags with clothes only was taken.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On February 2, 2018, at approximately 1:11 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of Cinnabar and Obsidian for a dark colored vehicle driving slowly in the area. An Officer observed a black Toyota Prius driving slowly. The Toyota pulled to the side of the street. The Officer stopped behind the vehicle and contacted the driver. The 43 year old male driver displayed objective symptoms of alcohol intoxication. The driver was administered the Standard Field Sobriety Test, but refused to do the Preliminary Alcohol Screening device. The subject was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. He was later cited and released to a responsible party.

Warrant arrest: On February 2, 2018 at 10:41 am, an Officer contacted the occupants in a vehicle in the 700 block of Willow. A 57 year old male passenger had a citable misdemeanor warrant. He was given a new court date, and cite/released in the field on the warrant.

Mental Health Evaluation: On February 2, 2018 at 11:39 am, Officers responded to the 200 block of Emerald Way for a family disturbance. A 32 year old female allegedly struck her mother. The mother complained of pain and was checked by AMR but not transported. The mother wished prosecution for the battery and signed a Citizen's Arrest form. Officers

contacted the daughter and determined she met the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Vandalism (Bobcop): On February 2, 2018 at 5:03 pm, a Hercules resident reported the driver's side window shattered, on his 2017 Chevrolet Volt, sometime between 1-6 am this morning. The vehicle was parked in his driveway.

Possession of Controlled Substance/Drug Paraphernalia: On February 2, 2018, at approximately 6:57 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to Willow Food and Liquor for a suspicious vehicle with two occupants sleeping in it. Officers contacted a 33 year old male of Vacaville, and a 23 year old female of Vacaville, asleep in the vehicle. The male was found to have a substance, believed to be a narcotic; and a glass pipe, used to smoke narcotics, in his possession. The male was arrested and later issued a citation and released.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On February 3, 2018, at approximately 3:27 am, an Officer stopped a 2015 Hyundai Accent, on Sycamore near Palm, for DUI indicators. The 20 year old female driver, out of Hayward, displayed objective signs of alcohol intoxication. The subject was given the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated the subject exceeded the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. The subject was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. She was later issued a citation, and released to her father.

Traffic Collision with Minor injuries: On February 3, 2018 at 6:19 pm, officers were dispatched to a vehicle collision, at San Pablo Ave and Hercules Ave, involving a white 2010 Mercedes and a Black 2002 Honda. The driver of the adult Mercedes had a complaint of pain and was cleared by medical personnel, at the scene.
