Stolen vehicle: On February 20, 2018 at 9:07 am, the owner, of a 1996 Toyota Tacoma pickup, reported his vehicle stolen from the Franklin Canyon Golf Course. Video surveillance showed the suspects arrived, in a charcoal gray Ford Fusion at 7:08 am, and parked next to the Toyota. The Caucasian male driver was able to unlock the victim vehicle's driver's door and get in to the driver's seat. The suspect was able to start the vehicle. A second Caucasian male moved to the driver's seat of the Ford. Both vehicles left the area.

Stolen vehicle recovery: On February 20, 2018 at 9:10 am, a Hercules resident reported an unoccupied vehicle, parked in the 100 block of Fawcett, with the trunk open. The vehicle was found to be a stolen vehicle, reported to Pinole PD. The rear plate was from a Nissan out of San Pablo.

Potential mail theft: On February 20, 2018 at 10:58am, a homeowner, from Mission Springs, reported a silver newer Hyundai Accent, occupied by two female adults, drive into the area and open and check mailboxes at 5 am ish this morning. This same vehicle and suspects were also seen on video two weeks ago doing the same thing. No theft could be confirmed, but an Officer took a report for all of the open mailboxes in the Village Parkway neighborhood. The report was sent to the Postal Inspectors Office, who is doing a follow-up.

Identity theft: On February 20, 2018 at 1:59 pm, a Hercules resident reported being a victim of a potential fraud scam over the phone. A caller claimed to be from the IRS and the reporting party provided his social

security number to the caller but later regretted it. The reporting party is concerned his SSN having been compromised.

CRIME PREVENTION NOTE: The Internal Revenue Service DOES NOT call people on the phone. Do not give out, or confirm, any personal information to people who call you on the phone. Do not provide credit card numbers, or agree to send pre-paid money cards, for an unpaid tax bill.

Stolen Vehicle: On February 20, 2018 at 7:16pm an officer was dispatched to 200 block of O'Neil Circle for a stolen vehicle report. The vehicle owner parked his white 4DR 1997 Honda Accord on Fawcett at Hercules Avenue on February 1, 2018 at about 06:30pm. When he checked on it today, it was gone.

Possess More Than an Ounce of Marijuana: On February 21, 2018 at 1:54am an officer checked on a suspicious vehicle, with no plates, parked between 3800 – 3900 San Pablo Avenue. When the driver opened the glovebox, to retrieve the vehicle's registration, he exposed a gallon sized zip lock bag containing suspected marijuana. The driver, a 20 year old male of Rodeo, and a 19 year old female passenger, of Pinole, were detained while a vehicle search was completed. The male was the vehicle owner and took responsibility for the marijuana. He was arrested, cited, and released.
