### **Probation Search Regarding an on Going Identity Theft**

**Investigation/Probation Violation:** On February 7, 2018, at 9:09am, Hercules officers, and a Postal Inspector, went to the 100 block of Glenwood to conduct a Probation Search. The subject was a 31 year old female on searchable probation. The search stemmed from an on-going Identity theft and check fraud investigation. During the search of the subject's property officers located numerous pieces of mail, and identifications, belonging to several different Hercules residents. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Misdemeanor Battery:** On February 7, 2018, at 11:42am, an adult male WestCat bus driver came to HPD to report a Battery. The incident occurred on February 6, 2018, in the evening, in front of Burger King (800 Willow Ave). An African American adult got on the bus and paid his fare. The suspect punched the driver in the side of the face, then got off the bus. The driver complained of pain to his face, but did not seek medical attention.

**Stolen Vehicle Report and Recovery:** On February 7, 2018, at 2:24pm, the owner of a 2000 Honda came to the Hercules Police Department. He reported his vehicle had been stolen, from San Pablo, on February 6, 2018, but was not reported. The same day Hercules officers checked a vehicle, parked in the 100 block of Manzanita, with the engine running. The registered owner could not be contacted. The officer managed to turn the engine off and secure the vehicle. A Courtesy report was taken (for stolen) and a recovery.

**Theft of License Plate:** On February 7, 2018, at 5:08pm, a Hercules resident reported the rear license plate, from her 2006 Chevrolet, was stolen. The incident occurred in the 400 block of Weymouth, sometime around the end of January.

**Runaway Juvenile – Prior Missing:** On February 8, 2018 at 1:12 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Paradise Drive to take a missing person's report. The reporting party reported her 16 year old son had runaway. He was last seen the morning of February 7<sup>th</sup>. He failed to return home from school (El Cerrito High School) on February 8<sup>th</sup>. Her son is on the Track Team and usually returns home from school around 8:00 p.m. The subject has runaway before. A TRAK flyer was also created emailed to neighboring cities/counties

**Warrant Arrest:** On February 8, 2018 at 4:03 a.m. Officer did a traffic stop on a Green '99 VW Jetta. All four adult occupants were found to be on searchable Probation. A 45 year old male passenger had an outstanding Felony No Bail Warrant issued on February 2, 2018. The male was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Non- Injury Hit and Run Collision (Vehicle/Pedestrian):** On February 8, 2018 at 8:00am, officers were dispatched to the area of the high school regarding a vehicle vs. Pedestrian collision. A female 9<sup>th</sup> grader reported she was hit by a white car in the crosswalk in front of the Admin Building. The student reported she was not injured. Officers determined that the driver of the vehicle continued driving east on Refugio Valley Rd. The only description was white vehicle driven by an Asian female. The student's parent took control of the student.

**Missing Plates Report:** On February 8, 2018 at 10:01am, an officer was dispatched to HPD for a lobby detail. The reporting party said his wife accidentally threw the license plates, for their 2016 Toyota, into the trash. The plates were entered into Stolen Vehicle System.

**Burglary:** On February 8, 2018 at 1:20pm, a Hercules High teacher reported that someone removed a digital projector from his classroom. The burglary occurred between February 6, 2018 at 1:30pm and February 7, 2018 at 7:45pm. The teacher stated the classroom door was locked but the windows may have been left open.

**Recovered Stolen Vehicle:** On February 8, 2018 at 1:34pm and officer was dispatched to Dutch Elm at Silver Mable regarding a suspicious white 1995 Honda Civic. The vehicle had been parked, with the engine running,

since this morning. The license plate came back to a reported stolen, out of San Francisco, reported on February 7, 2018.

**Possession of Controlled Substance/Drug Paraphernalia:** On February 8, 2018, at approximately 8:40 pm, an Officer contacted a 52 year old male, of Vallejo standing near his blue 2003, Dodge Durango in the parking lot of Shell Gas Station. The subject was in possession of a substance, believed to be a narcotic; and two glass pipes used to smoke narcotics. The subject was arrested, issued a citation, and released.

**Vandalism/Probation Violation:** On February 9, 2018, at approximately 3:59 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Home Depot. The reporting party said a male was slashing tires, of parked vehicles in the parking lot, with a knife. Officers arrived and were pointing towards a Big Rig parked near the garden center. An Officer drove towards the Big Rig, and contacted a 47 year old male, squatting down on the driver's side of the truck. The subject was on searchable probation for Vandalism. A large knife was located in the subject's pocket. The subject was positively identified, by two witnesses, as the person who was slashing tires. There was a total of 5 cars, one big rig, and one motorcycle which had tires cut. Four of the victims were Home Depot employees. All the victims were contacted and all wanted to press. The male was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Reported Stolen Vehicle:** On February 9, 2018 at 8:14am a resident from the 100 block of Lilac came to HPD to report her rental car stolen. She stated, sometime between February 8, 2018 at 8:30pm and February 9, 2018 at 7:00am, an unknown suspect stole her white 2017 Dodge rental Van from in front of her residence.

**Possessing of More than an ounce of Marijuana:** On February 9, 2018 at 11:36am, an Officer stopped a black 2014 Ford Fusion for a vehicle code violation. The 24 year old male driver, of Pinole, had more than an ounce of marijuana inside the vehicle. He was cited and released at the scene.

**Passing Fraudulent Bills/ Theft by False Pretense:** On February 9, 2018 at 12:20pm an officer was dispatched to 3600 San Pablo Ave for a report of a theft. The reporting party said she met an African American male adult, in front of the Chase bank, to sell him a gold necklace. She made arrangements for the sale via the "Let Go" app. The male handed her a Chase envelope which was supposed to contain \$420 cash. After the exchange the male ran off. When the victim opened the envelope, she discovered it was filled with fake \$20 bills. The male was described as thin build, long dreads, wearing camouflage clothing.

**Vandalism:** On February 9, 2018 at 1:54pm an officer was dispatched to the 1400 block of Partridge for a report of a vandalism. The reporting party said, sometime between February 7, 2018 and February 9, 2018, an unknown suspect put an unknown substance on his vehicle causing damage to the paint and headlamp covers.

**Evading/probation violation/suspend DL** On February 9<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 9:42PM an Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop, on a gold 2002 Mercedes, in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The vehicle failed to yield and continued on E/B I-80. A pursuit was initiated and the vehicle came to a stop in the area of Sonoma Ave and Sequoia Blvd in the City of Vallejo. The driver, a 55 year old male, was taken into custody. The subject was on felony probation, out of Alameda County, and was driving on a suspended driver's license. He was taken to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Suspended DL/Warrant:** On February 10<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 1:54AM a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a white 1998 Pontiac Firebird, in the area of San Pablo Ave and John Muir Parkway. The 53 year old female driver, of Pinole, was driving on a suspended driver's license. She was cited for that violation. The subject also had a non-citable warrant held by of Solano County. She was arrested for the warrant and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Vehicle Theft/Recovery** On February 10<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 2:36AM a HPD Officer took a lobby report for a stolen vehicle. The reporting party stated she parked her silver 2002 Lexus ES300, in the parking lot in the 100 block of Glenwood, on February 9<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 11:00AM. A few hours later she noticed her keys and vehicle missing. A "friend" took her vehicle without her permission. The reporting party spoke to the friend, via telephone, and he said he would bring the car back. After several hours the car was not back and she decided to make a police report. The Lexus was entered into Stolen Vehicle System. At approximately 5:00AM reporting party stated she got her vehicle back and no longer desired prosecution.

**Lost/Stolen Plate:** On February 10, 2018 at 7:43am an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Sweet Gum for a lost or stolen plate report. The reporting party last saw the front plate, attached to his 2014 Subaru Outback, at 7:00pm on February 9, 2018. The Plate was entered into SVS.

**Lost/Stolen Plate:** On February 10, 2018 at 7:43am an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Stone Pine for a lost or stolen plate report.

The reporting party last saw the rear plate attached to his 2002 Chevy at 7:00pm on February 8, 2018. The Plate was entered into Stolen Vehicle System.

**Vandalism:** On February 10<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 9:04PM HPD Officers were dispatched to Ohlone Elementary School for a suspicious circumstance. The reporting party saw five male juveniles, running on campus, after a loud banging sound. The subjects were seen heading toward Turquoise Dr. Officers located an open gate and discovered two broken windows. It does not appear entry was made. An area check was conducted but no one was located on or near the school.

**Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol Collision/Probation**

**Violation/Suspended CDL** On February 10<sup>th</sup> 2019 at approximately 9:09PM HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of Victoria Crescent East and Craftsman for a solo vehicle collision. A white sedan ran over a circle (roundabout) and a tree. Three to four subject were seen around the vehicle. Officer's response was delayed due to the above call. Once on scene an Officer followed a trail of radiator fluid and located a white Nissan Sentra, with all four tires flattened, and leaking fluid, on Victoria Crescent West and San Pablo Ave. Two subjects fled on foot when an Officer tried to contact them. Another subject was seen walking away from the area and denied any involvement. Eventually Officers located a 30 year old female, of Red Bluff; a 27 year old male, of Red Bluff, a 44 year old male, of Richmond; and a 28 year old female, of Tara Hills. The two females, and 27 year old male were on Parole or Probation. The driver was identified as the 30 year old female. She displayed objective system of alcohol intoxication. She was unable to complete the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated she was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. She was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol; Driving on a Suspended License; and Violation of Probation. She was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Solo Vehicle Collision** On February 11<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 2:03AM a HPD Officer located a gray 2012 Chrysler, which had run off the roadway and into a tree, in the area of San Pablo Ave and John Muir Parkway. The vehicle was unoccupied, but still in drive, and running. The vehicle was registered to an adult female of Vacaville. An extensive area check was conducted but Officer's efforts were unsuccessful. Vacaville PD attempted contact at her residence but no one responded. It appears the vehicle exited W/B Hwy 4 and attempted to turn northbound onto San Pablo Ave and was unable to negotiate the turn. The vehicle struck the center median which caused it to over correct and run off the roadway. Officers did not

locate any signs of possible ejection from the vehicle or any signs of injury. The vehicle was towed.

**Towed Vehicle/Warrant Arrest:** On February 11, 2018 at 9:21 p.m. an Officer responded to the 2100 block of Railroad Ave. for a complaint of an abandoned vehicle. The reporting party stated older White Honda, with no license plates, showed up sometime today. The Officer located the White '95 Honda Accord (No Plates) parked on W/B Sycamore Ave. at Railroad Ave. The vehicle's registration expired August 2015. A tow truck was requested. While waiting for the tow a 26 year old male, of San Pablo, tried to enter the Accord. The subject had a Misdemeanor No Cite Warrant issued on January 2, 2018. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Attempted Residential Burglary:** On February 11, 2018 at 3:58 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Onyx Ct. for a report of a residential burglary in progress. The reporting party stated she saw an African American adult, use a hammer, in an attempt to pry the rear glass door to her home. The suspect was described as short; wearing a Black Jacket and Black Hat. The suspect was last seen jumping over the rear fence and fleeing. Officers remembered contacting a 32 year old male, matching the description, at 2:25 am, on San Pablo Ave. at John Muir Parkway. That subject had two hammers in his possession. Officers located a backpack lying in the front yard of the victim's home. An Officer identified the backpack as belonging subject he stopped at 2:25am. Officers checked the backyard the houses in the 100 block of Onyx, but didn't locate the suspect. Officers saw footprints leading from the backyard, of one of the houses, towards the open space area and fire trail. Officers began an area search near the fire trail. At 4:19 a.m. the subject was observed by walking N/B Turquoise Dr. at Onyx Ct. and he was detained. An infield show-up was done and subject was positively identified as the attempted burglary suspect. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility

**Hit and Run collision:** On February 11, 2018 at 2:31 PM, Officers were dispatched to the Luckys parking lot for a hit a run collision. The suspect vehicle was described as a white, older model Ford pickup which was last seen traveling east on Sycamore Ave.

**Physical Fight:** On February 11, 2018 at 2:36 PM, Officers were dispatched to Sycamore Ave. under I-80 for a physical altercation. The reporting party stated several subjects were fighting one male subject. The responsible subjects, and victim, fled before the officers arrived. The adult male victim contacted the police at the Jack in the Box. He stated he was

walking on Sycamore, an unknown subject threw a rock past his head. When he turned to investigate, a person or person/s pushed and began to hit him. The victim could not describe the suspects. Sometime during the altercation, the victim's cell phone dropped on the ground and an unknown person took it. A passerby took a picture of a license plate of a possibly involved vehicle. The investigation officer will follow-up.

**Collision/damaged traffic sign:** On February 11, 2018 at 5:09 PM, Officers were dispatched to San Pablo Ave. @ Sycamore Ave. for a vehicle vs. center median. An officer contacted the adult female driver of a 2006 Honda Civic. She stated while making a left turn from W/B Sycamore to S/B San Pablo Ave, the sun was in her eyes and she did not see the center median. The driver drove completely onto the median and became high centered. A traffic sign was also knocked down as a result of the collision.

**Theft:** On February 12, 2018, an officer dispatched to 3600 San Pablo Ave. for a theft which just occurred. The reporting party stated he parked his work truck in the lot, while having lunch. He was alerted an unknown white male had stolen the paint sprayer and put it in the trunk of a 2015 Nissan Sentra. The victim, and his co-worker, ran outside to confront the suspect but were unsuccessful in detaining him. The sprayer fell out of the trunk and suspect only got away with misc. painting tools.

**Auto Burglaries/Vandalism/Resisting Arrest/Possession of Burglary Tools/Towed Vehicle:** On February 12, 2018 at 10:56 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of the 600 block of Windsor for a report of an auto burglary that just occurred. The reporting party saw four African American suspects; wearing Hoodies, and Jeans; running down Canterbury St. Two of the suspects had dreadlocks. The reporting party saw the suspects jumping over the fence of the Church parking lot (The Grove Church). An officer drove down Bristol St. to the rear of The Grove Church and saw two subjects, wearing Hoodies and Jeans, in the 500 block of Weymouth. The subjects fled when they saw the officer. The officer gave chase and lost sight of the subjects on Willow Ave. near Weymouth St. A perimeter was set up with the assistance of Pinole P.D. An officer found the two suspects hiding in a rear patio in the 300 block of Weymouth St. They were both detained. Both suspects had window punch devices in their possession. The subjects were identified as a 15, and 16, year old males, from Suisun City, CA. The officer was checking the area where he first saw the suspects, and observed a Blue '07 Nissan Altima backed into a parking spot on Bristol St. There were 3 African American males inside. The officer contacted the subject. One of the males immediately fled, on foot, S/B on Bristol St. The officer saw a Silver pistol lying on the right front passenger seat (Later determined to be a BB

gun) and stayed with the two subjects in the car. Another Officer chased the fleeing subject. The officer found the subject hiding in a balcony patio on Willow Ave. He detained the 17 year old male, of Suisun City. A window punch device was also found in this subject's possession. This subject also had an outstanding Misdemeanor No Bail Warrant out of Solano issued on 01/26/18. The Officer was walking handcuffed suspect to his patrol car when the subject broke free and fled again. The Officer chased the subject into the canal, located between Willow Ave. Viewpoint Blvd. The subject ran into the water, where the officer apprehended him. The Officer injured his right hand during the apprehension. The two subjects, who stayed inside the Altima, were also detained. One was a 16 year old male, of Suisun City; and the other was a 18 year old male, of Fairfield. Inside the Altima, Officers found several items, believed to be stolen. All those items, and the BB gun, were seized for Evidence/Safekeeping. Officers transported all five suspects to HPD. . Officer took four window smash auto burglaries, during their shift. Three more like cases were reported on February 13, 2018. The 18 year old was released pending further investigation. The 15 year old, and two 16 year olds, were released to their parents with the case to be forwarded to the Juvenile D.A.'s Office. The 17 year old was transported to Juvenile Hall and booked for his Warrant, Auto Burglary, Possession of Burglary Tools, and Resisting Arrest.

**Vandalism:** On February 12, 2018 at 10:39 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 1200 block Willow Ave. to take an auto burglary report. The reporting party stated an unknown suspect shattered the two front windows of his Silver '12 Hyundai Sonata sometime within the last twenty minutes.

**Mental Health Evaluation:** On February 13, 2018 at 3:12 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to a welfare check at 500 Silver Maple Dr. The reporting party stated his co-worker left him some concerning voicemail messages and he was concerned for her welfare. Officers arrived at the home and saw light on inside the vehicle but no vehicles in the driveway. Officers attempted to make contact at the front door and via phone but got no response. Officers found an unsecure kitchen window and made entry to do a welfare check on 47 year old female, her mother, and her children. Officers made contact with female and determined met the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center. The subject's mother, and her children were okay. The children were left with the family.
