Community Clean-up Day

The Community Clean-Up Day for 2018 and will be held the first Saturday in May, the 5th, from 8-11am. The event will be held at the City of Hercules Corp Yard, located at 1000 Sycamore Ave. Watch for more information soon.

Duck Pond Park Improvements

The City is out to bid on planned improvements to Duck Pond Park which will see a half-basketball court and restroom building added to the park. If all goes well, the contract for the project will be awarded later this spring with construction to start mid to late summer.

Bayfront Workshop

With the first phase of the much anticipated Bayfront development about to start construction, the City Council will be holding a special meeting on Saturday, April 14th starting at 10 AM to get an update from the project developer on their vision for the implementation of the master plan and future phasing. This workshop setting meeting will be held in the City Council Chambers and the public is welcome to attend and to learn more about the project, especially the private development components.

Fighting Graffiti

The City of Hercules has seen an increase in graffiti which is a blight on the community, affects property values, and damages perceptions of safety. Graffiti is a crime and our Police Department is vigilant about preventing graffiti and apprehending culprits whenever possible. In addition, the City has increased its investment in graffiti removal, which we can do on public property and facilities using tax dollars.

Unfortunately, we are unable to do graffiti removal on private property. We understand that graffiti occurs, the property owner is the victim of a crime, and for that we are sorry. However, the burden does fall to the property owner to remove the graffiti as soon as possible. While the City has recently reinitiated a level of code compliance activity, our initial approach is to contact property owners to encourage voluntary compliance. As such, when we see graffiti which needs to be addressed, you may be contacted and asked to address it within 10 days. Of course, we would encourage you to do so sooner as the immediate removal of graffiti discourages the use of your property for graffiti.

Failure to remove the graffiti could result in a Notice of Violation and a possible Administrative

Citation with associated fines. As we are gearing up to launch this program, we wanted to make you aware of this renewed commitment to ensuring a quality community. One option for property owners in areas which are targeted for graffiti may be to consider retaining a graffiti abatement firm to occasionally inspect the target areas and to respond when they see graffiti or when you may call them out to do so. This is what the City has done in regard to public properties. Please join us to making Hercules a more attractive community and abate the graffiti which is plaguing our neighborhoods by addressing it on property which you own.

Hercules Heritage Garden

Efforts by the Hercules Rotary Club to enhance the City’s Heritage Garden at Sycamore and Civic Drive are starting to take shape. The centerpiece of the Garden is a globe planter circle which is more recognizable now with painted edges and the new azure stones added to the ocean areas. Watch for more changes to come thanks to this much appreciated volunteer effort.

STAR WARS DAY

Friday, May 4, the City of Hercules will be holding a special event called “May the Fourth Be With You Day!” If you know anything about Star Wars, May 4th, has become Star Wars Day. With the release of the 9th Star Wars movie this past December, Star Wars continues to gain in popularity, as evident with the Han Solo movie coming out in May 2018.

For our May the Fourth Be With You Day celebration, the City of Hercules Parks and Recreation Department has partnered with the Library and Chamber to bring a unique event to the City. The Bay Front Chamber has enlisted



several businesses that will promote a FREE passport at their location where patrons can get them stamped. The Passports will act as entries to raffle prizes at Refugio Park before the city shows a screening of the original Star Wars movie that started this whole adventure. The movie in the park will wrap up the event.

The Library is preparing a Star Wars “Story-Walk”, where people can find pages of a Star Wars book in the park and walk to find the next page in order to complete the story. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. The tree trimming contract, which is pruning street trees throughout town, is nearing completion. The new modular maintenance and operations building is being fitted with electrical connections. Staff is looking forward to moving in. The first phase of the Street Sign Replacement Project, which replaced street signs on major streets, has been completed and the first order of signs for residential streets just arrived. The bids are being evaluated for the replacement generator damaged by fire at the Community Center. Emergency power is supplied in the interim with a temporary generator. The Pilot Streetlight Replacement Project, which will replace 75 streetlights, is out to bid. Staff also repaired numerous streetlights throughout town, including a few which were knocked down by automobiles.

Engineering

Bay Trail West has been substantially completed. This 0.3 mile long project eliminates the last paving gap along the waterfront and is funded with a \$1.5M grant. The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is now 2/3 completed with an anticipated final completion date of February 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, most

recently the new power supply provided by PG&E was delayed. The cost impacts of this delay is being assessed. The grading plans for Sycamore Crossing and public improvements for Bayfront Block N are under review. Staff is in discussions with firms to provide plan review on the Safeway Project and obtain environmental permits to dredge Lake Refugio and executing a contract for permit support for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC). Staff is also beginning the design for capital projects to be constructed next construction season, including resurfacing the Refugio Valley Pedestrian Trail and a major street rehabilitation project.

Domestic Violence / Possession of Controlled Substance: On March 8, 2018 at 8:31 am officers were dispatched to the area of Sycamore at Palm near Valley Bible Church. Officers located an adult male subject sitting on the sidewalk, and an adult female sitting in a parked vehicle about 200 yards away. The female initially advised there was nothing physical and it was a verbal altercation only. The male had visible marks to his face stated the female hit him multiple times. The male was in possession of a substance, believed to be a narcotic. He was arrested and later cited and released. The female was arrested for Felony Domestic Battery and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Auto Burglary: On March 8, 2018 at 7:36 am, an officer was flagged down at the Shell Station

3600 San Pablo Ave. regarding a vehicle had just been broken into. He parked his 2016 Scion, near the vacuum and air pump, at 7:30am. When he returned the passenger door window had been broken out. His green backpack, containing his iPad, was stolen. A witness saw an African American male, in a white vehicle, commit the burglary.

Delaying Resisting an Officer: On March 8, 2018 at 8:35am, officers were dispatched to the Bart Lot, 1375 Willow Av, for the report of a male acting like he was going to stab passengers with long drill bits. Officers located the subject, on the bus platform, with the drill bits in his hands. The subject refused the officer's instructions to stop and put the drill bits down. The subject was ultimately assisted to the ground, arrested, and handcuffed. After being cleared by AMR, for a complaint of pain to his wrist, the subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. No assault victim could be located.

Theft of Plates: On March 9, 2018 at 9:59 am, officers responded to the 400 block of Turquoise to contact the owner of a Toyota Truck. Danville Police requested officers to see if the owner had been the victim of a theft of license plates. The owner of the Toyota said the plates were stolen sometime last night either in Vallejo or in his driveway sometime before 6:30 am when he left for work.
