Vandalism On March 21, 2018 at approximately 3:20PM a citizen, from the 100 block of Manzanita, called to state several fences in the neighborhood had graffiti painted on them.

Domestic Battery: On March 21, 2018, at approximately 8:21 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Glenwood for the report of a domestic dispute. Officers contacted a 28 year old female and 29 year old male. The male had minor scratches and redness to his neck, and redness to his eyes. He said the injuries were caused by the female. The investigation indicated the female was the primary aggressor. She was arrested for domestic battery with injury. There was a handgun in the house. It was taken for safekeeping and booked at HPD. The female was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Outside Assist: On March 21, 2018, at approximately 9:15 pm, Pinole PD was dispatched to a domestic violence call in the 3100 block of Ramona Street in Pinole. HPD officers were requested to assist in locating the adult male suspect. The suspect was not located and HPD officers were released.

Drunk in Public: On March 21, 2018, at approximately 11:10 pm, HPD Officers were dispatched to San Pablo Avenue near Chase bank for a solo vehicle on the center median. Officers arrived and located a 1998 Chevrolet Cavalier, south bound in the number 1 lane of traffic on San Pablo Avenue, was facing east bound. The vehicle was unoccupied. Officers located a 78 year old male, from Oakland, at Jack in the Box. The

male said he was a passenger in the vehicle. A female who, he only knew by her first name, was driving the car, but left the area. The male showed objective symptoms of alcohol intoxication and was arrested. The female was never located. The male was transported to the County Regional Medical Center, to be evaluated for preexisting medical issues. He was released at the hospital due to his medical conditions. The vehicle was towed for blocking the street. There was no damage to anything other than the Chevrolet.
