Measures B & C Oversight Report

Hercules voters approved extensions for two local tax measures in November 2015. These extension measures were on the ballot as Measure B (a local sales tax override) and Measure C (a utility user's tax override). Originally approved as Measures O and A, these measures provide an important on-going income stream to support local services which cannot be taken by Sacramento. The approved measures require that a citizen oversight panel review the Measures annually to ensure the funds generated are spent appropriately and if their continuation is warranted. The City's five member Finance Commission serves in this oversight capacity. The Finance Commission recently presented their annual report on Measures B & C for the 2016/17 fiscal year, which ended last June, to the City Council. In summary the Finance Commission found that:

- For Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2017, the funds generated were spent in accordance with the Measure B
- For Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2017, the funds generated were spent in accordance with Measure C
- That both Measures B and C should be retained since the City of Hercules still requires these funds to achieve long term financial stability with adequate financial reserves.

Hercules General Municipal Election – Filing Period Opens Soon

The City of Hercules holds its General Municipal Elections in November of each even numbered year, therefore a General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Hercules on November 6, 2018 to elect two (2) members of the City Council which have expiring terms at the end of this year. Members of the City Council are elected to four (4) year terms. The November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election Nomination Period begins on July 16, 2018 and closes on August 10, 2018 (the 88th day before the election). If an incumbent officer does not run for office by the 88th day (August 10, 2018) for that incumbent's elective office, the close of the nomination period will extend to August 15, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.

It is recommended that you make an appointment with the City Clerk to pull Nomination Papers during normal business hours once the nomination period opens.

received an alert from her credit monitoring company stating a Walmart Credit card had been opened in her name on March 23, 2018.

Mail Theft: On March 23, 2018 at approximately 8:11pm, Officers responded to the 1100 block of Taraya Terrace for a report of mail theft and the victim had video surveillance footage of the suspect. The reporting party stated at approximately 1:40pm am African American male adult, associated with a tan or gold late 90s 4 door sedan (possibly Accord or Camry), removed mail form her mailbox.

Hit and Run: On March 24, 2018 at approximately 4:23 am, Officers were dispatched to a report of a hit and run collision which just occurred in the 1700 block of Redwood Rd. Located Missing Adult: On March 24, 2018 at 3:49pm, an officer contacted a 38 year old female, near 1551 Sycamore Ave. (Big Lots). She was reported missing on February 14th. At the time of our contact the subject appeared to be able to care for herself, and was removed from the Missing and Unidentified Persons System.

Domestic Violence On March 24th 2018 at approximately 10:35PM HPD Officers were dispatched to the 300 block of Violet for a report of domestic violence. Officers contacted the adult female victim. She had blood on her clothing and appeared to be bleeding from the nose. The victim stated her 54 year old husband punched her an unknown amount of times. When she attempted to call the police her husband took her cell phone. She went to a neighbor's house and contacted police. The male was taken into custody. The victim declined medical assistance. The male was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest On March 25th 2018 at approximately 2:28AM CHP requested HPD Officers respond to the area of the W/B I-80 on ramp from W/B Hwy 4 for a suspicious circumstance. A passerby saw a white Toyota Corolla, on the side of the road. Two males appeared to be trying to put an adult female into the trunk of the vehicle. Officers located the vehicle, along with four adult male subjects. It was determined no crime had occurred. A 20 year old male, of San Pablo, had a no bail warrant held by San Pablo PD. He was placed under arrest and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Domestic Violence On March 25th 2018 at approximately 4:20AM HPD Officers were dispatched to the 1800 block of Pheasant Dr. for a physical fight. Officers arrived and separated the involved parties. The investigation revealed a fight between the 45 year old husband, and 45 year old wife. The wife was determined to be the primary aggressor and was placed under arrest. All parties declined medical attention. The female was transported the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest On March 26th 2018 at approximately 2:04AM a HPD Officer checked on a

suspicious vehicle in the 1300 block of Willow Ave. One of the occupants attempted, but failed, to provide the Officer with a false name and date of birth. He stated he loaned his 2016 Dodge Ram, to someone, who parked the vehicle in the 1100 block of Turquoise Dr. The vehicle was stolen, from Turquoise, sometime between March 19, 2018 at 11:00am and March 26, 2018, at 12:00pm.

The caller said her 88 year old mother was unresponsive and not breathing. Without knowledge of the Do Not Resuscitate order, Paramedics performed lifesaving efforts for 20 minutes. Medical staff pronounced the subject deceased at 8:01am. The Contra Costa County Coroner's Office was contacted and a Deputy Coroner released the body to the family. There was no indication of foul play.

Grand Theft of Laptop: On March 29, 2018 at 6:00pm officers were dispatched to the Hercules Library, in the 100 block of Civic Dr, for a report of a stolen laptop. The reporting party stated, between 5:18pm and 5:38 pm, she left her laptop unattended in the Library and it was taken.

Officers located a vehicle, driving away from the complex, known to be driven by the involved 33 year old male subject. The male was stopped, and detained, while other officers met the female victim at her apartment. The female had a large contusion to her left eye and red marks on her neck, but declined medical treatment. She stated the male hit and choked her. The male was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. An Emergency Protective Order was granted and male was served prior to being transported jail.

The reporting party sent money to a subject, in Lynchburg, Virginia, for the purchase of a German Shepard Puppy. He never received the puppy. All attempts to contact the subject have failed.

Possession of a loaded Firearm/False Impersonation/Warrant Arrest: On April 1, 2018, at approximately 4:24am, an Officer stopped a silver Jeep, at San Pablo Avenue and John Muir Parkway, for not having a front license plate. The 27 year old female driver, from Oakland, was uncooperative and was unable to provide any form of identification. When she was first contacted she gave a name which turned out to be a false name. The subject kept trying to go into a fanny pack she was wearing. Officer checked the fanny pack and found a loaded handgun inside. When the female was actually identified it was determined she had an outstanding No Cite misdemeanor warrant, from Marin County. The female was placed under arrest and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Auto Burglary: On April 1, 2018 at 12:29 PM, an Officer was dispatched to 600 Alfred Nobel (Hercules Fitness) for a reported auto burglary. The reporting party stated an unknown person broke the left rear window of his vehicle and stole his girlfriend's purse. The purse contained several credit cards, one of which had already been used at the Rodeo Safeway.

Suspicious Circumstance: On April 2, 2018 at 3:29 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the to a residence in the 400 block of Sparrow Dr. for a CHP transfer of a 911 disconnect via a cell phone. Dispatch advised a male voice could be heard whispering but they could not make out what he was saying. Officers made contact with the residents of the house where the call may have originated. The residents consented to a check of the interior and exterior (backyard) of their residence. Nothing amiss was found and there were no males present. Officers also contacted the residents of the two adjacent addresses. Again, nothing was found amiss at either residence. A check of the cell phone number shows it to be associated with an out of state address. This is believed to be a "spoofed" call or a "swatting" prank attempt.

Auto Burglary: On April 2, 2018 at 7:17 AM, an officer was dispatched to 3700 San Pablo Ave. (Starbucks) for an auto burglary which just occurred. The reporting party stated an unknown person broke out the rear window of his Jeep Cherokee and stole his laptop computer and cell phone charger.

Stolen vehicle: On April 2, 2018 an employee reported his company van as stolen. The subject stated sometime between March 31st and April 1, 2018, an unknown person/s stole his 2002 Ford work van. He was delayed in reporting it as he had to get authorization from the registered owner.

Suspicious Circumstances: On April 2, 2018 at 11:00 AM, an officer was dispatched to the lobby for a possible fraud. The reporting party said on March 30, 2018 an unknown person called her and stated there was a problem with her EBT card. He said he needed her card number and PIN to correct the problem. Felony Evading/ Assault on a Peace Officer: On April 3, 2018 at 12:32am an Officer was driving E/B Refugio Valley Rd. when he saw a suspicious Black Sion TC backed into the visitor's parking area/turnout. The Officer illuminated the vehicle, with his spotlight, and saw a Hispanic male adult walk over to the driver's side and enter the vehicle. The Officer turned around and drove back down Refugio Valley Rd. to check on the vehicle. The vehicle was driving W/B Refugio Valley Rd. and the Officer followed. The vehicle drove into the Hercules Swim Center parking lot in an apparent attempt to evade the Officer. The Officer followed the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle exited the Swim Center and drove back onto W/B Refugio Valley Rd. The driver failed to stop for the red light, accelerated at a high rate of speed, and drove W/B Refugio Valley Rd. The Officer activated his emergency lights and siren in an attempt to do a traffic stop on the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle failed to yield and pursuit was then initiated, W/B Refugio Valley Rd, at speeds of approximately 75 mph. The driver failed to stop for multiple red lights. The vehicle collide with the north curb of Sycamore Ave. at Refugio Valley Rd. Another Officer stopped behind the vehicle, in preparation of a "High Risk Stop". The driver of the vehicle intentionally backed into the Officer's patrol SUV (a violation of Assault with a Deadly Weapon)

causing moderate damage to the police vehicle. The officer suffered “whiplash like” symptoms. An Officer observed a Caucasian adult female in the right front passenger seat of the vehicle. The driver drove E/B Sycamore, in the W/B lanes of traffic, and the pursuit continued. The driver again failed to stop for multiple stop signs as he drove E/B Sycamore Ave. Officers continued the vehicle pursuit until losing sight of the vehicle as it drove from E/B Sycamore Ave onto Clae’s Lane. A short time later officers located the vehicle, on Clae’s Lane over SR-4. It appeared the vehicle had collided into the cyclone fence, went down an embankment, and end in a grassy/swamp area. The vehicle was abandoned. CHP Helicopter, and a San Pablo PD K9, assisted in searching for the male driver and female passenger. The suspects were not located. Officers responded to the area and located the two subject’s. The subjects matched the description of the two suspects seen in the stolen vehicle. Both subjects were uncooperative and had to be physically restrained. Both subjects were positively identified by the original officer. The subjects were arrested for multiple Felony charges, including Assault with a Deadly Weapon; Felony Hit and Run; Resisting Arrest; Auto Theft; and Felony Evading in a Vehicle. Both suspects have refused to provide any personal information including their identities and home addresses.

Supplement to Stolen Vehicle Pursuit/and Assault on Officer: On April 3, 2018 at approximately 8:47AM an ABV& New team called Hercules Police and said they were in the area of Clae’s Lane/Sycamore. They observed a male and a female, covered in mud, hop a fence. A HPD officer responded and saw the two subjects. The officer verbally commanded both subjects to stop. Both subjects were uncooperative and had to be physically detained and handcuffed. While handcuffed, the male subject began flailing about and kicking the officer. The male also banged his head against the interior of the Police car. Both subjects refused to identify themselves, but stated they were over 18 years of age. Because the suspects were involved in a traffic collision, earlier in the morning, and the male’s physical altercation, both subjects were transported to the County Regional Medical Center for a medical evaluation. Both subjects were positively identified by the originating officer. After the suspects were medically cleared, they were transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. They were booked as John and Jan Doe, as they were still refusing to identify themselves.

The male was later identified as 25 year old Austin Welch, of Henderson, NV. The female was determined to be 16 year old, runaway, from Las Vegas, NV. She was transferred from the Martinez Jail to the Juvenile Hall.

Theft of a license plate: On April 3, 2018 at 9:51 p.m. an officer responded to the 500 block of Bristol St. to take a report for a theft of a license plate. The reporting party said an unknown suspect stole the rear license plate from her ’13 Chevy Equinox sometime between March 31, 2018 and the time of call tonight.

Auto Burglary: On April 4, 2018 at 9:35 AM, an officer was dispatched to 3500 Franklin Canyon Golf Course for a reported auto burglary. The reporting party stated an unknown person broke into

his 2013 Hyundai Santa Fe and stole a range finder and electronic golf device.

Mail Theft: On April 4, 2018 at 7:55 p.m. an officer was dispatched to the 1100 block of Taraya Terrace to take a report for theft of mail that occurred today. The reporting party said she was also a recent victim of a mail theft, on March 23, 2018, where the suspects were captured on surveillance video. The reporting party said she also had surveillance video of today's mail theft (occurred between 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. In the video, a Caucasian adult female is seen walking up to the cluster mailbox and removing mail from several mailboxes including the reporting party's. The suspect is then seen walking up to a Silver 3 series BMW (Paper Plates) that has Black wheels. The driver of the BMW is Hispanic, or Caucasian, male adult; wearing a White T-Shirt.

Disorderly Conduct – Drunk in Public: On April 4, 2018 at 9:45 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1200 block of Willow Ave. for a report of a suspicious person. The reporting party stated a Hispanic adult female was walking back and forth out into the street. The reporting party further stated the female didn't know where she was and seemed out of it. Officers located the 21 year old female, of San Francisco, standing near the entrance/exit to the Willow Glen Apartments. The female was found to be intoxicated and unable to care for herself. She was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.
